And now, July 28, 1961 at 8.00 P.M. case is called.

Plaintiff appears in person.
Defendant appears in person.

Plaintiff and Defendant sworn according to law. Plaintiff presents bill in the amount of \$16.64. for damages to his automobile when struck by car owned and driven by Defendant.

Defendant admitted that he was responsible for the damages to Plaintiff's car but was unable to pay for it.

Judgment publically proclaimed for the Plaintiff and against the Defendant for the repair bill of \$16.64., Int \$2.50 and costs \$11.00.

And Now Aug. 22, 1961 Execution issued to Alex Campbell, Constable of Sandy Township, Clfd. Co., Pa. For \$16.64, Int \$2.50 and costs of \$11.00.


