To the Honorable Judges of the Court of Quarter
Sessions of Clearfield County.

The Petition of
Mary Prendergast, respectfully represents, that
she is an inhabitant of the Borough of Clearfield
in the County aforesaid and the owner in fee
of a certain lot or parcel of ground, in said
Borough, known as lot No. 150 in the general
plot or plan of said town. That upon said lot
at the time your petitioner became possessed
thereof was erected a stable, and for many
years previous thereto. That at sometime to
your petitioner unknown, as she verily believes
after the erection of said stable an alley was
surveyed and laid out dividing lot No. 50
and lot No. 157, leaving the corner of said stable
to extending into said alley thus laid out, and
open by the Borough Authorities. That recent
by your petitioner was notified by the
Borough Authorities to remove said stable.
But your petitioner, being informed, ~~and~~
that the Borough Authorities had no power
to remove said stable without a petition
being presented or order of the Court au
thorizing them to widen or straighten the

Same, wherefore she dis-regarded the notice
to remove, said Stable. That on the 10th day of
September AD 1870, the Borough Authority pro-
ceeded to tear down and carry away your
petitions stable, wherefore she presents this
petition, respectfully praying your honors
to make such order therein as to you may
see proper, under the regulations, and statutes
made and provided for the opening and widen-
ing streets, alleys &c

ROAD VIEWER'S REPORT.

CLEARFIELD COUNTY, SS:

At a Court of Quarter Sessions of the Peace of the County of Clearfield, held at Clearfield, in and for said county, on the September, A. D., 1870 before the Judges of the said Court, upon the petition of ~~the inhabitants of the township of Clearfield~~, in the said county, setting forth that they labor under great inconvenience for the want of a road or highway, leading from ~~ask the said Court to~~ appoint proper persons to view and assess the damages sustained by her by reason of the pulling down of a log Stable on her lot, by order of the town Council, for the purpose of widening an alley in said Borough of Clearfield.

And therefore praying the Court to appoint proper persons to view and lay out the same, according to law. Whereupon, the Court, upon due consideration had of the premises, do order and appoint G. Reed, Jas. Abraham, and A. M. Wells who, after being respectively sworn or affirmed to perform the duties of their appointment with impartiality and fidelity, are to view the ground proposed for said road; and if any two of them agree that there is occasion for such road they shall proceed to lay out the same, as agreeably to the desire of the petitioners as may be, having respect for the best ground for a road, and the shortest distance, in such manner as to do the least injury to private property, and shall make report thereof, stating particularly whether they judge the same necessary for a public or private road, together with a plot or draft thereof, and the courses and distances, with reference to the improvements through which it may pass, to the next Court of Quarter Sessions to be held for said county. In which report they shall state that they have been sworn or affirmed according to law.
