



the Court of this Commonwealth.


8. The best interest and permanent welfare of the children will be served by granting the relief requested because:

AND NOW comes Petitioner, Teresa L. Haversack, Pro Se, and respectfully files the within Petition for Special Relief and, in support thereof, sets forth as following:

1. Plaintiff/Petitioner, Teresa L. Haversack resides at 1820 Lawrence Avenue, Hyde, Pennsylvania, 16843.
2. Defendant/Respondent, Jaime L. Haversack resides at Douglas Road, New Millport, Pennsylvania, 16861.
3. Defendant/Respondent, Ronald Brady address unknown.
4. The parties are the Maternal Grandmother and Natural Mother and Father of the two minor children: Duane Nevin Brady (DOB 3-6-03) and Damian Michael Brady (DOB 3-17-05).
5. Natural Father has no residence and is currently living on the streets.
6. Mother currently and regularly leaves the minor children with an eleven (11) year old babysitter, Chelsea Winters, to attend bars, namely the Smokehouse, Times Square, and the R Bar.
7. While in the custody of the eleven (11) year old babysitter, the children disappeared for a period of time, ending up at a fishing hole three (3) blocks away and were found and eventually brought back home by a fisherman.
8. During the time they were missing, they were seen playing along side a public

roadway unattended.

9. Mother lives in a two (2) bedroom trailer with the two children and a Pam Winters and her daughter Chelsea.

10. The trailer regularly has no heat or water and there is also live wires hanging from the ceiling.

11. Children are always dirty and not properly dressed.

12. Mother has regular parties at her residence with alcohol beverages while the children are at home.

13. Mother picked up the children from the Children's Aid Society while intoxicated and eventually was pulled over by Lawrence Township Police.

14. Mother is currently under investigation for Welfare Fraud.

15. Mother has been seen on various occasions driving recklessly with the children at the same time the children were not in the proper restraint systems.

15. Petitioner believes that it is in the best interest of the minor children, Duane Nevin Brady and Damian Michael Brady that she be granted sole legal custody and primary physical custody at the present time.

WHEREFORE, Plaintiff/Petitioner, Teresa L. Haversack, respectfully requests this Honorable Court enter an Order:

1. Legal custody shall be shared by mother,
father and grandmother.

Legal custody shall be defined as the legal right
to make major decisions affecting the best interests of the
child, including, but not limited to, medical, religious and
educational decisions, and that each parent shall have equal
access to any and all medical, dental, school and legal
records.

Medical, dental and other professional providers,
as well as school administrations, shall accept a copy of
this Order as authorization to release documentation to
either parent.

It is also understood by both parties that they

shall communicate fully with each other to assure all directives pertaining to the child from physicians, dentists, mental health providers and teachers are followed absolutely and that all information pertaining to any prescriptions, school records and doctor's appointments for the child are exchanged between the parties;

2. In addition to those periods of partial custody that mother and father enjoy as set forth in the Order of June 19, 2008, mother and father shall have partial custody every other Wednesday from 4:00 p.m until 7:00 p.m. on the Wednesday before their weekend partial custody. For the Wednesday visits, the parties shall exchange the children at the Shaw Public Library. Should any party feel that the party obtaining the children has been drinking, they may refuse to permit that party to exercise his/her custody. The person who has been accused of drinking shall be able to undergo testing to determine whether he/she has been drinking. If the tests are negative, then that party shall be able to resume his/her period of custody;

3. The parties shall share Thanksgiving and Christmas as follows:

a) Thanksgiving: Mother and father shall share the Thanksgiving holiday. The parties shall receive the children from grandmother at 10:00 a.m. on Thanksgiving Day. Mother and father shall meet at 4:00 p.m. on the Friday after

Thanksgiving at Children, Youth & Family Services, and the party who is to have the custody on the following weekend shall obtain custody of the children;

b) Christmas: Grandmother shall have the children from December 23rd at 4:00 p.m. until December 24th at 7:00 p.m., at which time the children shall be returned to father. Father shall have custody of the children from December 24th at 7:00 p.m. until December 25th at 2:00 p.m. Mother shall have custody of the children on December 25th at 2:00 p.m. until December 26th at 7:00 p.m., or as the parties may agree;

4. Neither party shall malign or speak in a derogatory fashion about the other party in the presence of the children nor will he or she permit anyone else to do so. Each party will exercise his or her best efforts to promote a healthy relationship between the children and the other parent and the parent's family. The parties are directed to conduct themselves in a reasonable and appropriate manner at all times during their interactions with each other and their family members concerning custody of the children and issues relating to the children's care and nurturance;

5. Should grandmother find that she is unable to be with the children for a period in excess of two (2) hours, she shall phone mother or father to serve as caretaker during that time period;

6. The noncustodial parent shall have reasonable telephone contact with the minor children, which means up to three (3) telephone calls per week, provided the same is made by no later than 8:00 p.m.;

7. A mediation conference shall be scheduled for March 4, 2009, at 9:00 a.m.

O R D E R

AND NOW this 4th day of March, 2009, following mediation conference, it is the ORDER of this Court as follows:

1. Jamie L. Haversack (hereinafter "Mother"), and Defendant, (Ronald Brady) (hereinafter "Father"), shall have joint legal custody of the parties' minor children, namely, Duane Nevon Brady (DOB 3/6/03), and Damien Michael Brady (DOB 3/17/05).

Legal custody is defined as the legal right to make major decisions affecting the best interests of the minor children including, but not limited to, medical, religious and educational decisions and wherein each parent shall have equal access to any and all medical, dental, ocular, mental health, school and health records.

