

MASTER'S REPORT

TO THE HONORABLE JOHN J. PENTZ, PRESIDENT JUDGE:

The undersigned Master, appointed by the Court to take the testimony and report the same with form of Decree, respectfully reports as follows:

, S C H E D U L E

1. The Complaint in Divorce: Presented and filed on May 17, 1961.
2. Service of the Complaint: Service of the Complaint was made upon the Defendant by registered mail, return receipt, addressee only, at his place of residence at 1920 Niagara Street, Apartment 2-B, Buffalo, New York on June 5, 1961.
3. Appointment of Master: William U. Smith was appointed Master on July 28, 1961.
4. Date and Place Fixed for Hearing: Hearing in this cause was held on August 25, 1961, at 10 A.M., E.D.S.T., at the office of the Master, 101 North Second Street, Clearfield, Pennsylvania. The Defendant did not appear in person, nor was he represented by counsel.
5. Notice of Master's Hearing: Notice of Master's Hearing was served on counsel for the Plaintiff, and was served on the Defendant by registered mail, return receipt, addressee only, at his place of residence at 1920 Niagara Street, Apartment 2-B, Buffalo, New York, on August 3, 1961.

6. Master's Hearing: Held August 25, 1961, at 10 A.M., E.D.S.T., at the office of the Master at 101 North Second Street, Clearfield, Pennsylvania. Plaintiff appeared in person, together with a witness, Sarah Hummel, and her attorney, M.L. Silberblatt. The Defendant did not appear and was not represented by counsel.

CAUSE OF DIVORCE

Desertion.

FINDINGS OF FACT

1. Marriage: The Plaintiff and Defendant were married on November 15, 1958, by Rev. E. Roy Hauser in Clearfield, Penna.

2. Residence and Citizenship: The Plaintiff and Defendant are citizens of the United States, and at the time of the hearing the Plaintiff resided at the Rear of 13 Mt. Joy Road, Clearfield, Pennsylvania. The Defendant resides at 1920 Niagara Street, Apartment 2-B, Buffalo, New York.

During the parties entire married life they lived together in Clearfield County.

3. Ages and Occupations: The Plaintiff is 24 or 23 years old and is employed by the Bethlehem Steel Company in Buffalo, New York. The Defendant is 21 years old and is a housewife.

4. Children: One child was born of this marriage: Pamela Luzier, who was born October 4, 1958.

5. Armed Forces: The Defendant is not a member of any branch of the Armed Forces of the United States of America.

6. Findings of the Merits: The grounds for divorce in the Complaint were desertion:

(a). On or about November 30, 1958, the Defendant did willfully and maliciously, and without cause, absent himself from habitation with the Plaintiff.

(b). Defendant has persisted in this willful and malicious absence from the common habitation of the parties for a period exceeding two years.

(c). The Defendant during this period of time has made no effort to provide a home for the Plaintiff or rejoin the Plaintiff in a common habitation.

(d). The Plaintiff gave the Defendant no reason to act in this fashion.

(e). The divorce proceedings were not the result of collusion between the Plaintiff and Defendant.

DISCUSSION

The grounds for divorce alleged are desertion. The Defendant did not appear by counsel or witness at the hearing. The Plaintiff appeared together with a witness. On the basis of the testimony, none of which the Master has any reason to doubt, it appears that within fifteen days of this marriage that the Defendant, without any cause whatsoever, left his wife who was then a minor. Since that time he has made no effort whatsoever to provide a home for his wife and child or a place for common habitation. During this period he has not provided for her support or otherwise observed any of the common attributes of marriage.

The Plaintiff at all times has made an effort to keep this marriage together; but, because of Defendant's total indifference to the same, these efforts were unsuccessful.

It, therefore, appears that the Plaintiff has shown that the Defendant has willfully, maliciously and without any cause whatsoever, deserted her for a period exceeding two years. This

constitutes grounds for divorce in Pennsylvania - Clark vs. Clark, 172 Pa. Superior 5, (1953); Carr vs. Carr, 160 Pa. Superior 124, (1947).

The Master further finds that the Defendant has and does continue in this course of conduct to a wife who has given him no reason to act in this fashion.

