To the Honorable the Judges of the Court of Quarter Sessions of the Peace in and for the County of Clearfield We, the subscribers, do report that after giving due public notice of the time and place of meeting we met agreeably thereto on the 30th day of October A.D 1808 and after being duly sworn according to law we have viewed the place where the road within mentioned is requested and are of opinion that there is no occasion to lay out the same.

And therefore praying the Court to appoint proper persons to view and lay out the same according to law. Whereupon, the Court, upon due consideration had of the premises, do order and appoint

James Mitchell, Josiah P. Reed and Edward Allard - who, after being respectively sworn or affirmed to perform the duties of their appointment with impartiality and fidelity, are to view the ground proposed for said road; and if any two of them agree that there is occasion for such road, they shall proceed to lay out the same, as agreeably to the desire of the petitioners as may be, having respect for the best ground for a road, and the shortest distance, in such manner as to do the least injury to private property; and shall make report thereof, stating particularly whether they judge the same necessary for a public or private road, together with a plot or draft thereof, and the courses and distances, and reference to the improvements through which it may pass, to the next Court of Quarter Sessions to be held for said county. In which report they shall state that they have been sworn or affirmed according to law.
