ROAD VIEWER'S REPORT.

CLEARFIELD COUNTY, SS:

At a Court of Quarter Sessions of the Peace of the County of Clearfield, held at Clearfield, in and for said county, on the 6th day of June, A. D., 1870, before the Judges of the said Court, upon the petition of sundry inhabitants of the township of Burnside, in the said county, setting forth that they labor under great inconvenience for the want of a ~~road or highway~~ leading from Review with power to

vacate and supply a Public Road Leading from
the forks of the Road (near the West line of New
Washington Borough) to the Village Burnside

"Report as to Damages &c"

And therefore praying the Court to appoint proper persons to view and lay out the same, according to law. Whereupon, the Court, upon due consideration had of the premises, do order and appoint

S. F. McCloskey, H. D. Rose and Jm Owens

who, after being respectively sworn or affirmed to perform the duties of their appointment with impartiality and fidelity, are to view the ground proposed for said road; and if any two of them agree that there is occasion for such ^{change of} road they shall proceed to ^{vacation and supply of} lay out the same, as agreeably to ^{vacate and} the desire of the petitioners as may be, having respect for the best ground for a road, and the

shortest distance, in such manner as to do the least injury to private property; and shall make report thereof, stating particularly whether they judge the same necessary for a public or private road, together with a plot or draft thereof, and the courses and distances, with reference to the improvements through which it may pass, to the next Court of Quarter Sessions to be held for said county. In which report they shall state that they have been sworn or affirmed according to law.

We the undersigned, persons appointed by the within Order of Court. to view, vacate, and supply, the ^{pub.} Road leading from the forks of the Road near the west line of New Washington Borough, to the village of Burnside, Respectfully Report. That having given notice of the time and place of the view according to the Act of Assembly, and having been all present at the view of the ground proposed for supplying such parts of said Road, as proposed to be vacated, and having all been first severally sworn or affirmed in pursuance of said Order, we have viewed, and do return the following Road viz, Beginning at the line of New Washington Borough. Thence through land of John Riddle, South fifty three degrees west, sixteen perches. South seventy two and a half degrees west, Twenty eight and two tenths perches. South fifty nine degrees west Twenty One perches, to the line of Riddle and Samuel Byers. Thence Between them North Eighty Seven degrees west One hundred and twenty eight perches to a stone corner of James Stevenson. Thence Between his land, and land owned by James & Achison Byers - South three degrees west Thirty four perches, Thence through Byers' land North Eighty Seven west One hundred and three and eight tenths perches. South forty four and a half degrees west, Sixty eight perches. South fifty three degrees west, Eleven & three tenths perches. South seventy nine degrees west, nine and two tenths perches. Thence through Edward Smiths land North Seventy One deg west thirty four perches. North thirty Seven degrees west, Twenty two perches, North Eighty eight degrees west, One hundred and sixteen perches. Thence in David Smiths Land South Eighty four west, Twenty four perches, to stone corner of Smith and Abner Eisenhower. - 1st The petition shows that the people of the Township through which the road passes do not desire the road,
- 2^d Because it would be extremely burdensome upon the township to build another road there being already a road between the points mentioned
- 3^d The draft annexed to the forgoing report is not such as is required by law
- 4th No notice was given to the township

to the Public Road at the Town of Burnside. A Draft whereof is
hereunto Annexed. And on which Draft that part of the Road vacated
is Shown by the dotted lines. which dotted part is on very bad ground
And up, and down steep hills.