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

1. The Court has jurisdiction of the subject matter and the parties.

2. Defendant did willfully and maliciously desert and absent himself from the Plaintiff, an innocent and injured spouse, without reasonable cause, from November 30, 1958 and continued to absent himself to date - all of which is contrary to Section 10 (1)(d) of the Act of May 2, 1929, P.L. 1237, 23 Purdon's, Section 10 (1)(d).


3. The proceedings conform to the rules of Court and requirements of law.

4. This divorce proceeding was not the result of collusion between the Plaintiff and Defendant.

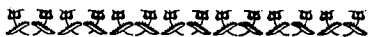
RECOMMENDATION





TESTIMONY

THE ABOVE CAPTIONED MATTER CAME ON FOR HEARING
AS SCHEDULED PURSUANT TO NOTICE AT THE OFFICE
OF SMITH, SMITH & WORK, 101 NORTH SECOND STREET,
CLEARFIELD, PENNSYLVANIA, AT 10 A.M., E.D.S.T.

Present were the Plaintiff, Martha Elizabeth Luzier, Sarah Hummel, a witness for the Plaintiff, and Plaintiff's counsel, M.L. Silberblatt, Bell, Silberblatt & Swoope. The Defendant did not appear in person or by counsel.

The Master then presented for a part of the record a copy of the Master's Notice, together with return receipt signed by the Defendant, Ernest Lynn Luzier, showing that he received notice of said hearing by registered mail, addressee only, on August 3, 1961.

MARTHA ELIZABETH LUZIER, being duly sworn, testified as follows:

BY MR. SILBERBLATT:

Q. Is your name Martha Elizabeth Luzier?

A. Yes.

Q. Were you married to Ernest Lynn Luzier?

A. Yes.

Q. What date were you married?

A. November 15, 1958.

Q. Where were you married?

A. By Rev. E. Roy Hauser in Clearfield.

Q. A Lutheran Minister in Clearfield?

A. Yes.

Q. At the time you were married, where did you live?

A. I was living with my parents.

Q. Where did they live?

A. In Woodland.

Q. Where did your husband live at the time of your marriage?

A. In Buffalo, but he came down to his parents.

Q. What was he doing in Buffalo?

A. He was working up there.

Q. Where did your husband's parents live?

A. In Woodland.

Q. So, was Woodland his home at that time?

A. No he had his home in Buffalo.

Q. How long had you known Ernest Lynn Luzier before you married him?

A. About six months.

Q. During that time, was he keeping company with you?

A. He came up to my parents' place and we went together.

Q. Are you a citizen of the United States?

A. Yes.

Q. Is your husband a citizen of the United States?

A. Yes.

Q. Where were you born?

A. In Woodland.

Q. How long did you live in Woodland until you moved somewhere else?

A. Until I was 19.

Q. Then when you were 19, where did you live?

A. I moved to the Rear of 13 Mt. Joy Road, Clearfield.

Q. Is that in Lawrence Township?

A. Yes.

Q. Where did you live after your marriage?

A. I was still staying with my parents.

Q. How long did you stay with your parents after your marriage?

A. Up until I was 19. I was married when I was 18 and I stayed with my parents until I was 19 going on 20.

Q. You say you were married in November of 1958 and at that time you lived with your parents in Woodland?

A. Yes.

Q. How long after your marriage was it until you moved to Lawrence Township?

A. I was married in 1958 and moved on March 7, 1959.

Q. And then you moved to the Rear of 13 Mt. Joy Road?

A. Yes.

Q. After your marriage, where did your husband go?

A. He went to Buffalo.

Q. What is your age?

A. 21.

Q. What is your occupation?

A. I get Public Assistance.

Q. Are you a housewife?

A. Yes.

Q. What is your husband's age?

A. 23 or 24.

Q. What is his occupation?

A. He worked at Bethlehem Steel at Buffalo.

Q. ~~Where~~ were there any children born of this marriage?

A. One.

Q. When was that child born?

A. October 4, 1958.

Q. Was it a boy or a girl?

A. A girl.

Q. What is the girl's name?

A. Pamela Luzier.

Q. Where does this child live?

A. She lives with me.

Q. At your address at Rear 13 Mt. Joy Road?

A. Yes.

Q. Do you know whether your husband is in the Armed Service of the United States?

A. no.

Q. You say he is not in the Service of the United States?

A. No.

Q. You were married November 15, 1958. How long did you live with your husband until he deserted you?

A. Until November 30, 1958.

Q. On the 30th of November, 1958, what did he do?

A. He came down on the 29th and left on the 30th, and he promised to get me a place up there and take me up after Christmas and he told me to be ready. I was ready, but he did not come down after me.

