ROAD VIEWERS.

CLEARFIELD COUNTY SS:

At a Court of Quarter Sessions of the Peace of the County of Clearfield, held at Clearfield, in and for said county, on the 24 day of June, A. D. 1869, before the Judges of the said Court, upon the petition of sundry inhabitants of the township of Bradford, in the said county, setting forth that they labor under great inconvenience for the want of a road or highway leading from

the public Road
at the residence of David Forcee to intersect
the Bald Hill Fording Road at the north East
corner of the old Forcee Farm
And also

to "vacate" part of the public Road leading
from Philipsburg to Ball Hills

Report as to Damages

And therefore praying the Court to appoint proper persons to view and lay out the same according to law. Whereupon, the Court, upon due consideration had of the premises, ^{and vacate} do order and appoint

James Mitchell S. P. Wilson & Edward Williams
who, after being respectively sworn or affirmed to perform the duties of their appointment with impartiality and fidelity, are to view the ground proposed for said road; and if any two of them agree that there is occasion for such road, they shall proceed to lay out the same, as agreeably to the desire of the petitioners as may be, having respect for the best ground for a road, and the shortest distance, in such manner as to do the least injury to private property; ^{the latter in their opinion it is necessary} and shall vacate ^{and shall vacate} and shall make report thereof, stating particularly whether they judge the same necessary for a public or private road, together with a plot or draft thereof, and the courses and distances, and reference to the improvements through which it may pass, to the next Court of Quarter Sessions to be held for said county. In which report they shall state that they have been sworn or affirmed according to law.

And that the said John H. Jewers do hereby certify that the said road is a public road and is to be a gate part of the public road leading from Philipstown to Ball Hill in Broadford Township

To the Honorable The Judges of the Court of Quarter Sessions of the Peace in and for the County of Clearfield We the Subscribers do report That in pursuance of the within order of Court after giving due public notice of the time and place of meeting, We met agreeably thereto on the 16th day of September A.D 1869 and after being duly sworn according to law we viewed the place where the road within mentioned is requested and are of the opinion that there is no occasion to lay out the same at present. Not because we ~~think~~ believe there is no occasion for a road, but because of there being a road already nearly half way from one point in the order to the other which road should in part be vacated at the time of laying out the road in the within order requested and that we have no order to vacate the same. And we further report that we did not vacate the road in the within order mentioned on account of not laying out the road in the within order mentioned to supply the same.
