WHEREAS, Joe Chirillo (Guiseppe Chirillo) residing at Morrisdale, Pa., in a hearing June 14th, 1912, in the petition for naturalization of Ralph Scalzo, No. 334, stated in open Court that he was born in Italy October 16th, 1880, and that he came to the United States for the first time April 1st, 1903, being at that time of the age of over 22 years;

AND WHEREAS, he exhibited in open Court a duplicate certificate of naturalization, issued to him by the Court of Common Pleas of Clearfield County on August 26th, 1904, which said certificate was fraudulent in that the said Chirillo was over 18 years of age when he came to the United States and had not at the time he took out said naturalization papers filed a declaration of intention, and further that he had not resided in the United States for the period of five years before being naturalized, as required by law.

NOW, THEREFORE, this 14th day of June, 1912, the said naturalization of Joe Chirillo as of August 26th, 1904, is hereby ordered and directed and is hereby cancelled as fraudulent, and the Prothonotary is hereby directed to mark the record of the same in the Naturalization Book cancelled and vacated for fraud perpetrated upon the Court, and the duplicate certificate in the hands of the said Joe Chirillo is hereby directed and is delivered up for an endorsement of such cancellation upon the back thereof by the Prothonotary and filed with this order.

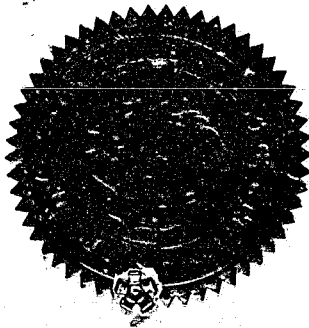

Be it Remembered, That at a COURT OF COMMON PLEAS, held at CLEARFIELD, in and for the County of Clearfield, in the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, in the United States of America, on the 26th day of September, 1905, in the year of our Lord one thousand nine hundred and fourth, John H. H. H. a native of Prussia, exhibited a Petition praying to be admitted to become a Citizen of the United States; and it appearing to the said Court that he had declared on oath, before the Prothonotary of the said Court, that it was bona fide his intention to become a citizen of the United States and to renounce forever all allegiance and fidelity to any foreign Prince, Potentate, State or Sovereignty, and particularly to the King of Prussia of which he was at that time a subject; and the said John H. H. H. having on his solemn oath declared, and also made proof thereof to the satisfaction of the Court, by the testimony of John H. H. H. citizens of the United States, that he had resided in the United States of America THREE YEARS next preceding his arriving at the age of twenty-one years, and continued to reside therein to the time of making his application; that during the two years next preceding his application it had been bona fide his intention to become a citizen of the United States; that he had resided ONE YEAR and upwards, last past, within the State of Pennsylvania, and within the United States of America FIVE YEARS and upwards, last past, including the three years of his minority; that during that time he had behaved as a man of good moral character, attached to the principles of the Constitution of the United States and well disposed to the good order and happiness of the same; that he does not disbelieve in, nor is he opposed to, all organized government; that he is not a member of, or affiliated with, any organization entertaining and teaching such disbelief or opposition; that he does not advocate, or teach, the duty, necessity or propriety of unlawfully assaulting or killing any specific individual or officers generally of the Government of the United States, or of any other organized government, because of his or their official character; and that he has not violated any of the provisions of an Act to regulate the immigration of aliens into the United States approved March 3, 1903; and having also declared on his solemn oath, before the said Court, that he would support the Constitution of the United States, and that he did absolutely and entirely renounce and abjure all allegiance and fidelity to every foreign Prince, Potentate, State or Sovereignty, and particularly to the King of Prussia of which he was before a subject; thereupon the Court admitted the said John H. H. H. to become a Citizen of the United States, and ordered all the proceedings aforesaid to be recorded by the Prothonotary of said Court; which was done accordingly.

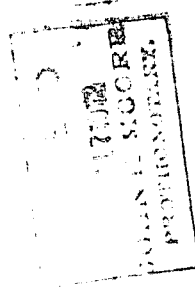

The petition of Paolo Daino, respectfully represents:

That he is the Petitioner above mentioned.

That on the 27th day of August A.D. 1904, a naturalization certificate was issued to him by your Honorable Court.

That, due to the illegible hand-writing on his application for naturalization and to the lack of knowledge, on the part of your Petitioner, to read and write, an error was made on the record with respect to the spelling of his name.

That as a result of such an error the name of your Petitioner appears on his certificate of naturalization and on the record of the naturalization proceedings as "Patolo Donino," instead of "Paolo Daino," which is the correct spelling of your Petitioner's name.

That your Petitioner herein is the same person as "Patolo Donino," who appears to have taken out his naturalization papers in your Honorable Court on the 27th day of August A.D. 1904.

Your Petitioner further states that his failure to have the record corrected has been due to a mere inadvertence and oversight on his part and not to any improper motive.

Your Petitioner therefore prays your Honorable Court to grant a rule upon the Prothonotary of the Court of Common Pleas to show cause why the record in the above proceedings should not be amended so that the record will show "Paolo Daino," instead of

E. Fred Vosburg produced and sworn.

My name is E. Fred Vosburg and I live in Du Bois, and have lived here for the past Twenty-six years. Originally I was a druggist but am now in the insurance business.