Q. You say he did come down on the 29th?

A. Yes, on November 29 and then he went back November 30th.

Q. Do you know what day of the week the 29th was in that year?

A. On a Saturday.

Q. What did he tell you then?

A. He was not there that day, but he came home that night and he was drunk then, and he did not talk, and, in fact, he didn't know nothing. On the 30th he said he would have a place for me and for me to be ready to go up after Christmas.

Q. Then November 30th was what day of the week?

A. A Sunday.

Q. That is when he told you he would have a place for you in Buffalo, is that right?

A. Yes.

Q. Did he ever ask you to come to Buffalo?

A. No.

Q. Did he ever write to you?

A. No.

Q. After November 30, 1958, do you know whether he was in Clearfield or around Clearfield?

A. Yes.

Q. Did he come out to see you?

A. He came back the 3rd of January of 1959.

Q. But did he come out to the house?

A. No.

Q. Did he call you on the telephone?

A. No.

Q. Was he ever in Clearfield after January?

A. He was in Clearfield other times, but I don't know what dates.

Q. Did he come to see you?

A. No.

Q. Has your husband ever asked you to come back with him?

A. No.

Q. Did your husband ever tell you he has a place for you in Buffalo?

A. No.

Q. Did you ever live with your husband after November 30, 1958?

A. No.

Q. So you say on November 30, 1958, he left you and never came back?

A. Yes, sir.

Q. Did you do anything to cause him to leave you?

A. No.

Q. Were you a good and dutiful wife?

A. Yes.

Q. Is there any agreement between you and your husband to get this divorce?

A. No.

Q. I show you a card, a return receipt card to registered mail, and you will note on that card there is written the name of Ernest Lynn Luzier. Is that your husband's signature?

A. Yes.

Q. And you know his signature?

A. Yes.

By Mr. Silberblatt: We offer in evidence, again, the signature card. Admitted by the Master.

Q. Did you ever have your husband arrested for nonsupport?

A. Yes.

Q. Did the case come up in Court?

A. Yes it came up and we had a hearing before the Judge.

Q. Did the Court make an order for support.

A. Yes.

By Mr. Silberblatt: We offer in evidence the proceedings of the case in Commonwealth, ex. rel, Martha Elizabeth Luzier, vs. Ernest Lynn Luzier. Admitted by the Master.

BY THE MASTER:

Q. Were you married in Clearfield by Rev. Hauser, a Lutheran Minister?

A. Yes.

MRS. SARAH HUMMEL, being duly sworn, testified as follows:

BY MR. SILBERBLATT:

Q. Are you related to Martha Elizabeth Luzier?

A. Yes.

Q. What is your relationship?

A. Sisters

Q. How old are you?

A. 23.

Q. Do you know about the marriage of your sister, Martha to Ernest Lynn Luzier?

A. Yes.

Q. Were you at the wedding?

A. Yes.

Q. Did they live together very long after their marriage?

A. No.

Q. How long would you say?

A. They lived together until November 30, 1958.

Q. What happened on the 30th of November, 1958?

A. He came down and he never came back. My husband took her down on the 29th to his parents and they brought her back up on the 30th, and he left and never came back.

Q. You say he took her to her parents?

A. No, my husband took her to his parents.

Q. Took whom?

A. Martha.

Q. To his people?

A. Yes.

Q. How long were they there?

A. They came back the 30th.

Q. Just a day?

A. Yes.

Q. Have you seen him since then?

A. No.

Q. Did you live near your sister, Martha Elizabeth Luzier?

A. Across the yard from her.

Q. Do you know whether your sister lived with her husband after November 30, 1958?

A. No she did not live with him after that.

Q. If she did live with him, you would have know it, is that right?

A. Yes.

Q. You say you lived across the street from her?

A. Yes.
