COMPLAINT

NOW, comes the Plaintiff and complains of the above named Defendant in the manner and form following:

(1). The Plaintiff, Joseph Bloom, is an individual twenty-nine (29) years of age, who maintains a permanent residence in New Millport, Clearfield County, Pennsylvania, and who is presently a Sgt. 1/c, Infantry, in the Armed Forces with a temporary address of First Airborne Battle Group, 505th Infantry, APO 185, New York, New York.

(2). The Defendant, Frances Bloom, is an individual thirty-four (34) years of age, who resides at Apartment 27A, Westwood Heights, Macon, Georgia, and is a bookkeeper.

(3). Both Plaintiff and Defendant are citizens of the United States. The Plaintiff is a citizen of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania and is domiciled in Clearfield County, Pennsylvania. The Defendant is a citizen of the State of Georgia and is domiciled in Macon, Bibb County, Georgia.

(4). The parties were married on June 3, 1959, by a Methodist minister in Macon, Georgia.

(5). There were no children born to this marriage.

(6). The Plaintiff has resided within the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania for a period in excess of one (1) year.

(7). The causes for which this action is brought are:

A. That the Defendant did willfully and maliciously desert the Plaintiff on or about July 3, 1959, which desertion has continued since that time.

B. That the Defendant has offered such indignities to the person of the Plaintiff as to render his condition intolerable and life burdensome.

(8). There has been no prior action for divorce between the parties and there is no collusion in bringing this action.

(9). WHEREFORE, the Plaintiff prays that he be granted a divorce a vinculo matrimonii from the Defendant.

WHEREFORE, your Petitioner requests that your Honorable Court grant him leave to discontinue this action conditioned upon payment of costs.




