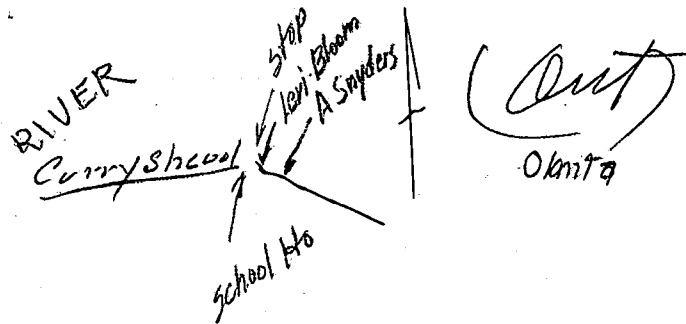

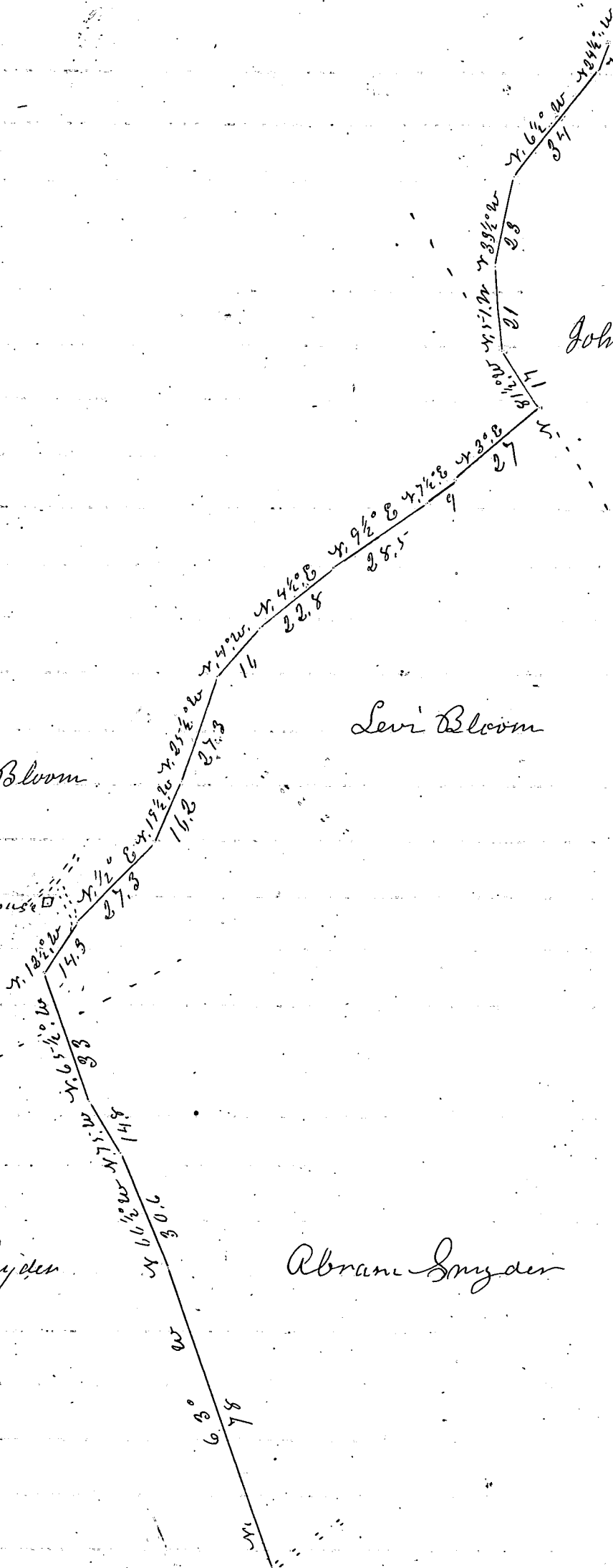

ROAD VIEWER'S REPORT.

CLEARFIELD COUNTY, SS:

At a Court of Quarter Sessions of the Peace of the County of Clearfield, held at Clearfield, in and for said county, on the 6th day of June, A. D., 1870, before the Judges of the said Court, upon the petition of sundry inhabitants of the township of Pike, in the said county, setting forth that they ^{are greatly burthened} ~~labor~~ under great inconvenience ^{with a public} ~~for the want of~~ a road or highway, leading from

The Curry Farms to

William Prices Line

And therefore praying the Court to appoint proper persons to view and ^{vacate} ~~lay out~~ the same, according to law. Whereupon, the Court, upon due consideration had of the premises, do order and appoint

Saml. F. McCloskey, David Brown and John Owens

who, after being respectively sworn or affirmed to perform the duties of their appointment with impartiality and fidelity, are to view the ground proposed for said road; and if any two of them agree that there is ^{no} occasion for such road they shall proceed to ^{vacate} ~~lay out~~ the same, as agreeably to the desire of the petitioners as may be, having respect for the best ground for a road, and the shortest distance, in such manner as to do the least injury to private property; and shall make report thereof, stating particularly whether they judge the same necessary for a public or private road, together with a plot or draft thereof, and the courses and distances, with reference to the improvements through which it may pass, to the next Court of Quarter Sessions to be held for said county. In which report they shall state that they have been sworn or affirmed according to law.

of the time, and place of the view of the said Road, according
to the Act of Assembly, and having all been present at the view
of the Road proposed to be vacated, and having all been first severally
sworn or affirmed in pursuance of said Order. We have viewed
the following Road, and that part of said Road, as shown by the
red lines on the annexed Draft: We are of opinion is necessary
for a Public Road, viz. Beginning at the Public Road on the
Curry farm, Thence through said farm, (now owned by Abram
Snyder) North Sixty three Degrees west, Seventy Eight perches.
North Sixty six and a half Degree west, thirty and six tenths
perches. North Seventy five Degrees west, fourteen and eight
tenths perches. North Sixty five and a half Degrees west
Still through Snyder's, and land of Levi Bloom, Thirty three
perches. North twelve and a half Degrees west, fourteen and
three tenths perches to the School House, and all the following Road
from the said School House, as shown by the Black lines
on the annexed Draft - viz. North one half a Degree East twenty
Seven and three tenths perches, Thence still through land of Levi
Bloom, North nineteen and a half Degrees, west, sixteen and two
tenths perches, North twenty five and a half Degrees, west, twenty seven
and three tenths perches. North four Degrees west, fifteen perches
