**PETITION FOR REVIEW AND MOTION FOR WRIT OF SUPERSEDEAS**


AND NOW, comes Petitioner, Thomas Bradley, by and through Ronald L. Collins, Esquire, who moves your Honorable Court as follows:

1. That Petitioner is Thomas Bradley of 411 Treasure Lake, DuBois, Pennsylvania, who has an operator's license number is 14823085.
2. That Respondent is the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, Department of Transportation.
3. That by Notice dated September 27, 2001, Respondent did notify Petitioner that his operating privileges were being suspended pursuant to 75 Pa. C.S.A. §1519 (c) on the basis that Respondent had received medical information indicating that Petitioner may have a seizure disorder condition with the seizure allegedly occurring on September 5, 2001. A copy of said Notice is hereinafter attached as Exhibit "A".
4. That Petitioner does not suffer from a seizure disorder nor did he suffer a seizure on September 5, 2001. In support whereof, attached hereinafter as Exhibit "B" is a copy of a letter from James E. Devlin, M.D. indicating that following the incident occurring on September 5, 2001,

Petitioner did undergo a CT examination as well as an MRI and EEG, all of which were unremarkable. In addition, also attached hereinafter as Exhibit "C" is a copy of the Compulsive Disorder Reporting Form submitted by Dr. Devling to Respondent indicating that Petitioner has not been diagnosed as having a seizure disorder.

WHEREFORE, Petitioner respectfully moves your Honorable Court to review the actions of Respondent in suspending his operating privileges and also grant unto him a supersedeas of the same pending resolution on the matter.

Dear Mr. THOMAS BRADLEY:



We have received medical information indicating that you have a Seizure Disorder condition which prevents you from safely operating a motor vehicle.

As of 11/01/2001, you may no longer drive. Your driving privilege is hereby recalled indefinitely as mandated by Section 1519(c) of the Vehicle Code.

This decision has been made by comparing your medical condition with the standards recommended by our Medical Advisory Board and adopted by this Department. This action will remain in effect until we receive medical information that your condition has improved and you are able to safely operate a motor vehicle.

Since you have a seizure disorder, you must remain seizure free for a six month period, with or without medication, before you will be eligible for reinstatement of your driving privilege. Our records indicate that your seizure occurred on 9/5/01.

In order to comply with this action, you must return all current Pennsylvania driver's licenses, learner's permits, temporary driver's licenses (camera cards) in your possession, on or before the effective date listed above. If you cannot comply with the requirements stated above, a sworn affidavit stating that you are aware of the sanction against your driving privilege must be submitted. When the Department receives your license or affidavit, we will send you a receipt.

**YOU MAY NOT RETAIN YOUR DRIVER'S LICENSE FOR IDENTIFICATION PURPOSES.** However, you may apply for and obtain a photo identification card at any Driver License Center. You must present two (2) forms of proper identification (e.g., birth certificate, valid U.S. passport, marriage certificate, etc.) in order to obtain your photo identification card.

You have the right to appeal to the Court of Common Pleas (Civil Division) within thirty (30) days of the mail date of this notice. If you file an appeal in the County Court, the Court will give you a time-stamped certified copy of the appeal. In order for your appeal to be valid, you must send this time-stamped certified copy of the appeal by certified mail to:

You still must send in your license before the effective date of recall unless you appear in person before a judge and receive an order permitting you to continue driving.

To Whom It May Concern:

This is in reference to Dr. Thomas Bradley. Dr. Bradley apparently had a syncopal spell in his office on September 4. He was transferred to DRMC ER for further evaluation and treatment. Initially it was felt by the ER physician he possibly could have had a seizure. CT of the head was obtained which was unremarkable. Dr. Gatti was called in for consultation. After further review, it was not clear at that time if it was a seizure and did not feel it was appropriate to start Dr. Bradley on any medications. Patient has no previous history of any seizure activities. Patient was discharged and followed up as an out patient with Dr. McLaughlin, a neurologist in Franklin. He did undergo an MRI of the head which was unremarkable. Also an EEG was obtained to evaluate further possibility of seizure activity. This also was unremarkable.

As of October 10, Dr. Bradley has been doing well, he has not had any recurrence of any episodes. Recently it had been brought to my attention by Dr. Bradley that apparently his license has been revoked pending further evaluation. At this time, I am requesting if it is possible, to have Dr. Bradley's license reinstated. As noted above, his work up has been unremarkable, he has not had any previous history of any seizure activity, and has not had any recurrence of any episodes. Because of his present occupation, it is extremely important that Dr. Bradley be able to drive.







I saw Dr. Bradley in the Emergency Room at DRMC for the assessment of syncope on September 4<sup>th</sup> 2001. Since then he had an extensive work up which is negative. In my opinion his driving privileges should not be revoked because this isolated incidence. About 2 months have passed and he has not had any further problems. As you know, the chances of re-occurrence of syncope are greater during the first 30 to 60 days from the date of the incident and they steadily decline. The driving restrictions would place an unusual burden on his ability to work.


