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
PETITION FOR REVIEW

1. That Petitioner is Jacob John Lauder of HC 54 Buck Run Road, Frenchville, PA, 16836.
2. That Petitioner's Driver License No. 27397234.
3. That Respondent is the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, Department of Transportation.
4. That by Official Notice dated February 10, 2003, Respondent notified Petitioner that his operating privileges were being suspended for a period of ninety (90) days as the result of his conviction of the offense of Exceeding Maximum Speed on January 24, 2004. A copy of said Notice is hereinafter attached as Exhibit "A".
5. That Petitioner filed a Notice of Appeal of said Summary Conviction in Clearfield County which appeal is currently pending.

Dear MR. LAUDER:

This is an **Official Notice of the Suspension** of your Driving Privilege as authorized by Section 1538E of the Pennsylvania Vehicle Code. As a result of your 02/02/2004 conviction of violating Section 3362 of the Vehicle Code, **EXCEEDING MAXIMUM SPEED**, on 01/24/2004:

- Your driving privilege is **SUSPENDED** for a period of 90 DAY(S) effective 03/16/2004 at 12:01 a.m.
- PennDOT is required by Section 1535 of the Pennsylvania Vehicle Code to assign 5 points to your driving record.

Before PennDOT can restore your driving privilege, you must follow the instructions in this letter for **COMPLYING WITH THIS SUSPENSION**, **PAYING THE RESTORATION FEE** and **PROVIDING PROOF OF INSURANCE**. You should follow **ALL** instructions very carefully. Even if you have served all the time on the suspension/revocation, we cannot restore your driving privilege until all the requirements are satisfied.

COMPLYING WITH THIS SUSPENSION

You must return all current Pennsylvania driver's licenses, learner's permits, temporary driver's licenses (camera cards) in your possession on or before 03/16/2004. You may surrender these items before, 03/16/2004, for earlier credit; however, you may not drive after these items are surrendered.

YOU MAY NOT RETAIN YOUR DRIVER'S LICENSE FOR IDENTIFICATION PURPOSES. However, you may apply for and obtain a photo identification card at any Driver License Center for a cost of \$10.00. You must present two (2) forms of proper identification (e.g., birth certificate, valid U.S. passport, marriage certificate, etc.) in order to obtain your photo identification card.

PROVIDING PROOF OF INSURANCE

Within the last 30 days of your suspension/revocation, we will send you a letter asking that you provide proof of insurance at that time. This letter will list acceptable documents and what will be needed if you do not own a vehicle registered in Pennsylvania.

Important: Please make sure that PennDOT is notified if you move from your current address. You may notify PennDOT of your address change by calling any of the phone numbers listed at the end of this letter.


APPEAL

You have the right to appeal this action to the Court of Common Pleas (Civil Division) within 30 days of the mail date, FEBRUARY 10, 2004, of this letter. If you file an appeal in the County Court, the Court will give you a time-stamped certified copy of the appeal. In order for your appeal to be valid, you must send this time-stamped certified copy of the appeal by certified mail to:

2. Upon receipt, review and acceptance of your Pennsylvania driver's license(s), learner's permit(s), and/or a sworn notarized letter, PennDOT will send you a receipt confirming the date that credit began. If you do not receive a receipt from us within 3 weeks, please contact our office. Otherwise, you will not be given credit toward serving this suspension. PennDOT phone numbers are listed at the end of this letter.
3. If you do not return all current driver license products, we must refer this matter to the Pennsylvania State Police for prosecution under SECTION 1571(a)(4) of the Pennsylvania Vehicle Code.

PAYING THE RESTORATION FEE

You must pay a restoration fee to PennDOT to be restored from a suspension/revocation of your driving privilege. To pay your restoration fee, complete the following steps:

1. Return the enclosed Application for Restoration. The amount due is listed on the application.
2. Write your driver's license number (listed on the first page) on the check or money order to ensure proper credit.
3. Follow the payment and mailing instructions on the back of the application.


ORDER OF COURT

AND NOW, to wit: this 02 day of June, 2006, this appeal by the petitioner, Jacob John Lauder, from an order of the Pennsylvania Department of Transportation's Bureau of Driver Licensing for the suspension of his driving privilege for a period of 90 days pursuant to 75 Pa.C.S. §1538(e) is, with the consent of the Bureau, remanded to the Bureau for rescission of the appealed 90 day suspension, updating of the petitioner's driving record to show that he was convicted of violating 75 Pa.C.S. §3362 on January 24, 2004 by operating a motor vehicle at the rate of 55 m.p.h. in a 45 m.p.h. zone, and deletion of 3 of the 5 points that had been assigned to the petitioner's driving record due to his conviction at the district court level for the January 24, 2004 violation of 75 Pa.C.S. §3362, if such action has not already been taken.
