who, after being respectively sworn or affirmed to perform the duties of their appointment with impartiality and fidelity, are to view the ground proposed for said road; and if any two of them agree that there is occasion for such road, they shall proceed to lay out the same, as agreeably to the desire of the petitioners as may be, having respect for the best ground for a road, and the shortest distance, in such manner as to do the least injury to private property; and shall make report thereof, stating particularly whether they judge the same necessary for a public or private road, together with a plot or draft thereof, and the courses and distances, and reference to the improvements through which it may pass, to the next Court of Quarter Sessions to be held for said county. In which report they shall state that they have been sworn or affirmed according to law.

after giving due and public notice according to
having been duly sworn and affirmed all the
viewers appointed by said order having viewed
the ground proposed for said Road w^t the undersigned
viewers do agree there is occasion for a Road as desired by
the petitioners and that the same is necessary for a
public road and having had respect to the shortest
distance and best ground for such Road we have
laid it out in such a manner as to do the least
injury to private property and as far as practicable
agreeably to the desire of the petitioners and do return
for public use the following described Road commencing
at a post set on the Road Near the Bridge across Beaver Run
Thence through the arable land of Horace Patchin upon
a level plain North nineteen Degrees West eight perches
Thence North eight and a half Degrees West twelve perches
Thence North Seventeen Degrees East fourteen perches
Thence North twenty four and a half East forty eight perches
Thence North twenty three Degrees West twenty perches
Thence North Sixty seven and a half Degrees West twenty five
perches Thence North ten Degrees West thirty six perches ^{claiming of H Patchin}
Thence North eight Degrees West twenty three perches arable
Thence North twenty four Degrees West along the line of H Patchin
and A Patchin arable land thirty seven perches to the public
Road Thence along said line the same corner arable land
forty eight perches Thence through the arable land
of H Patchin South thirty five Degrees West Seventeen
perches to a Hemlock on the Bank of the Susquehanna River
