ROAD VIEWER'S REPORT.

CLEARFIELD COUNTY, SS:

At a Court of Quarter Sessions of the Peace of the County of Clearfield, held at Clearfield, in and for said county, on the 26th day of September, A. D., 1870, before the Judges of the said Court, upon the petition of sundry inhabitants of the township of Goshen, in the said county, setting forth that they labor under great inconvenience for the want of a road or highway, leading from the Hapes Saw

Mill to the Goshen Church

Report as to damages

And therefore praying the Court to appoint proper persons to view and lay out the same, according to law. Whereupon, the Court, upon due consideration had of the premises, do order and appoint

John D. Bigler Morris L. Wallace Matthew Ogden

who, after being respectively sworn or affirmed to perform the duties of their appointment with impartiality and fidelity, are to view the ground proposed for said road; and if any two of them agree that there is occasion for such road they shall proceed to lay out the same, as agreeably to the desire of the petitioners as may be, having respect for the best ground for a road, and the shortest distance, in such manner as to do the least injury to private property; and shall make report thereof, stating particularly whether they judge the same necessary for a public or private road, together with a plot or darft thereof, and the courses and distances, with reference to the improvements through which it may pass, to the next Court of Quarter Sessions to be held for said county. In which report they shall state that they have been sworn or affirmed according to law.

To the Honorable the Judges of the
Court of Quarter Sessions of Beaverfield Co.

We the undersigned men, appointed
by the above order of Court to view and lay out the
road herein mentioned, respectfully report:

That having given due & public notice, by printed
handbills, according to law of said view, we met
at the time and place appointed for said view, and
having been duly sworn, we examined the location
proposed for said road, and we do now return for
public use the following road to wit: Beginning at
a Willow Oak on the public road near Goben Church,
thence thence to the edge of James Graham's field N.
20° E. 22 perches to land of S. B. Taylor, thence thro
his farm N. 80° E. 48 perches, N. 75° E. 24 perches, North
18° East 18 perches, North 68° East 16 perches, North 21°
East 17 perches, North 4° East 80 perches to wood land,
thence thro' wood land of S. B. Taylor & W^m Maffes,
South 71° East 40 perches, South 88° East 14 perches, South 52°
East 22 perches, North 83° East 12 perches, South 83 $\frac{1}{2}$ ° East
12 perches, North 85° East 8 perches, North 78° East 12 perches,
North 84° East 16 perches, North 62° East 8 perches, North
15° East 28 perches, North 39° West 30 perches, North 50° West
20 perches North 21° West 24 perches, North 88° East 15
perches, North 60° East 21 perches; to saw mill of W^m Maffes,
which road we consider necessary as a public road, along
a plot which is hereto annexed. And we further report
