

MASTER'S REPORT

I

SCHEDULE

1. Complaint in Divorce was filed June 5, 1961.
2. Complaint in Divorce was served on the defendant on June 16, 1961, as evidenced by Affidavit of Service by certified mail attached hereto.
3. On August 3, 1961, Dan P. Arnold, Esquire was appointed Master.
4. The Master's Hearing was fixed for September 7, 1961 at 2:00 o'clock in the office of the Master at 101 S. Second Street, Clearfield, Pennsylvania.
5. Notice of Master's hearing was accepted on behalf of plaintiff on August 9, 1961 as is evidenced by acceptance of service hereto attached.
6. Master's Notice of hearing was served on the defendant Registered Mail, as evidenced by Sheriff's Return attached hereto.
7. Master's hearing was held at the time and place aforesaid, at which time the plaintiff appeared together with her attorney, Morris L. Silberblatt, and a witness, Grace Bell.
8. No appearance was entered of record for the defendant nor did he appear at the hearing.

II

The cause of divorce as stated in the Complaint was desertion for and during the term and space of 29 years.

III

FINDINGS OF FACT

1. Marriage. The plaintiff and defendant were married on July 15, 1930 at Curwensville, Pennsylvania, by A. R. Turner, a Methodist Minister.

2 and 3. Residence and Citizenship. Plaintiff has lived in Clearfield County and the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania her entire lifetime. Plaintiff and defendant were both residents of Curwensville, Pennsylvania prior to their marriage, and after their marriage resided in the Borough of Curwensville, until defendant left the plaintiff at which time she moved to Clearfield, and lived there for approximately 20 years. Plaintiff at the present time is residing in Curwensville, Pennsylvania. Both plaintiff and defendant are citizens of the United States of America.

4. Age and Occupation. The plaintiff is 54 years of age and is an inspector for McGregor Sportswear. The defendant is 52 years of age and is employed as a construction worker.

5. Children. There were two children born to this marriage, Martha Guy, age 31, who is married and living with her husband in Alexandria, Virginia, and William Wise, age 26, who is married and living with his wife in Meshoppen, Pennsylvania.

6. Military Service. The defendant is not now a member of any of the Armed Services of the United States.

7. Findings on the Merits.

(a) Defendant deserted the plaintiff on May 29, 1932 and the parties have not lived or cohabited together since that time.

(b) Defendant has neglected to provide a home for the plaintiff since May 29, 1932 and has made no effort to resume marital relationships with her since that time.

(c) Plaintiff has given the defendant no cause for leaving her and refusing to live with her.

8. Discussion. No discussion is necessary in this case. The defendant deserted the plaintiff on May 29, 1932 without cause and has at no time since then lived with her or made any effort to terminate the desertion by seeking to re-establish a home with his wife. The desertion has continued for more than 29 years.


CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

1. The Court has jurisdiction of the subject matter and of the parties.
2. The proceedings are in accordance with the requirements of law and Rules of Court.
3. The defendant is guilty of wilful and malicious desertion persisted in for 29 years.
4. Plaintiff is the injured and innocent spouse.

RECOMMENDATION

The Master recommends a decree granting the plaintiff an absolute divorce from the bonds of matrimony from the defendant, Melvin Sylvester Wise; a suggested form of decree is herewith respectfully submitted.

3 (a) The defendant is a citizen of the United States of America, and his last known address is 319 S. Reynolds Road, Toledo 14, Ohio. (c/o M & S Erection Co.)
Ramsey known to plaintiff has resided at Toledo, Ohio, for the past 20 years. 7. To this marriage there was born two children, namely, William Wise, a son, age 26, who is married and living with his wife Virginia at Meshoppen, Pa., and a daughter Martha Guy, age 31, who is married and living with her husband, Amerigo, at Alexander, Virginia.

8 That the plaintiff and defendant have entered into no collusive arrangement regarding this action.9 That neither of the parties, plaintiff or defendant, has ever applied in this or any other court for a divorce from the other party to the action, or for annulment of marriage. 



At a Master's Hearing held in the office of Dan P. Arnold at 101 S. Second Street on September 7, 1961 at 2:00 there appeared Arvilla Gertrude Wise, the plaintiff, together with her attorney, Morris L. Silberblatt, and Grace Bell, as witness, The parties being sworn testified as follows:

By Mr. Silberblatt:

