ROAD VIEWERS.

CLEARFIELD COUNTY SS:

At a Court of Quarter Sessions of the Peace of the County of Clearfield, held at Clearfield in and for said county, on the 15th day of March, A.D. 1869, before the Judges of the said Court, upon the petition of sundry inhabitants of the township of Locust Grove, in the said county, setting forth that they labor under great inconvenience for the want of a road or highway leading from the Public Road near Joab Reider's to the forks of the Road leading to the Catholic Church

Report as to damages

And therefore praying the Court to appoint proper persons to view and lay out the same according to law. Whereupon, the Court, upon due consideration had of the premises, do order and appoint

John Mitchell, John Rogers, & Joab Reider who, after being respectively sworn or affirmed to perform the duties of their appointment with impartiality and fidelity, are to view the ground proposed for said road; and if any two of them agree that there is occasion for such road, they shall proceed to lay out the same, as agreeably to the desire of the petitioners as may be, having respect for the best ground for a road, and the shortest distance, in such manner as to do the least injury to private property; and shall make report thereof, stating particularly whether they judge the same necessary for a public or private road, together with a plot or draft thereof, and the courses and distances, and reference to the improvements through which it may pass, to the next Court of Quarter Sessions to be held for said county. In which report they shall state that they have been sworn or affirmed according to law.



To the Honorable the Judges of the Court of
Quarter Sessions of the Peace in and for
the County of Clearfield. We the persons
appointed by the within order of Court to view
to and supply the road therein mentioned
do report: That after giving due public
notice of the time and place, we met agree-
ably thereto on the 7th day of June A.D. 1869
and after being duly sworn according to law
we proceeded to view and mark the following
road to wit Beginning at a point on the public road
near Goat Riders thence N^o 2¹/₄ E. 170.5 perches thence
W^o 8¹/₂ N^o 29.5 perches N^o 10¹/₂ E. 16.4 perches thence W^o. 28, N^o 11.6 perches
W^o. 5¹/₂ N^o 20 perches thence W^o. 19, E. 10 perches thence W^o. 8, N^o 5 perches
to whom road is to be supplied to supply the above
vacated part we proceeded to view and lay out
and do now return for public's use the follow-
ing road to wit Beginning on the public road near
Goat Riders thence N^o. 13, E. 50 perches thence N^o. 9, E. 80 perches
thence N^o 22¹/₂, E. 89 perches thence N^o. 29, E. 11 perches thence N^o 20, N^o
6 perches thence N^o. 37, W. 32 perches thence N^o 26, N^o 9 perches
thence 13¹/₂ N^o. 28, perches thence N^o 56¹/₂ N^o. 31 perches thence N^o 22, N^o
18 perches thence N^o 20, N^o. 9 perches thence 43 N^o. 11 perches thence
N^o. 21 N^o. 5 perches to Rub road to forks of road near
Catholic Church. And we also further report
that the owners of land which the above laid
out road passes through were all present and
that they did not wish damages to them on account
of making of above road.
