Nugent one of the Justices of the Peace in and for the County of Clearfield, on the 20th day of Sept AD 1869 between the hours of 9 o'clock A.M. and 10 o'clock P.M. of said day, in obedience to the annexed rule of Court, and notice hereto attached.

Samuel C. McCandless, sworn, ^aresident of Burnside Township, Clearfield County, I know the ground over which a public road was viewed and laid out by E. P. Baker, Lewis Boice and Thomas Thompson, sometime during the spring or summer of 1869. I believe, the old road, the ground ~~over~~ which the new road was viewed and laid out, from near the Old Steam Saw mill on the River to the Bridge across Beaver Run at the head of Patchins dam in Burnside Township, to be the highest and best ground for that purpose.

The road is very necessary and we could not get along without such a road through to the River.

Frederick Shepherd, sworn, I am a resident of Burnside Township, Clearfield County.

I am well acquainted with ground on which a public road was viewed and laid out from near the Old Steam Saw Mill on the River to the Bridge across Beaver Run at the head of Patchins dam in Burnside Township by E. P. Baker, Lewis Boyce and Thomas Thompson viewed appointed by Court for that purpose.

I helped to open out the old private timber road on the same ground about thirty years ago and I believe the same to be the highest and best ground on which a road could be made in that locality.

I know that the land along the line between Horace Patchin and Aaron Patchin is swampy and that a road could not be made on the line without great expense for bridging, &c.

Such a road is indispensable to our neighborhood. Without it we could not get our timber to the river.

I was one of the viewers appointed by Court to view and lay out a road from near the Old Steam Saw Mill on the River to the Bridge across Beaver Run at the head Patchins Dam in Burnside Township. We viewed the ground ~~along the~~ where we laid out the road, and also the ground along the line between Horace Patchin and Aaron Patchin according to the points shown by both parties interested in the road, and found the ground on which we laid out the road to be the highest, driest, and best in every respect, and that a road would be more easily made there than along the line.

I think it would be almost impossible to make a good township road along the line, as near two thirds of the distance is very swampy.

Such a road is much needed, there is no other outlet to the River for a large section of country, east of the River.

At a Court of Quarter Sessions of the Peace of the County of Clearfield, held at Clearfield" in and for said county, on the 18 day of March, A. D. 1869, before the Judges of the said Court, upon the petition of sundry inhabitants of the township of Burnside, in the said county, setting forth that they labor under great inconvenience for the want of a road or highway leading from Near the old Steam Saw mill on the River, to the Bridge across the Beaver Run at the head of Horrace Patchin's Saw mill dam

Report as to damages &c

And therefore praying the Court to appoint proper persons to view and lay out the same according to law. Whereupon, the Court, upon due consideration had of the premises, do order and appoint

Lewis Bois, Thomas Thompson & C. P. Baker who, after being respectively sworn or affirmed to perform the duties of their appointment with impartiality and fidelity, are to view the ground proposed for said road; and if any two of them agree that there is occasion for such road, they shall proceed to lay out the same, as agreeably to the desire of the petitioners as may be, having respect for the best ground for a road, and the shortest distance, in such manner as to do the least injury to private property; and shall make report thereof, stating particularly whether they judge the same necessary for a public or private road, together with a plot or draft thereof, and the courses and distances, and reference to the improvements through which it may pass, to the next Court of Quarter Sessions to be held for said county. In which report they shall state that they have been sworn or affirmed according to law.

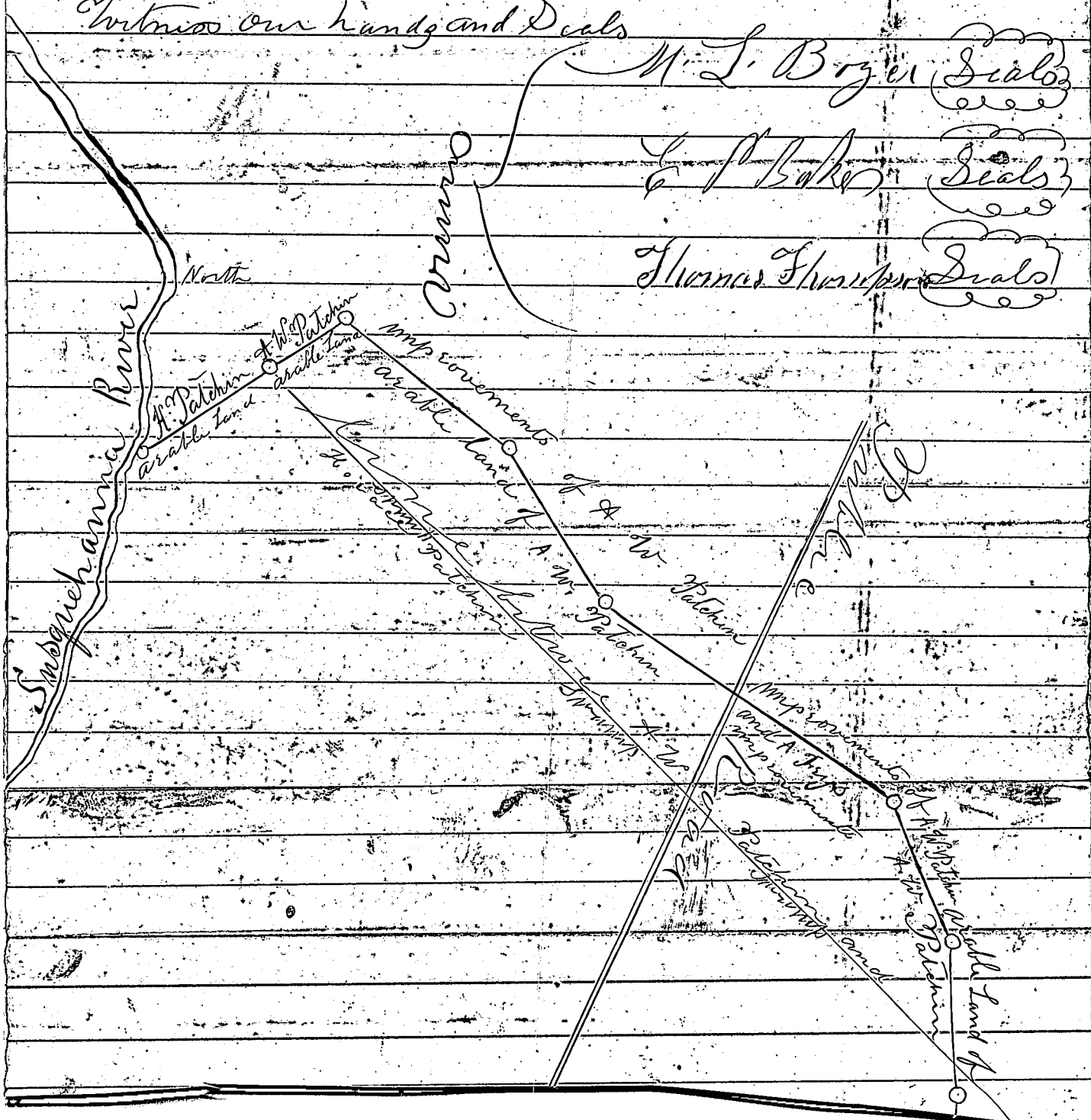