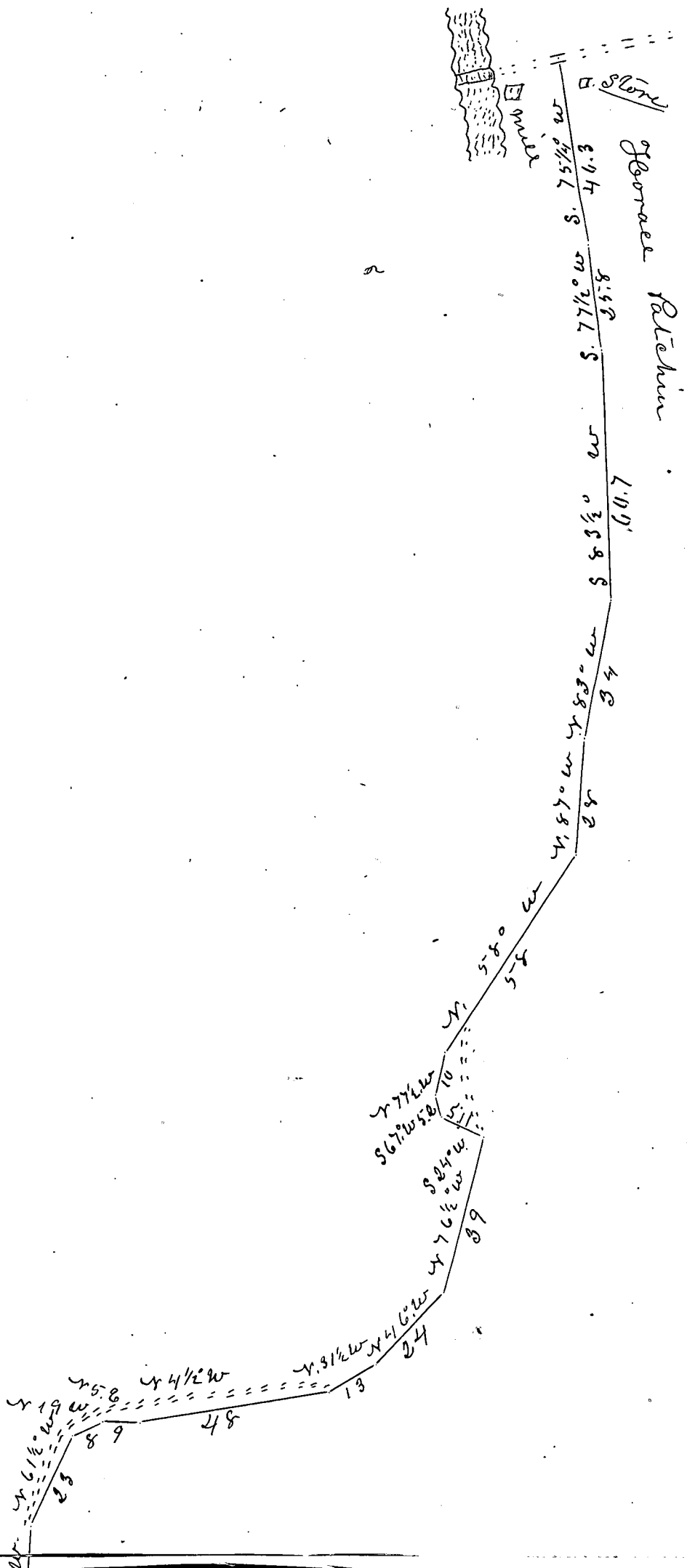

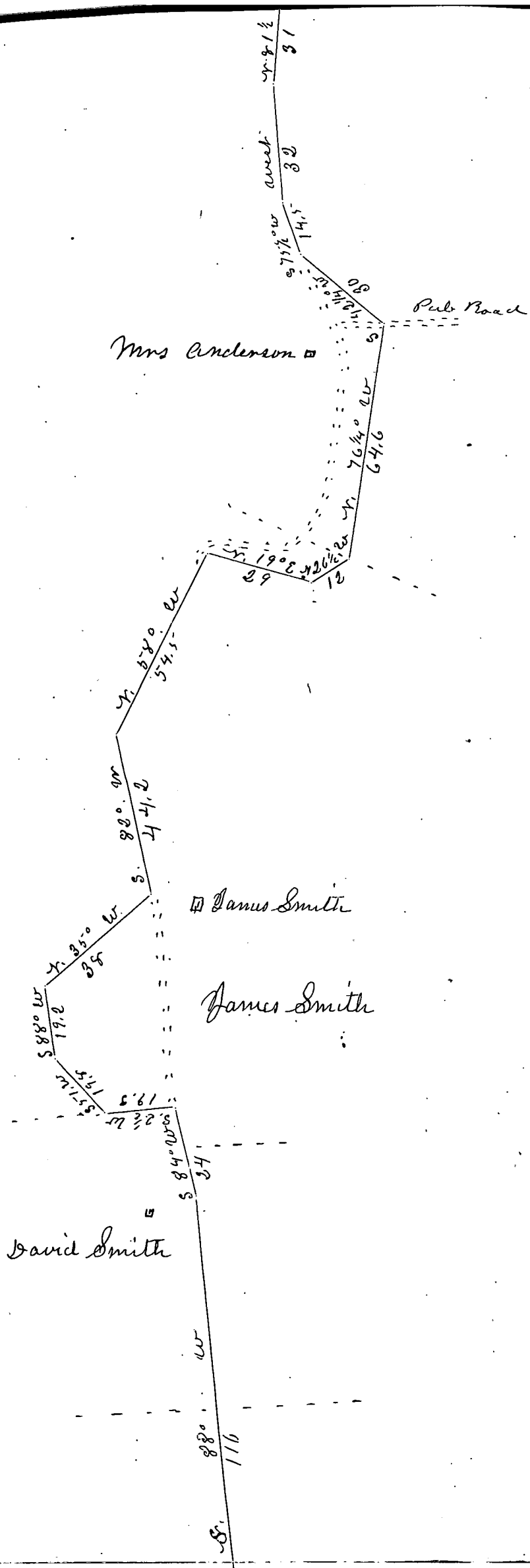
