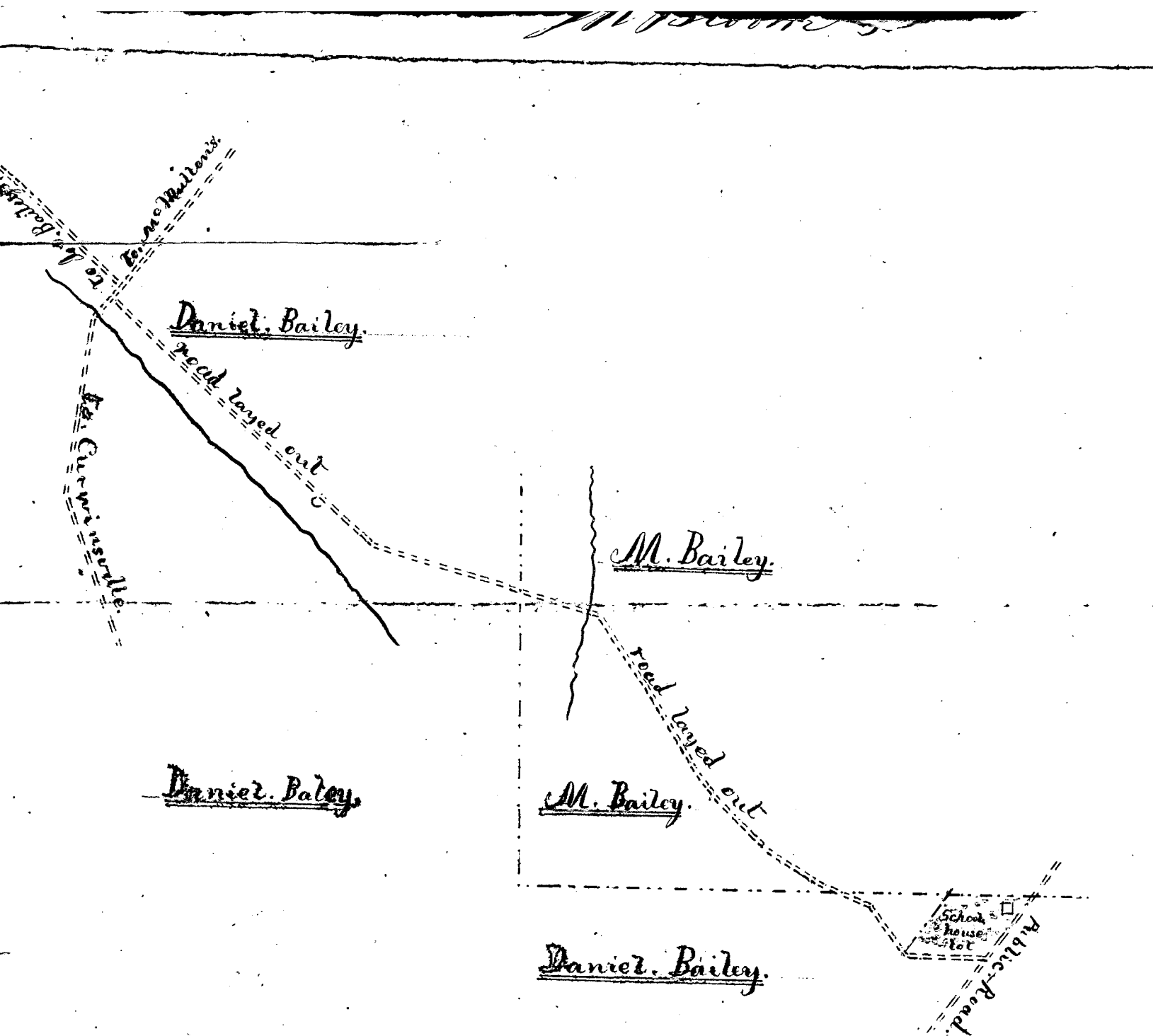

ROAD VIEWER'S REPORT.

CLEARFIELD COUNTY, SS:

At a Court of Quarter Sessions of the Peace of the County of Clearfield, held at Clearfield, in and for said county, on the 21st day of March, A. D., 1870, before the Judges of the said Court, upon the petition of sundry inhabitants of the township of Adre, in the said county, setting forth that they labor under great inconvenience for the want of a road or highway, leading from Adre

To the Honorable the Judges of the Court of Quarter Sessions of the Peace in and for the County of Clearfield We the persons appointed by the annexed order of Court to view and lay out the road therein mentioned do report, That after giving due public notice of the time and place of meeting we met agreeably thereto on the 18th day of May A.D 1870 and after being duly sworn according to law we viewed the ground proposed for said road and all agreed that there is occasion for such road and proceeded to lay out and do now return for Public use the following road, to wit - Beginning near the Public road leading to Joseph Bailey's, Thence S. 46 $\frac{1}{4}$ E 51 Per. Thence S. 73. E 35 Per. Thence S. 35 $\frac{3}{4}$ E 12.5 Per. Thence S. 30. E. 12.7 Per. Thence S. 38 $\frac{1}{2}$ E 5.2 Per. Thence S. 45 $\frac{1}{4}$ E 10.2 Per. Thence S. 57. E. 9 Per. Thence S. 64. E. 7.2 Per. Thence S. 36. E. 17.9 Per. to South West corner of Pleasant Grove School House lot Thence by said lot S. 87. E 12.5 to Public road at South East corner of said lot, The above described layed out road passes ~~through~~ Clearance land of Daniel Bailey 51 Per. on old road 30 per. and through woodland the rest of the way. And two of us would also further report that we have assessed the damages to owners of property which would be caused by the making of the above road as follows To wit To Daniel Bailey Forty-two dollars & fifty cents

Confirmed M. & the Road to be
33 feet Wide Except Sidehill Digging and
bridging there to be 16 feet Wide

By the Court

Sept. 26, 1870. Daniel Bailey one of the
Citizens of Pike Township through whose
land the within road passes. makes the
following objections to the absolute
confirmation of said road near.

1st The road is located in such a
way that it greatly damages the said
Daniel Bailey.

2nd The said Bailey avers that the said
road can be located on better ground
which the said Bailey is agreed to throw open
for the purpose of a road.

3rd The amt. of damages allowed
by the viewers is insufficient to furnish
material for fencing, without allowing any
damage for the land & putting up said fence

Pleasant Grove School
House to intersect the Public Road leading
to Joseph Bailey's.

Report as to damages &c.

And therefore praying the Court to appoint proper persons to view and lay out the same, according to law. Whereupon, the Court, upon due consideration had of the premises, do order and appoint
Mr. Mitchell, Mr. Hancock & J. Robt Bloom

who, after being respectively sworn or affirmed to perform the duties of their appointment with impartiality and fidelity, are to view the ground proposed for said road; and if any two of them agree that there is occasion for such road they shall proceed to lay out the same, as agreeably to the desire of the petitioners as may be, having respect for the best ground for a road, and the shortest distance, in such manner as to do the least injury to private property; and shall make report thereof, stating particularly whether they judge the same necessary for a public or private road, together with a plot or draft thereof, and the courses and distances, with reference to the improvements through which it may pass, to the next Court of Quarter Sessions to be held for said county. In which report they shall state that they have been sworn or affirmed according to law.
