 Smith in Bell Township

We the undersigned Viewers, appointed by the foregoing Order of Court, to view the Road therein described Do Report, that we, all met, after having given Notice of ten days, and also having given Notice to the owners & occupants of Land, through which said road was intended to pass, of the time & place of said View; and we having Enquired as to Damages resulting by reason of the passing of said road, Have ascertained that no Damage results to any one. And having been duly Affirmed according to Law, We have viewed, laid out, & do set out for Public use, the following Road viz, —
By a New, or road leading up Curry Run, Thence &c.

ROAD VIEWER'S REPORT.

CLEARFIELD COUNTY, SS:

At a Court of Quarter Sessions of the Peace of the County of Clearfield, held at Clearfield, in and for said county, on the 27 day of September, A. D., 1868, before the Judges of the said Court, upon the petition of sundry inhabitants of the townships of Penn & Bell, in the said county, setting forth that they labor under great inconvenience from the want of a road or highway, leading from

*Johnston's factory in
Penn township to Lewisville in Bell
township*

And therefore praying the Court to appoint proper persons to view and lay out the same, according to law. Whereupon, the Court, upon due consideration had of the premises, do order and appoint *Wm. H. Moore, William Smith & Sam. Kaufman* who, after being respectively sworn or affirmed to perform the duties of their appointment with impartiality and fidelity, are to view the ground proposed for said road; and if any two of them agree that there is occasion for such road they shall proceed to lay out the same, as aforesaid, and the desire of the petitioners as may be, having respect for the best ground for a road, and the

shortest distance, in such manner as to do the least injury to private property; and shall make report thereof, stating particularly whether they judge the same necessary for a public or private road, together with a plot or draft thereof, and the courses and distances, with reference to the improvements through which it may pass, to the next Court of Quarter Sessions to be held for said county. In which report they shall state that they have been sworn or affirmed according to law.

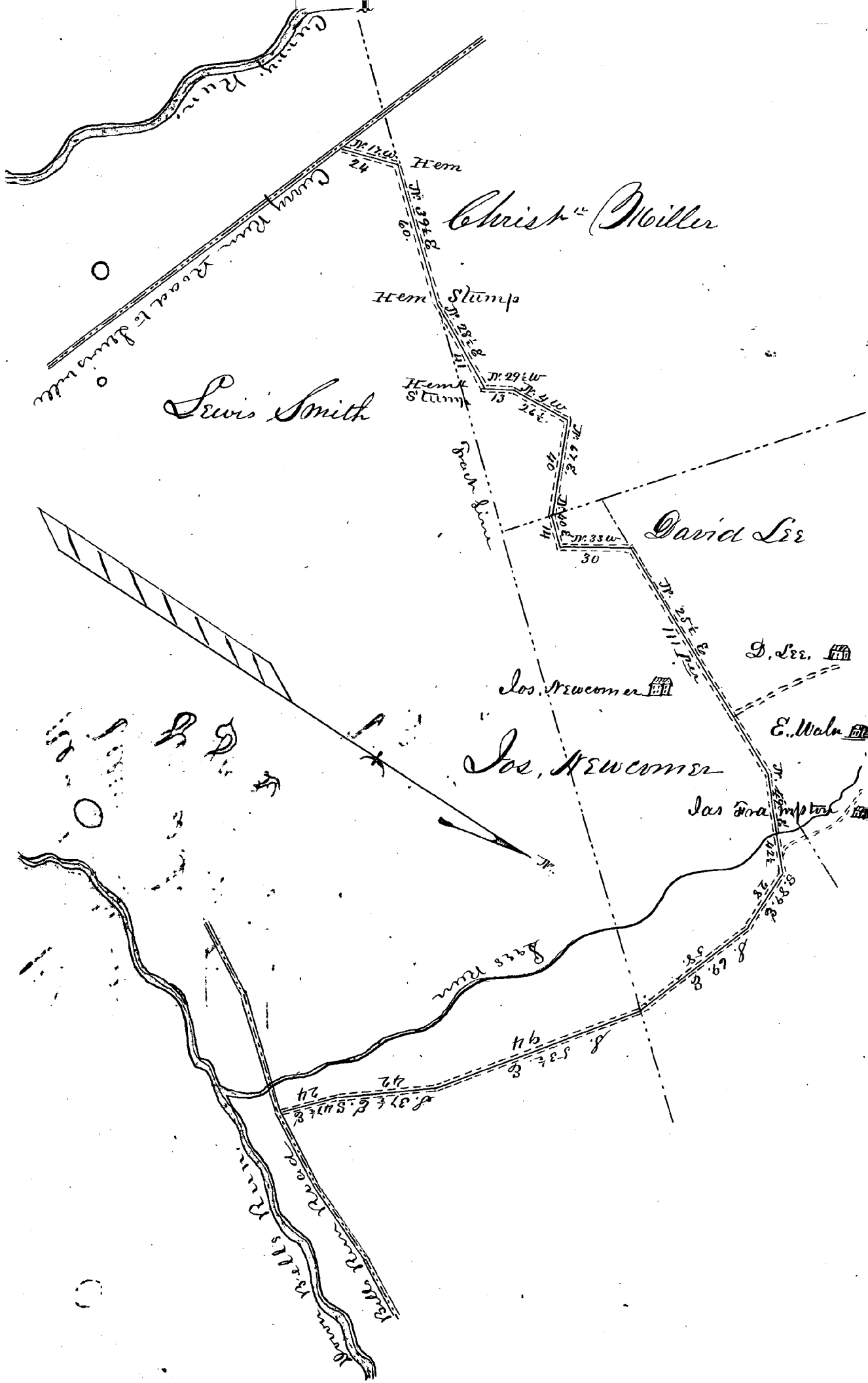