I have known John George Kassouf from the first day he came to Du Bois. John George Kassouf is in the restaurant, green grocery and confectionery business. He is married. He has lived in Du Bois for about fourteen years. When John George Kassouf came to town he could hardly speak any English. He is a Syrian. The people here called him John George when he first came. He has generally been known to have another name and I know him now as John George Kassouf. Being a foreigner and not understanding any English or much of it, he was known among the business people as John George and this name clung to him until he was commonly known by that name in the community.

I think he is about Five and one-half feet in height; he is a very stout man and probably weighs about Two Hundred and Ten Lbs. He has always been a heavy man and has always worn a smooth face and has dark eyes dark hair and has all the racial characteristics of the Syrians. He told me and I was otherwise informed that he had made application for his first citizen papers. This was at a time when he was ^{not} as well acquainted with the English language as he is now. At the time John George Kassouf first came to Du Bois there were very few Syrians in this section of the country.


E. Fred Vosburg.

J.K. Seyler produced and sworn.

My name is J.K. Seyler. I have been a resident of Du Bois Borough for Fourteen years and have lived within six miles of Du Bois Borough all my life. I am now Fifty-four years of age and one of the pioneer settlers of this section.

I have known John George Kassouf for a period of about Eight years. When I first knew him he had just came from Syria and could not speak or understand very much of the English language, and was known under the name of John George. I have been informed that the title of his real estate was taken and held in the name of John George Kassouf.

When John George Kassouf first came to this country and to this town being a foreigner was simply called John George about in the same manner as Slavs and Hungarians, irrespective of their last names, are called John. John George Kassouf is a large man weighing about Two Hundred and Twenty Lbs., smooth face, dark eyes and hair and has all the characteristics of the Syrian race. I always understood that John George Kassouf was a relative of Joseph Kassouf; Joseph Kassouf being one of the pioneer settlers in the Syrian colony of Du Bois, and I know that the name Kassouf is a very common name among the Syrians.



Charles G. Garby produced and sworn.

My name is Charles G. Garby. I am Twenty-six years of age and have lived in Du Bois for the past Sixteen years. I was born in Syria. I am engaged in the fruit business in the Borough of Du Bois.

John George Kassouf and myself lived in the same town in Syria; this town was named Zahleh. John George Kassouf was cook for Bishop Atta in the town where I went to school. I went to the school attached to the Bishop's residence and church, and at that time I knew John George Kassouf personally very well and I know he is the John George Kassouf who lives here and is making this application.

John George Kassouf who cooked for Bishop Atta in Syria and whom I then knew personally is the same person who has been known in Du Bois for sometime under the name of John George and who is here present and in the same room with me at this time making application for his second naturalization papers.

John George Kassouf is a cousin of Joseph Kassouf and of the same family name; Joseph Kassouf being a pioneer settler of the Syrian colony of Du Bois. Among the Syrians John George Kassouf was known as John George Kassouf; he changed his name in his business to John George for the reason that there was confusion both in freight express and mail which would come addressed to J. Kassouf and which would sometimes be intended for Joseph Kassouf who was then in business here, and sometimes it would come addressed to J. Kassouf and be intended for John Kassouf and be opened by Joseph Kassouf. I know that John George Kassouf came to Du Bois in 1893 and has lived and done

business in Du Bois ever since.

Charles L. Emsby

John George Kassouf produced and sworn.

My name is John George Kassouf and I was born in Syria, Turkey on the 15th. day of April, 1875. I came to the United States landing at New York on the 25th. day of October, 1893 and came directly from New York to Du Bois where I have done business and lived continuously ever since.

I am a married man and have five children and live in the Borough of Du Bois with my family. I am engaged in the fruit, confectionery and restaurant business and am also manufacturer of ice cream. When I first came to Du Bois my cousin Joseph Kassouf was already here and in the clothing business and supplied Syrian peddlers with merchandise. I was born about Thirty miles from Zahleh in Syria, and at the age of about ten years I was practically adopted by Bishop Atta, and lived with him. While with Bishop Atta I studied cooking in the school and then became cook for the Bishop and other persons who lived with him, and I remained with the Bishop up to the time I left Syria and came to Du Bois where I was known among the Syrians as John George Kassouf, but on account of having my mail, freight and express confused and mixed up with that of my cousin Joseph Kassouf, both first names beginning with "J". I began using in business the name of John George and not being very well acquainted with the manners and language of the country, I made application for my first citizen papers. The clerk of Clearfield County Court when I made my application for the first citizen papers on the first day of August, 1903, knowing my business name made out these papers in the name of John G. George. I never knew that the name John G. George in my first papers made any difference until I made application

for my second naturalization papers under my proper name.

I am the same person known as John G. George who made application on the first day of August, 1903, in the Court of Common Pleas of Clearfield County for my first citizen papers, and I am also the same person who has done business in Du Bois for the past twelve years under the name of John George.

The title to my real estate is taken and held in the name of John George Kassouf as shown by a deed from

to me dated the day of
and recorded in the office for the recording of deeds in Clearfield County in Deed Book , Vol. . It is upon this real estate held in my proper name John George Kassouf, that I have built my place of business and in which I have carried on business for the past twelve years in the name of John George.

I knew Charles G. Garby when he was a small boy nine or ten years of age, going to school near Bishop Atta's residence, where I was cooking. He now resides in Du Bois, and is engaged in business here.

I also know J.K. Seyler and E. Fred Vosburg very well for many years past.

I am the same John George Kassouf whose application for second citizen papers is now pending in the court of Common Pleas of Clearfield County and on account of which this testimony is being taken.
