ROAD VIEWER'S REPORT.

CLEARFIELD COUNTY, SS:

At a Court of Quarter Sessions of the Peace of the County of Clearfield, held at Clearfield, in and for said county, on the 11th day of January, A. D., 1870, before the Judges of the said Court, upon the petition of sundry inhabitants of the township of Pike, in the said county, setting forth that they labor under great inconvenience for the want of a road or highway, leading from David S. Fleming's

past Moses Morris to George Weizenrathner in
Pike Township.

Report as to Damages.

And therefore praying the Court to appoint proper persons to view and lay out the same, according to law. Whereupon, the Court, upon due consideration had of the premises, do order and appoint

Simon J. McCloskey, W. P. Davis and J. B. Bloom

who, after being respectively sworn or affirmed to perform the duties of their appointment with impartiality and fidelity, are to view the ground proposed for said road; and if any two of them agree that there is occasion for such road they shall proceed to lay out the same, as agreeably to the desire of the petitioners as may be, having respect for the best ground for a road, and the

shortest distance, in such manner as to do the least injury to private property; and shall make report thereof, stating particularly whether they judge the same necessary for a public or private road, together with a plot or darft thereof, and the courses and distances, with reference to the improvements through which it may pass, to the next Court of Quarter Sessions to be held for said county. In which report they shall state that they have been sworn or affirmed according to law.

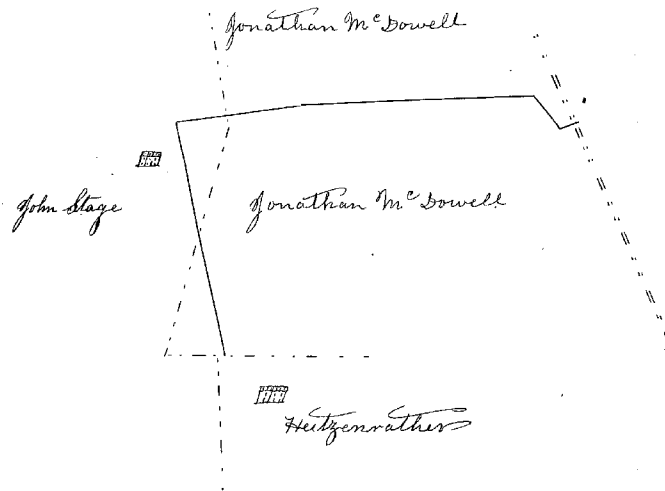

To the Hon. the Judges within named
 We the undersigned, persons appointed by the
 within Order of Court, to view, and lay out the Road
 therein mentioned, Respectfully Report: That having
 given notice of the time, and place, of the view of said Road
 according to the Act of Assembly, and having all been
 present; at the view of the ground proposed for such Road,
 and having all been first severally sworn or affirmed, in
 pursuance of the said Order. We have viewed, and
 laid out, and do return for private use, the following
 Road, viz: Beginning at a post on the line between Jona-
 than M^cDowell, and George Heitzgenrather, one perch west of
 of his South East corner. Thence through land of Jonathan
 McDowell, and John Stage. South, nine degrees East, thirty
 seven, and two tenths perches to a Post. Thence through land of
 John Stage & Jonathan M^cDowell South eighty six
 degrees west, nineteen perches, North eighty nine degrees
 west, thirty six perches - North thirty five and one half
 degrees west six perches, South seventy seven degrees
 west two perches to the Public Road near Moses Norris'
 house. A Draft whereof is herewith annexed. which
 said Road, so as aforesaid laid out we are of opinion is
 necessary for a private Road.