Q. Is your name Arvilla Gertrude Wise?

A. That's right.

Q. Were you married to Melvin Sylvester Wise?

A. Yes.

Q. When were you married to him?

A. July 15, 1930.

Q. By whom were you married?

A. Rev. A. R. Turner.

Q. Was he a Methodist minister?

A. Yes.

Q. Were you married at Curwensville?

A. That's right.

Q. At the time of your marriage, where was your home before you were married?

A. In Curwensville.

Q. Where was your husband's home?

A. Curwensville.

Q. After your marriage where did you live?

A. In Curwensville.

Q. Has Curwensville been your home all along?

A. Well up until about 20 years ago.

Q. Twenty years ago, where was your home?

A. In Clearfield.

Q. You moved to Clearfield?

A. Yes.

Q. How long have you lived in Clearfield?

A. About 20 years.

Q. Where are you living at the present time?

A. Curwensville.

Q. In Pike Township?

A. Yes.

Q. Are you living with your sister-in-law, Grace Bell?

A. Yes.

Q. And that is in Pike Township?

A. Yes.

Q. How long have you lived with Grace Bell in Pike Township?

A. Since May of this year.

Q. After you were married, you say you and your husband lived in Curwensville, is that right?

A. Yes.

Q. How long did you live with him until he left you?

A. He left on May 29, 1932.

Q. And at the time he left you you were living in Curwensville, is that right?

A. That's right.

Q. Since he left you has he ever been in touch with you and asked to come back?

A. No.

Q. Did he ever give you any reason why he was leaving you?

A. No, he just walked off.

Q. Did you ever bring a non-support case against him?

A. Yes, I did.

Q. And did you get any money under that order of court?

A. I got \$20 one time before he left.

Q. Did you ever get any money after that?

A. About \$70 I received as an allotment when he was in the Army. He never made but one payment on the support order and other than the money I got as an allotment I never got any other.

Q. The Order of Court was for the support of two children, why was this for the two children and did not include you?

A. I didn't ask for any support, I didn't want any for myself, just for the children.

Q. And all you got out of that as far as he was concerned was one \$20 payment?

A. One monthly payment, \$20.

Q. And then you got an allotment from the government for about a year when he was in the service?

A. Yes.

Q. And outside of that you got nothing more from him?

A. That's right.

Q. You say you were over in Kittanning, do you remember what year that was?

A. No, I don't.

Q. What was that proceeding about?

A. For support, a girl had a child to him.

Q. That was in Armstrong County?

A. Yes.

Q. Were you a witness in that case?

A. Yes.

Q. Outside of that you had nothing to do with that case over there?

A. No.

Q. That was just a case against him for the support of an illegitimate child to a young girl?

A. Yes.

Q. Since the date that your husband left you to the present time did your husband ever ask you to come back to him?

A. No.

Q. Did he ever write to you?

A. He wrote once and asked for a divorce, and I didn't answer the letter.

Q. Then you've never heard anything more from him?

A. No.

Q. As you know we sent a registered letter to him to serve him with this divorce, and this card is the return slip from the post office, and notice the name on there purports to be "Melvin Wise", is that your husband's handwriting?

A. Yes, its his handwriting.

Q. That's his signature?

A. Yes.

By Mr. Silberblatt:

We offer this card, and we also offer into evidence the papers in the case of Commonwealth vs. Melvin Wise, No. 64 September SS, 1932.

Q. Did you ever do anything that caused your husband to leave you?

A. Not that I know of.

Q. Were you a good and dutiful wife?

A. Yes, I was.

Q. Over the period of all these years, have you heard reports about him as to whether he was living with another woman or now?

A. Yes, I have.

Q. But he's never been in touch with you?

A. No.

Q. Is there any agreement between you and your husband to get this divorce?

A. No.

By the Master:

Q. Do you know whether or not your husband's in the military service now?

A. I'm sure he isn't.

Mrs. Grace Bell, being duly sworn according to law, testified as follows:

By Mr. Silberblatt:

Q. Mrs. Bell, are you related to Arvilla Gertrude Wise?

A. I'm her sister-in-law.

Q. Your deceased husband and Mrs. Wise were brother and sister?

A. That's right.

Q. Mrs. Wise testified that her husband left her shortly after they were married, you know of his desertion of her?

A. Yes.

Q. When was that desertion? About when?

A. It was in the spring of 1932.

Q. You know of the fact then that he's been away more than two years?

A. Oh, yes.

Q. And you and Arvilla have been together for the last thirty or thirty-five years?

A. Yes, we've always been friends.

Q. You were very close to each other?

A. Yes.

Q. Do you know whether Melvin Sylvester Wise has lived with Arvilla Gertrude Wise from the time he deserted her?

A. He has not.

Q. Did she give him any cause to leave her?

A. No.

Q. Was she a good and dutiful wife?

A. Yes.

Q. Did she do everything she could to make their married life a happy life?

A. As far as I know, yes.

Q. No reason why he should run away?

A. No.

Q. Do you know if there is any agreement between her and her husband to get this divorce?

A. No, I know it was a surprise to me.

Recall Mrs. Arvilla Gertrude Wise

By Mr. Silberblatt:

Q. Mrs. Wise, how many children were born to this marriage?

A. Three.

Q. And how many are living?

A. Two.

Q. What's the name of the oldest one?

A. Martha Guy, she's living in Virginia.

Q. What is her age?

A. 31.

Q. Is she married?

A. Yes.

Q. What is her husband's name?

A. AMerigo Guy.

Q. Where did you say she lives?

A. Alexandria, Virginia.

Q. She's living with her husband?

A. Yes.

Q. What's the name of the other child, the second one?

A. William Wise.

Q. And how old is he?

A. 26.

Q. Is he married?

A. Yes, he is.

Q. What's his wife's name?

A. Virginia.

Q. Where do they live?

A. Meshoppen, Pa.

Q. The third child died?

A. Yes, when he was about two years old.

Q. What is your age and occupation?

A. I'm 54 and am an inspector at McGregor Sportswear.

Q. What is your husband's age and occupation?

A. He's 52 and I believe he is a construction worker.
