portion thereof, beginning at the forks of the road, about
sixty rods North East of the "Old Wilson schoolhouse", and
extending therefrom to the cross roads at or near the
saw mill, being a distance of about one mile more or less,
your petitioners conceive, is now become useless, incon-
venient and burthensome to the inhabitants of said town-
ship, and your petitioners therefore pray the Court, that
the same may be vacated, agreeably to the Act of the Gen-
