The views appointed to examine a
route for a Private Road for H. C.
Borman near Penfield would respectfully
report.

They examined the proposed route and
find that a road is necessary to allow
passage to and from the land and coal
owned by the said Borman and on the
20th of Sept. 1870. caused the same to be
surveyed as follows. and recommend
the location thereof 33 feet in width

Beginning in the Public Highway of
Bennetts Branch. at a point 16 ft. west of
from the line of an apple tree near Henry
Browns Groves and a hickory tree near
Bennetts Branch.

Thence S. $41\frac{1}{2}^{\circ}$ E. pass said hickory tree
at 21⁷⁰ rods - pass out of Frederick Linfields
Enclosed meadow at 24 rods. continue
in all thirty six rods

Thence S. $48\frac{1}{8}^{\circ}$ E. twelve rods along track
of a road and in woods

Thence S. $38\frac{1}{2}^{\circ}$ E. Eight $\frac{7}{10}$ rods

" S. $16\frac{1}{4}^{\circ}$ E. Twenty five rods

" S. 14° E. Twenty three $\frac{7}{10}$ rods

" S. $13\frac{1}{4}^{\circ}$ E. Fourteen rods

" S. $20\frac{1}{4}^{\circ}$ E. Twenty one rods

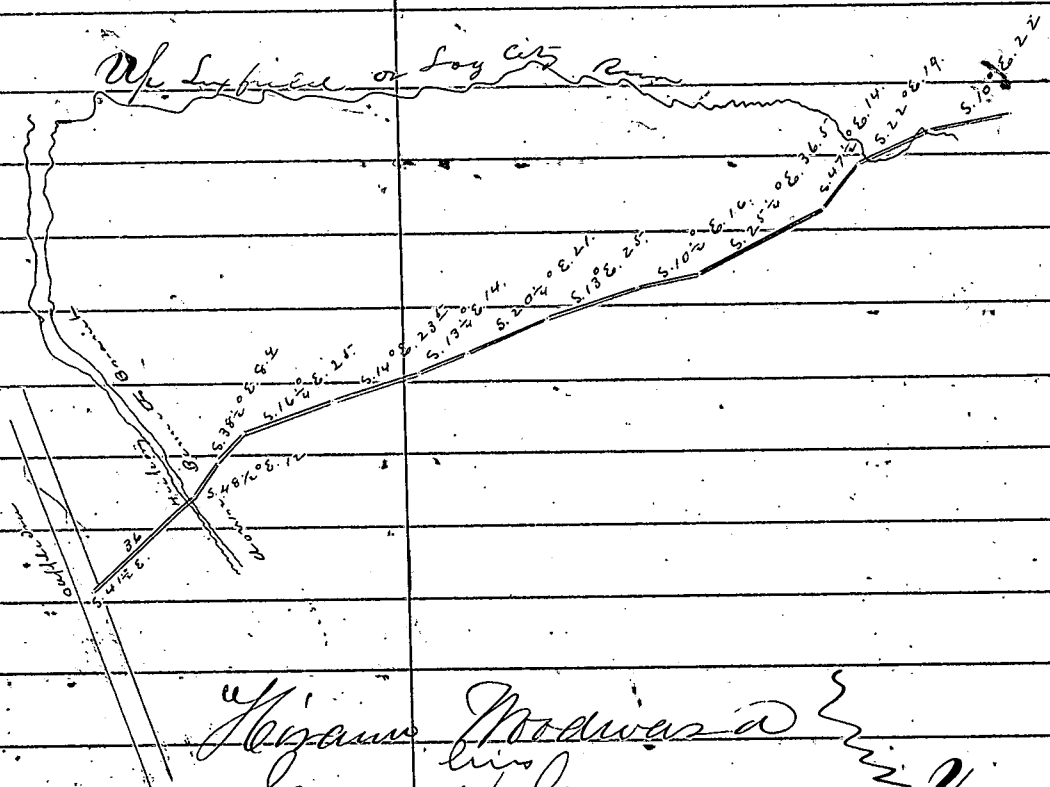

1st Exceptions on the part of St. Liffiew.
It does not appear that the three viewers appointed all were present and made the view, nor do they report.

2nd The rivers who report. H Woodward and Samuel Conaway, as well as David Tyler, who were first appointed. June 8th 1880, were changed and their names erased, and new rivers, to wit. John Le Centre, Henry Brown, and John Kline, were appointed by the Court Sept 27th 1880. as appears by endorsement on the petition.

3rd The road as located by the view runs for half a mile through the heart of Frederick Lott's farm, one fourth of a mile of it being through his cleared land, and the report fails to show the land and the improvements through which the road is located as the law requires.

4th The damages sustained by said Lixfield would be over \$200, and are assessed at \$20, and the assessment is not according to law.
