To the Honorable the Judges of the Court of Quarter Sessions of Clearfield County.

The petition of Leah Bloom respectfully represents, That she is a resident and tax payer in the township of Pike in said county, that the school house to which she must send her children to school is on the opposite of the Susquehanna River from her residence, that there is no bridge over said river near her residence, and that said river is at all times dangerous and difficult to ^{cross} pass, and during the greater portion of the time, when there is school is impassible, and that she is deprived of the advantages of school for her children without going a great distance, and she therefore desires her land to be annexed to and included in Lawrence District for educational purposes, and that she shall remain in said township of Pike for all other purposes. Wherefore she prays the Court to appoint viewers to proceed under Act of Assembly approved 18th April 1867, and the acts to which the same is a supplement, and report to the Court with regard to the propriety of granting the prayer of said petitioner, And she will ever pray &c.

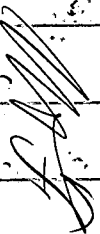

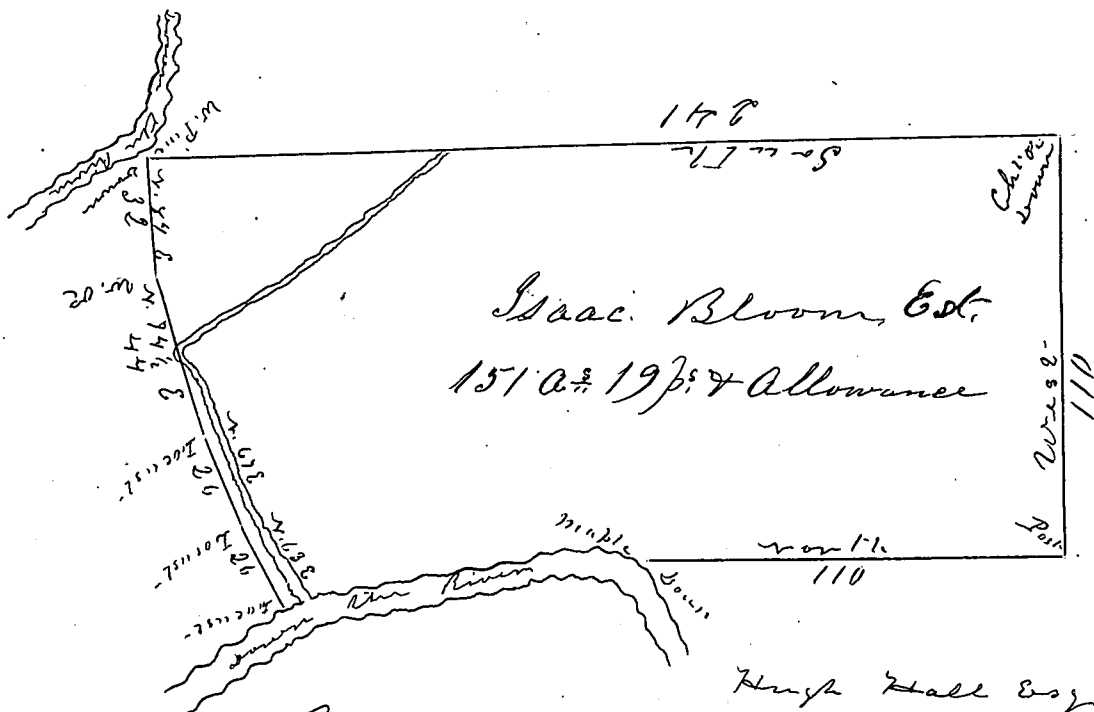

ROAD VIEWER'S REPORT.

CLEARFIELD COUNTY, SS:

At a Court of Quarter Sessions of the Peace of the County of Clearfield, held at Clearfield, in and for said county, on the 10 day of January, A. D., 1870, before the Judges of the said Court, upon the petition of ^{Leah Bloom} ~~sundry inhabitants~~ of the township of Pike, in the said county, setting forth that ~~they~~ ^{she} labors under great inconvenience for the want of a ~~road or highway~~, leading from A School House in her said Township convenient ~~for~~ to send to

And she is desirous of having her farm property in Pike Township annexed to Lawrence Township for school purposes. and that she shall remain in said Township of Pike for all other purposes.

And therefore praying the Court to appoint proper persons to view and ^{Report the} ~~lay out~~ the same, according ~~act of assembly approved 13 April 1867 and its supplements~~ to law. Whereupon, the Court, upon due consideration had of the premises, do order and appoint Saml. L. McCloskey, Eli Bloom & William A. Read

who, after being respectively sworn or affirmed to perform the duties of their appointment, with impartiality and fidelity, are to view the ground proposed for said ~~road~~ ^{annexation}; and if any two of them agree that there is occasion for such ~~road~~ ^{annexation} they shall proceed to ~~lay out~~ ^{Report} the same, as agreeably to the desire of the petitioners ~~as may be, in respect for the best ground for a road, and the shortest distance, in such manner as to do the least injury to private property; and shall make report thereof, stating particularly whether they judge the same necessary for a public or private road, together with a plot or draft thereof, and the courses and distances, with reference to the improvements through which it may pass, to the next Court of Quarter Sessions to be held for said county. In which report they shall state that they have been sworn or affirmed according to law.~~ ^{interest of the community} ~~and the desire of the Petitioners~~ ^{with a plot or draft thereof}
