RELEASE FROM LIEN OF JUDGMENT

TO ALL TO WHOM THESE PRESENTS SHALL COME, GREETINGS:

WHEREAS, the CURWENSVILLE STATE BANK of Curwensville, Pennsylvania has obtained a judgment in the Court of Common Pleas of Clearfield County, Pennsylvania against GORDON K. HEWITT and ETHEL N. HEWITT of Curwensville Borough, Clearfield County, Pennsylvania (it being No. 108 of February Special Term 1960), for the sum of \$2750.00 and costs and the same having been revived (No. 107 February Term, 1961) for the sum of \$1723.68 and costs which judgment now remains a lien on all the real estate of the said Gordon K. Hewitt and Ethel N. Hewitt within the county aforesaid.

AND WHEREAS, the said Gordon K. Hewitt and Ethel N. Hewitt have requested that all those two lots or pieces of land situate in Curwensville Borough, Clearfield County, Pennsylvania bounded and described as follows:

BEGINNING at a post corner of Lot No. 112 on line of Short Street; thence in an easterly direction along line of Lot No. 112 a distance of one hundred fifty (150) feet to a twenty (20) foot alley; thence in a Southerly direction along line of said alley a distance of one hundred (100) feet to a post corner of Lot No. 114; thence in a Westerly direction along line of Lot No. 114 a distance of one hundred fifty (150) feet to Short Street; thence along line of Short Street in a Northerly direction a distance of one hundred (100) feet to post corner of Lot No. 112 and the place of beginning.
BEING Lots Nos. 113 and 114, each lot being fifty (50) feet wide front on Short Street and extending one hundred fifty (150) feet to the twenty foot alley.

being part of the same premises which the Curwensville National Bank by its deed dated August 1, 1941 and recorded in Deed Book 337

at page 540 conveyed to Gordon K. Hewitt and Ethel N. Hewitt, husband and wife, should be exonerated and discharged from the lien of judgment aforesaid.

NOW KNOW YE, that the said Curwensville State Bank favoring the request by the said Gordon K. Hewitt and Ethel N. Hewitt, and in consideration of one dollar lawful money of the United States, at the execution hereof by the said Gordon K. Hewitt and Ethel N. Hewitt, well and truly paid, the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, has exonerated and discharged, and hereby does exonerate and discharge the above-described messuage, piece, or parcel of land, with the appurtenances, of and from the lien and obligation of the said judgment, and of and from all suits, actions, executions, costs, damages, and demands whatsoever, for or on account, or by reason of the said judgment; provided, however, that nothing herein contained shall be construed so as to impair the operation of the said judgment against the said Gordon K. Hewitt and Ethel N. Hewitt and their estates other than against the messuage, piece or parcel of land hereinbefore expressly mentioned and described.
