acres West thirty-eight perches to the line of Jacob Hummel, Sr., and Henry Hartzel, Sr. thence on their line North two and a-half degrees East sixteen and five tenth perches to the public road, near Hartzell's Saw Mill, A draft whereof is herewith annexed, which draft states the courses and distances, and notices briefly the improvements through which the road laid out passes. The undersigned further report that taking into consideration the advantages to be derived from the making of said road over the lands of Jacob Hummel, Jr., Jacob Hummel, Sr., and Henry Hartzel, Sr., do assess and report the damages as follows: Jacob Hummel, Jr., is entitled to ten dollars damage, Jacob Hummel Sr. will sustain no damage and Henry Hartzel will sustain no damage.

D. 1869, and asking for a review of the same, which prayer was granted, and George B. Kins, Joseph Syler, and Frederick Zeigler, were appointed by the Court to make said review. The report of said reviewers was filed in this Court, on the 26th day of October A. D. 1869. Which was excepted to by Wallace and Fielding attorneys for exceptions for reasons thereon stated. And now that a petition will be presented (or has been presented) to your Honors, praying that a re-review may be granted on said review, and as we believe to change the location from that, fixed in the review will be injurious, inconvenient and burdensome, to your petitioners, and whereas if said review is changed, James Keller, a citizen of said township will be left without any road leading to or from his premises. 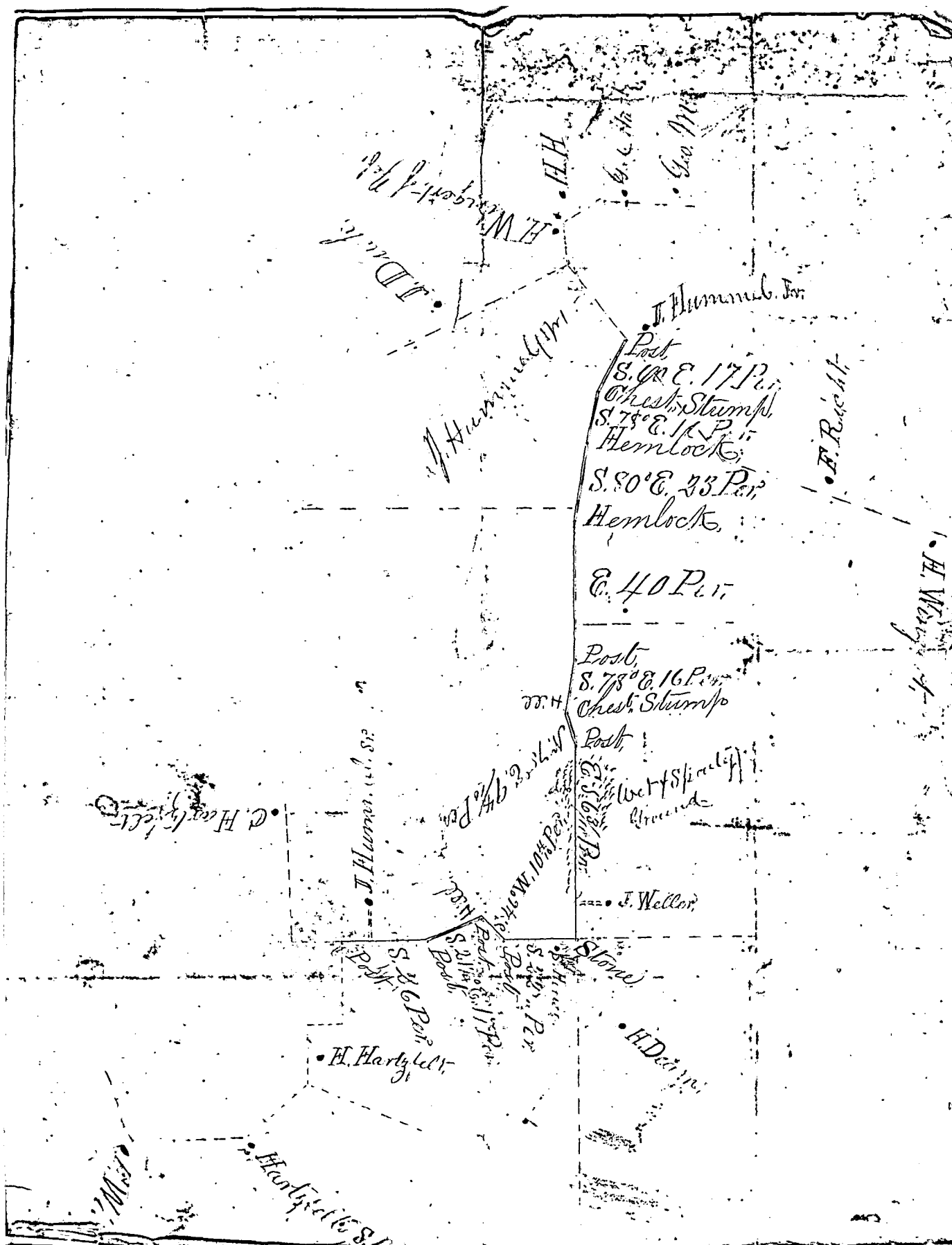

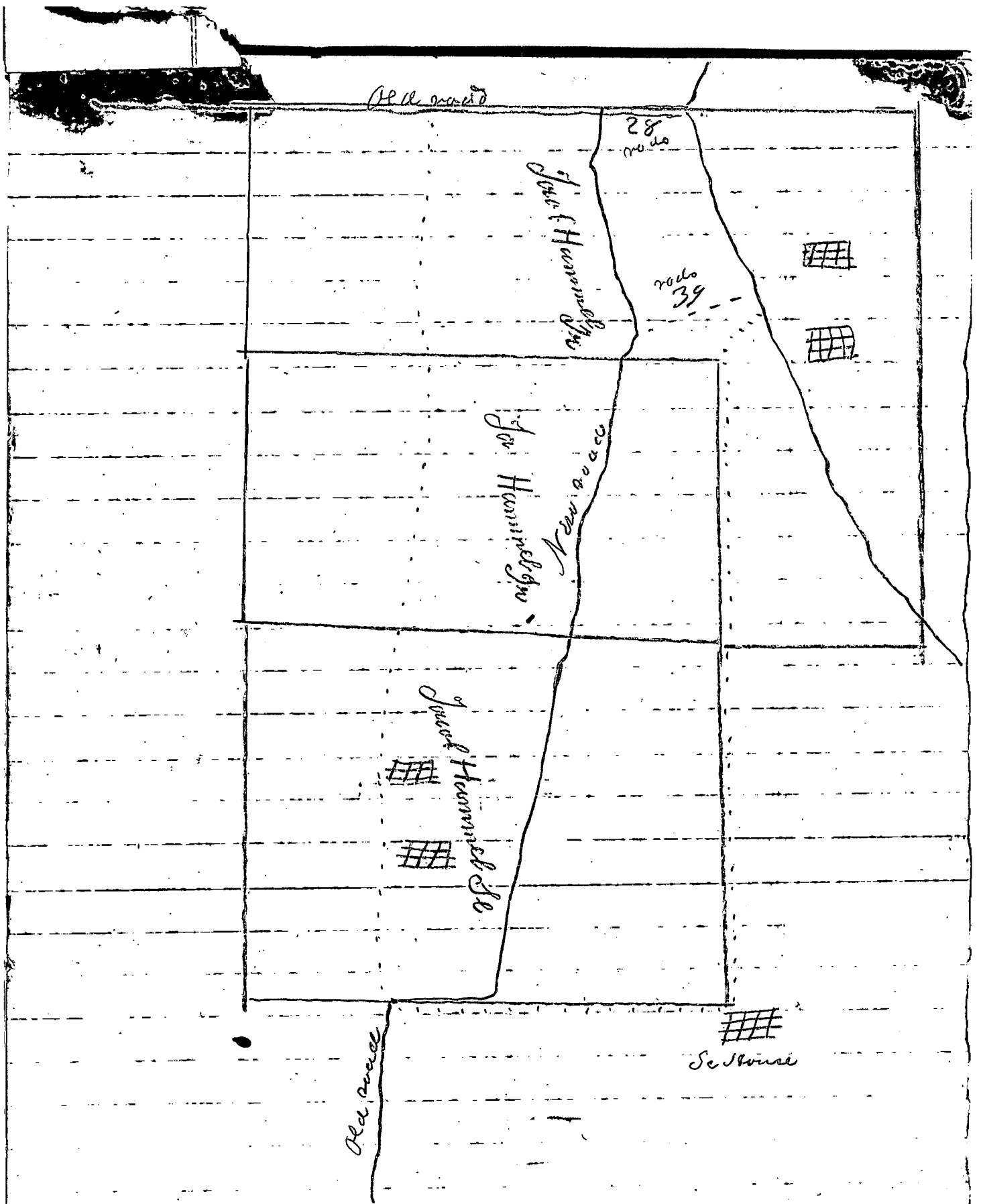
