At a Court of Quarter Sessions
of the Peace of the County of Clearfield, held at Clearfield
in and for said County, on the ~~27th~~^{24th} of ~~Sept~~^{May} 1869,
Before the said Judges of the Court, upon the Petition
of Bernard M. Govern of Girard Township setting
forth that he laboured under great inconvenience
for the want of a ~~Private~~ road ~~leading from~~
Bernard M. Govern's House to a point on the
Public Road near the residence of Augustus
Mignot"

And therefore praying the Court to appoint
proper persons to view and lay out the same ac-
cording to law. Whereupon the Court, upon due
Consideration had of the premises, do order and
appoint James Mitchell, M. Cowder and
M. Woolridge - who after being duly sworn to perform
the duties of their appointment with impartiality,
~~judging, are to view the ground proposed~~
for said road, and if any two of them shall
agree that there is occasion for said road, they
shall proceed to lay out the same as agreeably
to the desire of the Petitioner as may be, having
respect for the best for best ground for a road
and the shortest distance, in such manner to do
the least injury to private property and shall
make report thereof, stating particularly whether they
judge the same necessary for a private Road,
together with a plot or draft thereof, and the course
and distances, and reference to the improvements
through which it may pass, to the next Court of Quar-
ter sessions to be held for said County -

In which report they shall state that
they have been sworn or affirmed
according to law

June 10th 1870 Augustus Mignot files reception to this Report as follows:

1. Said Augustus Mignot though whose land the road is laid out had no notice of said and no legal notice was given but the same done secretly without his knowledge although he was the owner and occupant of ~~reputed~~ land through which said road is laid out contrary to Rule No 147 of Court.
2. The said road is improperly laid out and so as to do wrong and injury to said Augustus Mignot without any sufficient compensation damages.
3. It does not show that all the viewers were present, and the report is signed by only two of the viewers.

Clearfield. We the persons appointed by the within
Order of Court to view and layout the road therein
mentioned do report, That after giving due public
notice of the time and place of meeting, We met

and after being duly sworn according to Law we
proceeded to view and layout and do now return for
private use the following road to wit. Beginning at
a point on the public road near Augustus Mignot
thence through land of Augustus Mignot S. 3 W 8 1/4 Per to
stake corner of Benjamin Jury & Rouslow & Bosingner thence
S. 2 1/2 W on line between Benjamin Jury & Rouslow & Bosingner
118.6 Per to corner of Bernard M^cGovern's Farm. And We
also further report That we have assessed the damages to owners
of property caused by the making of the above road as follows
viz To Augustus Mignot three and 5/10 dollars and to Rouslow & Co two and
5/10 dollars
