
PETITION TO DISCONTINUE





C O M P L A I N T

TO THE HONORABLE JOHN J. PENTZ, PRESIDENT JUDGE OF SAID COURT:

MARY JANE WOODEL files this Complaint in action of divorce against NEAL WOODEL and for her cause of action states:

1. That Mary Jane Woodel is the Plaintiff and Neal Woodel is the Defendant. Neither is a minor nor an incompetent.

2. The Plaintiff and Defendant were married in Clearfield, Clearfield County, Pennsylvania, on May 8, 1948, by Reverand Owens, a Baptist Minister. There were fivee children born to this marriage:

Wanda Woodel, born September 25, 1948,
Charmaine-Charlotte Woodel, born April 8, 1950 (twins)
Karen Woodel, born July 8, 1951,
Kandy Lou Woodel, born December 31, 1952.

The above-mentioned children are all residing with the Defendant at 922 South Fourth Street, Clearfield, Clearfield County, Pennsylvania.

3. At the time of their marriage, the Plaintiff was a resident and citizen of the Village of Hyde, Lawrence Township, Clearfield County, Pennsylvania, and the Defendant was a resident and citizen of the Borough of Clearfield, Clearfield County, Pennsylvania.

4. The Present address of the Plaintiff is the Borough of Clearfield, Clearfield County, Pennsylvania, and the

present address of the Defendant is 922 South Fourth Street, Clearfield, Clearfield County, Pennsylvania.

5. The Plaintiff has resided in the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania for over a period of twenty-seven (27) years.

6. The Plaintiff avers that beginning on or about 1953 and continuing up until the present time, the Defendant did offer such indignities to the person of the Plaintiff, the injured and innocent spouse, as to render her condition intolerable and life burdensome.

7. The Plaintiff avers that beginning on or about 1953, and continuing up until the present time, the Defendant did, by cruel and barbarous treatment, endanger the life of the injured and innocent spouse, the Plaintiff herein.

8. That there is no agreement or collusion between the Plaintiff and Defendant as to the bringing of this Divorce Action.

9. That neither of the parties to this Divorce Action have ever commenced or initiated a prior action for divorce.

WHEREFORE, the Plaintiff prays that she be freed and separated from the bonds of matrimony heretofore contracted between the said Plaintiff and Defendant and be granted a decree of divorce a "vinculo matrimonii" dissolving the bonds of the said marriage.
