

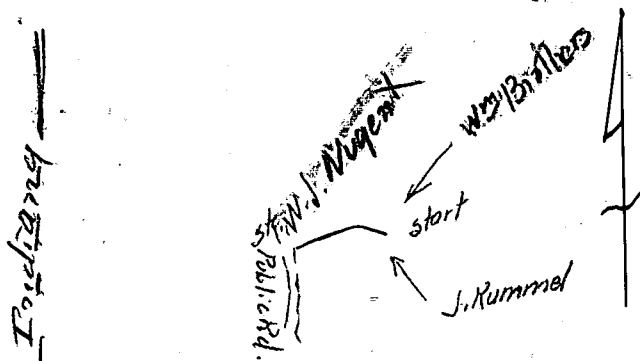

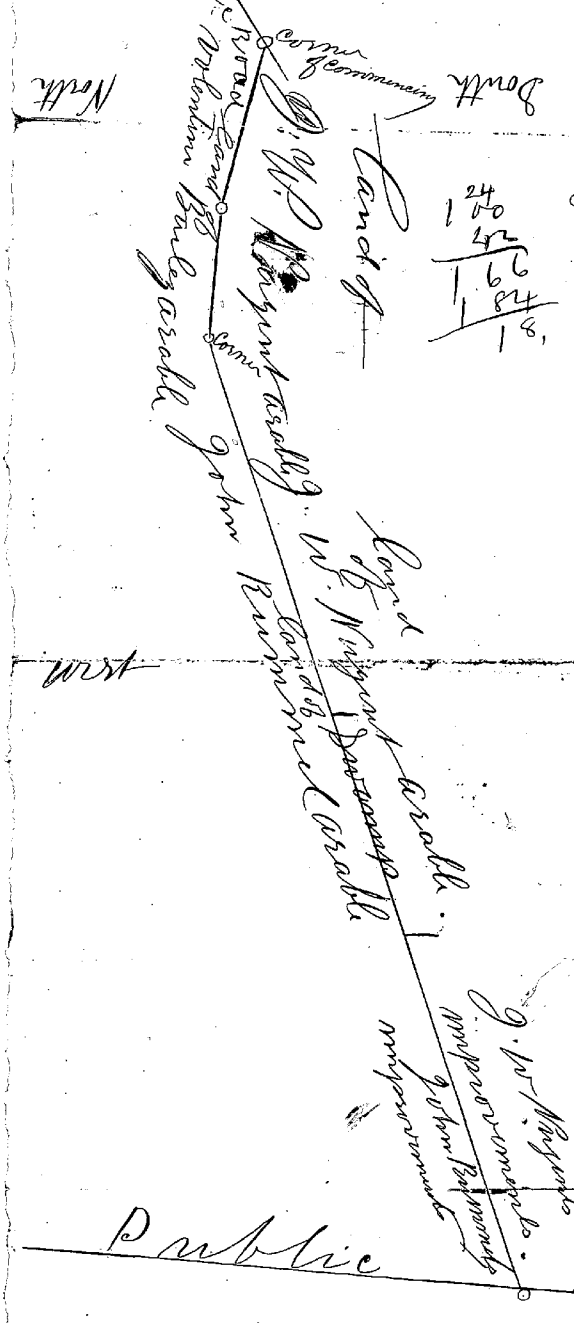

thereof after having given due and public notice according to Law having been duly sworn and affirmed all the viewers appointed by said Order having viewed the ground proposed for the within mentioned Road the undersigned viewers do agree there is occasion for a road as desired by the petitioners and that the same is necessary for a public Road and having had respect to the shortest distance and best ground for such Road we have laid it out in such a manner as should do the least injury to private property and as far as practicable agreeably to the desire of the petitioners and do return for public use the following described Road Commencing at the corner of William Brothers land or improvements on the public road on the Hill thence over a flat Ridge and some Swamp through the arable lands of J. W. Nugent and Volentin Bailey along or near the line North Seventy six Degrees West twenty four perches thence North Eighty five Degrees West ^{100 yds} thence through the arable lands of J. W. Nugent and John Kummel along the line South Sixty nine and three quarters Degrees West one hundred perches to the improvements of the same along the line through said improvements the same course forty two perches to the public Road entire length one hundred Eighty four perches a plot or draft whereof is hereto annexed which said Road as so as aforesaid laid out we are of the opinion is necessary for a public Road and we assess the damages done to John Kummel by the laying out of this Road fifteen Dollars to W. J. Nugent no damages assessed witness our hands and Seals August 7th 1869

ROAD VIEWERS.

CLEARFIELD COUNTY SS:

At a Court of Quarter Sessions of the Peace of the County of Clearfield, held at Clearfield in and for said county, on the 24 day of May, A. D. 1869, before the Judges of the said Court, upon the petition of sundry inhabitants of the township of Burnside, in the said county, setting forth that they labor under great inconvenience for the want of a road or highway leading from William Brothers to a point on the Public Road on the line between Jr. Cummel and W. J. Nugent.

Report as to Damages &c.

And therefore praying the Court to appoint proper persons to view and lay out the same according to law. Whereupon, the Court, upon due consideration had of the premises, do order and appoint

Lewis Boice, John Meyers, and J. H. King who, after being respectively sworn or affirmed to perform the duties of their appointment with impartiality and fidelity, are to view the ground proposed for said road; and if any two of them agree that there is occasion for such road, they shall proceed to lay out the same, as agreeably to the desire of the petitioners as may be, having respect for the best ground for a road, and the shortest distance, in such manner as to do the least injury to private property; and shall make report thereof, stating particularly whether they judge the same necessary for a public or private road, together with a plot or draft thereof, and the courses and distances, and reference to the improvements through which it may pass, to the next Court of Quarter Sessions to be held for said county. In which report they shall state that they have been sworn or affirmed according to law.
