PETITION FOR APPEAL FROM ORDERS OF DEPARTMENT
OF TRANSPORTATION SUSPENDING DRIVER'S LICENSE

TO THE HONORABLE JUDGES OF THE COURT OF COMMON PLEAS OF
CLEARFIELD COUNTY:

The Petition of John Edward Sinfelt, respectfully
represents as follows:

1. That your Petitioner, John Edward Sinfelt, currently
resides at 12½ East Weber Avenue, DuBois, Clearfield County,
Pennsylvania. Petitioner is additionally a full-time student at
Indiana University of Pennsylvania in Indiana, Pennsylvania.

2. That your Petitioner's Drivers License Number is
24761636 and his date of birth is January 31, 1979.

3. That by four (4) separate Notices dated March 15,
2000, your Petitioner received notification that his driving
privileges were to be suspended on April 19, 2000 pursuant to the
provisions of Sections 1532(D) and 1532(B) of the Vehicle Code.
Said suspensions are to continue for varying times with the final
suspension to take effect for a period of six (6) months commencing

on January 18, 2002. Attached hereto and incorporated herein by reference are complete copies of said notifications.

4. That your Petitioner would assert that he is in need of his drivers license for purpose of schooling and/or employment and that any loss of his license would place him in a position that his schooling and/or employment would suffer.

5. That the suspension of the Petitioner's driving privileges at this point in time, for any period, would deprive the Petitioner of his ability to travel which is necessary in order to maintain his schooling/employment as well as to carry out his day to day activities.

6. That the instant Notices all relate to a conviction of the Petitioner following jury trial held before the Honorable John K. Reilly, Jr., President Judge, of the Court of Common Pleas of Clearfield County. Said convictions and the sentences imposed as a result thereof are currently the subject of an appeal to the Superior Court of Pennsylvania. As one of the issues of said appeal there is an assertion that the prosecution occurred outside of those time provisions allowed by the Pennsylvania Rules of Criminal Procedure, Rule 1100 in that the Criminal Complaint was first filed on December 22, 1997 and the first trial of the Petitioner occurred on August 30, 1999. An appropriate Motion to Dismiss pursuant to the provisions of Pennsylvania Rule of Criminal Procedure, Rule 1100 was presented by


Pre-trial Motion. Should said appeal be successful the sentences leading to the notification by the Department of Transportation would be vacated and no such suspensions could be allowed.

7. That the suspension of the Petitioner's driving privileges while on appeal to the Superior Court of Pennsylvania would be improper until such point in time as the Superior Court of Pennsylvania reaches a determination of those issues raised on the criminal appeal.

8. That the Petitioner would assert that the taking of his license by the Department of Transportation violates the Petitioner's due process rights and right to pursue his schooling and/or employment.

WHEREFORE, it is respectfully requested that your Honorable Court sustain the License Suspension Appeal filed by the Petitioner and issue a Supersedeas Order suspending the effect of the Suspension Notices that have been received.



Dear MR. SINFELT:

As a result of your violation on 11/26/1997 of violating Section 6308 (offenses related to alcohol), your driving privilege is being SUSPENDED for a period of 90 DAY(S) as mandated by section 1532D of the vehicle code.

In order to comply with this sanction you are required to return any current driver's license, learner's permit and/or temporary driver's license (camera card) in your possession no later than the effective date listed. If you cannot comply with the requirements stated above, you are required to submit a DL16LC Form or a sworn affidavit stating that you are aware of the sanction against your driving privilege.
