We the undersigned persons Appointed by the within Order of Court, to view, and vacate the Road therein mentioned, Respectfully Report, That having giving notice of the time and place of the view, of the Road, according to the Act of Assembly, And having all been present, at the time of the view, And having all been first severally sworn or affirmed in pursuance of said Order. We have viewed the said Road. And we are of opinion that the following Road is Burthensome, And not necessary for a public or private Road And therefore declare the same vacant - viz. Beginning at the public Road near David Browns, Thence through Land belonging to David Brown, Philip Long, John Owens, Jacob Bitter & Others, South twenty five degrees west - Seventeen and five tenths perches, South two and a half degrees west - thirty four perches, South thirty five degrees west - Eight perches - South forty seven & a quarter degrees west - Twenty perches ~~South twenty nine degrees west - ten & five tenths perches. South fifty~~ Seven degrees west - Eight perches. South forty Eight & One half degrees west - Twenty nine perches, South twenty seven and a half degrees west - Twenty three perches - South Eighteen degrees west Twenty seven & three tenths perches - South Seven and a quarter degrees East - Twenty three & seven tenths perches, South Ten & one half degrees west - Sixty four and three tenths ~~perches~~ - South nine and one half degrees East - fourteen & three tenths perches - South twenty two & three quarter degrees East - Nineteen and eight tenths perches, South. Thirteen & three tenths perches, South twenty one & a quarter degrees East - Twenty one & seven tenths perches, South ten & one half degrees East Six perches to the public Road at Forrest's Shanty. ROAD VIEWER'S REPORT.

CLEARFIELD COUNTY, SS:

At a Court of Quarter Sessions of the Peace of the County of Clearfield, held at Clearfield, in and for said county, on the 6th day of June, A. D., 1870, before the Judges of the said Court, upon the petition of sundry inhabitants of the township of Pike, in the said county, setting forth that they ^{are greatly Burthened} labor under great inconvenience ^{with a certain public} for the want of a road or highway, leading from

The Public Road near the
Barn of David Brown's to Forest's Shanty

And therefore praying the Court to appoint proper persons to view and ^{vacate} ~~lay out~~ the same, according to law. Whereupon, the Court, upon due consideration had of the premises, do order and appoint

S. H. M. Clokey, David Brown & Harnon F. Rowley

who, after being respectively sworn or affirmed to perform the duties of their appointment with impartiality and fidelity, are to view the ground proposed for ^{vacation of said} road; and if any two of them agree that there is ^{no} occasion for such road they shall proceed to ^{vacate} ~~lay out~~ the same, as agreeably to the desire of the petitioners as may be, (having respect for the best ground for a road, and the

shortest distance, in such manner as to do the least injury to private property; and shall make report thereof, stating particularly whether they judge the same necessary for a public or private road, together with a plot or draft thereof, and the courses and distances, with reference to the improvements through which it may pass, to the next Court of Quarter Sessions to be held for said county. In which report they shall state that they have been sworn or affirmed according to law.
