We the persons appointed by annexed order of
Court to view and layout the Road therein
mentioned do report That in pursuance thereof
after giving due and public notice according to
having been duly sworn and affirmed all the
viewers appointed by said order having viewed
the ground proposed for said Road we the undersigned
viewers do agree there is occasion for a Road as desired by
the petitioners and that the same is necessary for a
public road and having had respect to the shortest
distance and best ground for such Road we have
laid it out in such manner as to do the least
injury to private property and as far as practicable
agreeably to the desire of the petitioners and do return
for public use the following described Road commencing
at a point on the Road near the Bridge across Beaver Run
Thence through the arable land of Horace Patchin upon
a level plain North nineteen Degrees west eight perches
Thence North eight and a half Degrees west twelve perches
Thence North seventeen Degrees East fourteen perches
Thence North twenty four and a half East forty eight perches
Thence North twenty three Degrees west twenty perches
Thence North sixty seven and a half Degrees west twenty five
perches Thence North ten Degrees west thirty six perches ^{clearing of H. Patchin}
Thence North eighteen Degrees west twenty three perches arable
Thence North twenty four Degrees west along the line of H. Patchin
and A. Patchin arable land thirty seven perches to the public
Road Thence along said line the dam course arable land
eighty eight perches Thence through the arable land
of H. Patchin South thirty five Degrees west seventeen
perches to a Hemlock on the Bank of the Susquehanna River
entire length three hundred and twenty eight perches a plot or
draft whereof is hereunto annexed which said do as aforesaid
laid out we are of the opinion is necessary for a public Road and
