CLEARFIELD COUNTY SS:

At a Court of Quarter Sessions of the Peace of the County of Clearfield, held at Clearfield in and for said county, on the 16th day of January, A. D. 1869, before the Judges of the said Court, upon the petition of Thos. Riley and Jerry Butler of the township of Lawrence, in the said county, setting forth that they labor under great inconvenience for the want of a road or highway leading from the line of their Coal Mine ^{lot} through the Lands of James B. Alexander, George P. Tate and Robert Mitchell to the public Road leading to Clearfield known as the Clearfield Bridge Road

Report as to Damages &c

And therefore praying the Court to appoint proper persons to view and lay out the same according to law. Whereupon, the Court, upon due consideration had of the premises, do order and appoint

James Mitchell, William Brown and Wm A. Read

who, after being respectively sworn or affirmed to perform the duties of their appointment with impartiality and fidelity, are to view the ground proposed for said road; and if any two of them agree that there is occasion for such road, they shall proceed to lay out the same, as agreeably to the desire of the petitioners as may be, having respect for the best ground for a road, and the shortest distance, in such manner as to do the least injury to private property; and shall make report thereof, stating particularly whether they judge the same necessary for a public or private road, together with a plot or draft thereof, and the courses and distances, and reference to the improvements through which it may pass, to the next Court of Quarter Sessions to be held for said county. In which report they shall state that they have been sworn or affirmed according to law.

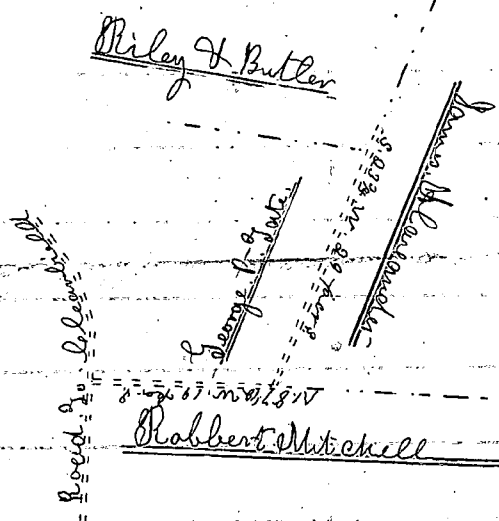

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To the Honorable the Judges of the Court of Quarter Sessions of the Peace in and for the County of Lancashire We the persons appointed by the within order of Court to view and lay out the road therein mentioned do report That after giving due public notice of the time and place of meeting we met agreeably thereto on the 6th day of March A.D. 1869 and being duly sworn according to Law we proceeded to view & layout and do now return for private use the following road to wit. Beginning at a point N $23\frac{3}{4}$ E. $1\frac{3}{10}$ and from S. E. corner of Riley & Butlers Coal lot thence S. $23\frac{3}{4}$ W. 29 per^{cent} on line between James Alexander & George P. Tate thence on line between Robert Mitchell & George P. Tate N $8\frac{1}{2}$ W. 19 per^{cent} to Public Road to Lancasterfield. The above described laid out road is intended to occupy the same but no more ground than Samuel Sordens Private road from his coal Bank, and we also further report that in our opinion Samuel Sorden will not be damaged say by the same
