And therefore praying the Court to appoint proper persons to view and lay out the same, according to law. Whereupon, the Court, upon due consideration had of the premises, do order and appoint

Lewis Boice, John Mcchaffey and Edward King

who, after being respectively sworn or affirmed to perform the duties of their appointment with impartiality and fidelity, are to view the ground proposed for said road; and if any two of them agree that there is ^{vacation and supply of} occasion for such road they shall proceed to lay out the same, as agreeably to the desire of the petitioners as may be, having respect for the best ground for a road, and the shortest distance, in such manner as to do the least injury to private property; and shall make report thereof, stating particularly whether they judge the same necessary for a public or private road, together with a plot or draft thereof, and the courses and distances, with reference to the improvements through which it may pass, to the next Court of Quarter Sessions to be held for said county. In which report they shall state that they have been sworn or affirmed according to law.

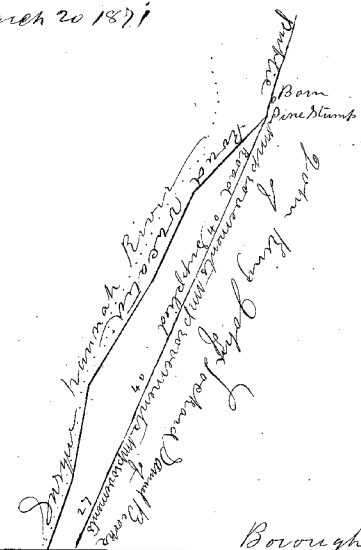
ROAD VIEWER'S REPORT.

CLEARFIELD COUNTY, SS:

At a Court of Quarter Sessions of the Peace of the County of Clearfield, held at Clearfield, in and for said county, on the 17 day of November, A. D., 1870, before the Judges of the said Court, upon the petition of sundry inhabitants of the township of Burnside, in the said county, setting forth that they labor under great inconvenience

To the Honorable the Judges within named
 We the persons appointed by annexed
 Order of court to view and lay out
 the Road therein mentioned do report
 that in pursuance thereof after giving
 due and public notice according to
 law having been duly sworn and affirmed
 all the Viewers appointed by said order
 having viewed the ground proposed for
 the within mentioned road and
 the undersigned Viewers do agree there
 is occasion for a road as desired by the
 petitioners and that the said road is
 necessary for a public road and having
 had respect to the shortest distance
 and best ground for such road we
 have laid it out in such a manner
 as to do the least injury to private property
 and as far as practicable agreeably to the
 desire of the petitioners and do return
 for public use the the following described
 road commencing at a pine stump near
 John Kings Stable or Barn thence south
 twenty four Degrees West through the
 improvements of John King forty perches
 thence the said road course through the
 improvements of John Lockard forty perches
 thence the said road course through the
 improvements of Samuel Brooks twenty
 seven perches to the line of Cherry tree
 Borough intersecting Street
 entire length one hundred and seven perches in
 one direct line a plat or draft whereof is
 herewith annexed which said road do as
 aforesaid vacated and supplied in and of the
 opinion is necessary for a public Road
 and we assessed the damages done to the
 said individuals by the vacating and
 supplying of this Road to be none
 witness our hands & seals

useless inconvenient and burdensome
to the inhabitants thereof on account
of the heavy grade rendering it almost
impossible for loaded wagons.

Your petitioners therefore pray your
Honors to appoint proper persons to
renew and vacate said road and
supply the same by commencing at
or near the house of John King
thence to the Cherrytree Borough line
at or near the house of Thomas Abrien
being a distance of about six hundred
