The petitioners of the undersigned respectfully represent - That they labor under great inconveniences for want of a public road ~~leading~~ to begin at Mashamion Creek nearly opposite Monsoon Forge in Co. Planning Mill to the village of Chesters in this Co and from thence to intersect the Philipshurg and Gros Settlement Road at or near the "Sixer Farm" in Decatur tp. The petitioners therefore pray the Court to appoint three persons qualified according to Law to view the ground proposed for said road and if they should see occasion to lay out the same to inquire of and vacate that part of the two public roads now leading from the Bridge at Philipshurg to Sixer Farm and the other from the Bridge known as the Stone Quarry Bridge to Steins a point near Steins Mill which by the laying out of the road here proposed will become useless

CLEARFIELD COUNTY, SS:

At a Court of Quarter Sessions of the Peace of the County of Clearfield, held at Clearfield town, in and for said county, on the *17* day of

April A. D. 186*7* before the Judges of the said Court upon the petition of sundry inhabitants of the township of *Decatur* in the said county, setting forth that they labor under great inconvenience for the want of a road or highway to lead from *Mushannun*

Creek to intersect the Guss Settlement road near Levers farm, and to vacate two roads one from the Bridge to Philipsburg to Levers farm, and the other from the Bridge at the Stone Quarry to a point near Stenvers Mill

and therefore praying the Court to appoint proper persons to view and lay out the same according to law. **Whereupon** the Court, upon due consideration had of the premises, do order and

John S. Rodebaugh, Jacob Gmelin & Charles Cadogan

who, after being respectively sworn or affirmed to perform the duties of their appointment with impartiality and fidelity, are to view the ground proposed for said road, and if any two of them agree that there is occasion for such road, they shall proceed to lay out the same, as agreeable to the desire of the petitioners as may be, having respect for the best ground for a road, and the shortest distance, in such manner as to do the least injury to private property; and shall make report thereof, stating particularly whether they judge the same necessary for a public or private road, together with a plot or draft thereof, and the courses and distances, and reference to the improvements through which it may pass, to the next Court of Quarter Sessions to be held for the said county. In which report they shall state that they have been sworn or affirmed according to law.

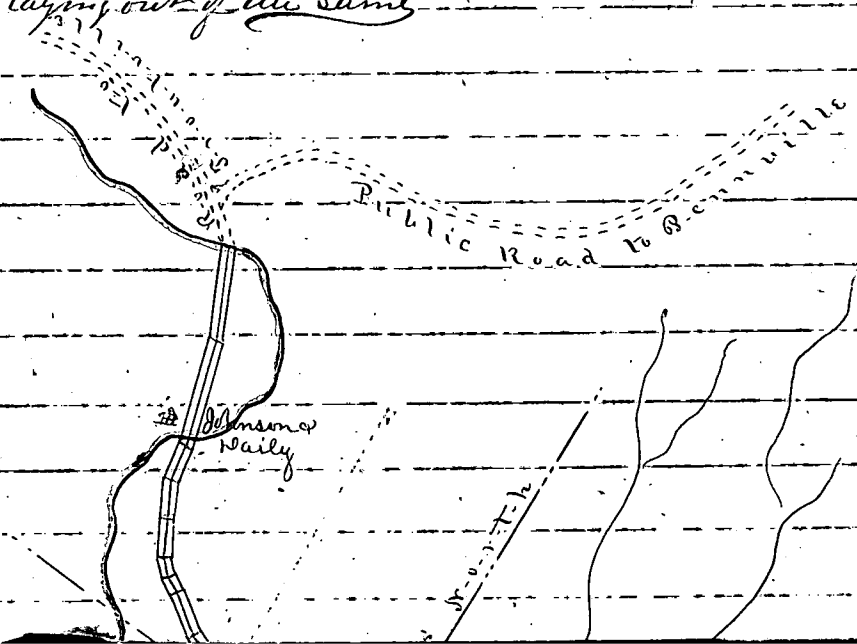

To the Honorable, the Judges within named:

We the undersigned persons appointed by the within Order of Court to view and lay out the Road therein mentioned, Respectfully report: That having been present upon the ground and having been duly sworn or affirmed in pursuance of the said Order, we have viewed, laid out and do return for public use, the following Road to wit: Beginning

at a post on the bank of Moshannon Creek opposite the foot of Maple street in Philipsburg and Running thence across the meadow lands of Munson & Hoop, South, fifty-two & a fourth degs. West, One hundred eleven and sixty-eight hundredths perches to a Beech tree in the line of the said parties and Jacob. L. Steiner & Others; thence by the line of the unimproved lands of the said Munson & Hoop North thirty-seven and three-fourths degs. West, twenty-two and seven tenths perches to a post; thence on the improved land of the same parties, and on meadow land of Chas. R. Foster North sixty degs. West, forty-four perches to the Leever hill Road:

We also extend this Road from the point of intersection with Steiner & Cos. line at the Beech tree, backward South thirty-seven and three-fourths degs. East forty-two perches; thence South seven & a half degs. West two and thirty-six hundredths perches

to a point of intersection with the Public Road
from Philipsburg to Oseola.

And further having examined the
two Roads proposed to be vacated. One from
the Bridge near the Stone Quarry at Philips-
burg to Steiner's Mill; and the other from
the Bridge near the Depot in Philipsburg
to Leavers hill, we are of the opinion that
the said two Roads to the points of intersec-
tion with the Road herein laid out are
useless, inconvenient and burdensome
and ought therefore to be vacated.
