ROAD VIEWERS.

CLEARFIELD COUNTY SS:

At a Court of Quarter Sessions of the Peace of the County of Clearfield, held at Clearfield in and for said county, on the 15 day of March, A. D. 1869, before the Judges of the said Court, upon the petition of sundry inhabitants of the township of Bell & Burnside, in the said county, setting forth that they labor under great inconvenience for the want of a road or highway leading from ^{change in} the north line of the Borough of New Washington to Ostend P.O. in Bell Township

Report as to damages &c,

And therefore praying the Court to appoint proper persons to view ^{vacate & supply} and lay out the same according to law. Whereupon, the Court, upon due consideration had of the premises, do order and appoint

Mr. M. Cummings, Chas. S. Russell & Saml. J. McCloskey who, after being respectively sworn or affirmed to perform the duties of their appointment with impartiality and fidelity, are to view the ground proposed for said road; and if any two of them agree that there is occasion for such road, they shall proceed to lay out the same, as agreeably to the desire of the petitioners as may be, having respect for the best ground for a road, and the shortest distance, in such manner as to do the least injury to private property; and shall make report thereof, stating particularly whether they judge the same necessary for a public or private road, together with a plot or draft thereof, and the courses and distances, and reference to the improvements through which it may pass, to the next Court of Quarter Sessions to be held for said county. In which report they shall state that they have been sworn or affirmed according to law.

We the undersigned persons appointed by the within Order of Court, to view, locate and supply the Road therein mentioned. Respectfully Report.
That having given notice of the time and place of the view of said Road, according to the act of Assembly, and having all been present at the view of the ground proposed for such Road. And having all been first severally sworn in pursuance of the said Order, we have viewed, and laid out, and do return the following Road, viz, Beginning at the north line of the Borough of New Washington. Thence through land of Mrs Hutton. North six Degrees west. 38 perches to a Post. North Twenty four Degrees west. Eighty four perches to a Post. Thence North fifty five and three fourths Degrees west, Forty perches to the line of Mrs Hutton, and John Mackley. Thence by their line. North Two and one half Degrees East, Ninety Two perches to a ¹⁰Stump. Thence through Mrs Huttons land North Eighteen Degrees East, Ten perches, to line of J. J. Hurd. And line of Burnside and Bell Townships. Thence through Hurd's land, North Twenty seven deg west. at Eight perches. Cross the line of Hurd, and Jacob Snyder. Seventy six perches to Post. Thence North Twenty deg west, Twenty seven and eight tenths perches. Thence North forty Eight deg west Ten perches to a post. Thence North Twenty five perches to Post. Thence North Eighteen deg west, at Eighteen perches cor. of Snyder and Mrs Runtzman. Fifty five perches to Post. Thence North Forty Three deg west Twenty four perches. North Eighteen deg west, Eleven perches. North Six and one quarter deg East, Thirty and six tenths perches, to the line of Mrs Runtzman and John M. Byers. deg. West Fifty and Eight tenths perches, to the line of Breath and
Elias Henderson. Thence through Henderson's land, North Forty deg.
East Forty seven and six tenths perches to a post. North Ten and one half
deg. East Fourteen, and four tenths perches to a post. North Thirteen and
one quarter deg. West, six perches to a post in John M. Ross' field.
Thence North Sixty four and one half deg. West Sixty Eight perches
to a stone by Elias Henderson's Stone. (Ostend P.O.) A Draft whereof