Medical, dental, ocular and mental health providers, as well as school administrators, shall accept a copy of this Order as authorization to release to either parent any documentation and/or records as may be requested.

It is understood by both parents that they shall communicate fully with the other in an effort to ensure that all directives pertaining to the minor children from physicians, dentists and teachers are followed absolutely and that all information pertaining to any prescriptions the children may be on is exchanged between the parties.

2. Father shall enjoy primary physical custody of their minor children subject to periods of partial custody in Mother as follows:

A) Every other weekend from Friday at 4:00 p.m., continuing until Sunday at 5:00 p.m;

B) Every other Wednesday from 4:00 p.m. until 7:00 p.m;

C) Mother's periods of partial custody shall commence the weekend following her release from the Clearfield County Jail;

D) In the event that either parent shall be unavailable for his/her period of physical custody, the other parent shall have the right of first refusal to care for the children during such period.

3. Maternal Grandmother, Teresa L. Haversack,

(hereinafter "Grandmother"), shall have partial custody as follows:

A) One (1) weekend per month, with said weekend to be agreed by the parties;

B) One (1) evening per week from 4:00 p.m. until 7:00 p.m., with said evening to be agreed by the parties.

4. Holidays: The parties shall share major holidays as follows:

A) Easter: In even-numbered years, Mother shall have custody from the Saturday preceding Easter at 4:00 p.m. until Easter Sunday at 2:00 p.m. Father shall have custody from 2:00 p.m. on Easter Sunday until Easter Monday at 6:00 p.m. provided there is no school on Easter Monday. In the event the children have school on Easter Monday, custody shall be until 8:00 p.m. on Easter Sunday.

In odd-numbered years, Father shall have custody for the Saturday preceding Easter at 4:00 p.m. until Easter Sunday at 2:00 p.m. Mother shall have custody from 2:00 p.m. on Easter Sunday until Easter Monday at 6:00 p.m. provided there is no school on Easter Monday. In the event the children have school on Easter Monday, custody shall be until 8:00 p.m. on Easter Sunday;

B) Thanksgiving: Mother shall have the children from the day before Thanksgiving at 6:00 p.m. until

Thanksgiving Day at 2:00 p.m., at which time Father shall have the children.

C) Christmas: In 2009, Grandmother shall have the children from December 23rd at 4:00 p.m. until December 24th at 7:00 p.m., at which time mother shall have custody of the children from December 24th at 7:00 p.m. until December 25th at 2:00 p.m. Father shall have the children from 2:00 p.m. on December 25th until 7:00 p.m. on December 26th.

In subsequent years, Christmas shall be shared as above except that in 2010 Mother shall have the children from December 23rd at 4:00 p.m. until December 24th at 7:00 p.m., and Father shall have the children from December 24th at 7:00 p.m. until December 25th at 2:00 p.m., with Grandmother having the children from December 25th at 2:00 p.m. until December 26th at 7:00 p.m.

In 2011, the rotation shall begin, with Father having the children from December 23rd at 4:00 p.m. until December 24th at 7:00 p.m. Grandmother shall have the children on December 24th at 7:00 p.m. until December 25th at 2:00 p.m., and Mother shall have the children from December 25th at 2:00 p.m. until December 26th at 7:00 p.m.

This Christmas schedule shall continue to rotate as above;

D) Minor Holidays: Mother shall have the children on Mother's Day. Father shall have the children on

Father's Day. All other holidays shall be shared equitably between the parents;

E) Each parent shall have the children on or near the date of their birthdays to celebrate the same, as they may agree;

F) The parents will cooperate to ensure that Grandmother is afforded additional periods of visitation/partial custody, as agreed. All periods of partial custody may be varied, as the parties may agree.

5. Unless otherwise agreed by the parties, the parties shall share transportation in that the party who is to obtain custody of the children shall provide transportation. This may be the parent, or that parent's adult designee(s), with the designee being required to have an established relationship with the children.

6. During the periods of their partial custody with the minor children, the parties shall not consume alcohol prior to or during their periods of partial custody, nor shall they permit anyone else to consume alcoholic beverages in their residences, nor shall the children be transported when the parties have consumed any alcoholic beverages. Should any party test positive for having alcohol in their system when they are exercising their period of custody, their period of custody shall be forfeited.

7. Neither party shall malign or speak in a

derogatory fashion about the other parent in the presence of the children, nor shall they permit anyone else to do so. Each parent shall exercise his/her best efforts to promote a healthy relationship between the children and the other parent and the other parent's family.

The parents are directed to conduct themselves in a reasonable and appropriate manner at all times during their interactions with each other and their family members concerning custody of the children and issues relating to the children care and nurturance, including the duty to immediately contact the other parent should the minor children have a serious injury or illness which requires medical attention. In addition, both Mother and Father shall communicate with each other with regard to the well-being and best interests of their children and shall not communicate through the children.

In addition, each parent shall keep the other informed of the progress of the children education and social activities.

8. Neither party shall restrict telephone contact between the children and the parent not in possession of the children. The parent who is not in possession of the children may have reasonable telephone contact with the children.


9. Mother shall complete drug and alcohol

counseling, participate in Alcoholics Anonymous, and complete parenting classes through the Nurturing Program.

10. Both parents shall provide the children with a safe and habitable home.

11. Clearfield County Children, Youth and Family Services is hereby permitted to close their file on this case, although the case may be re-opened at any time upon proper cause.
