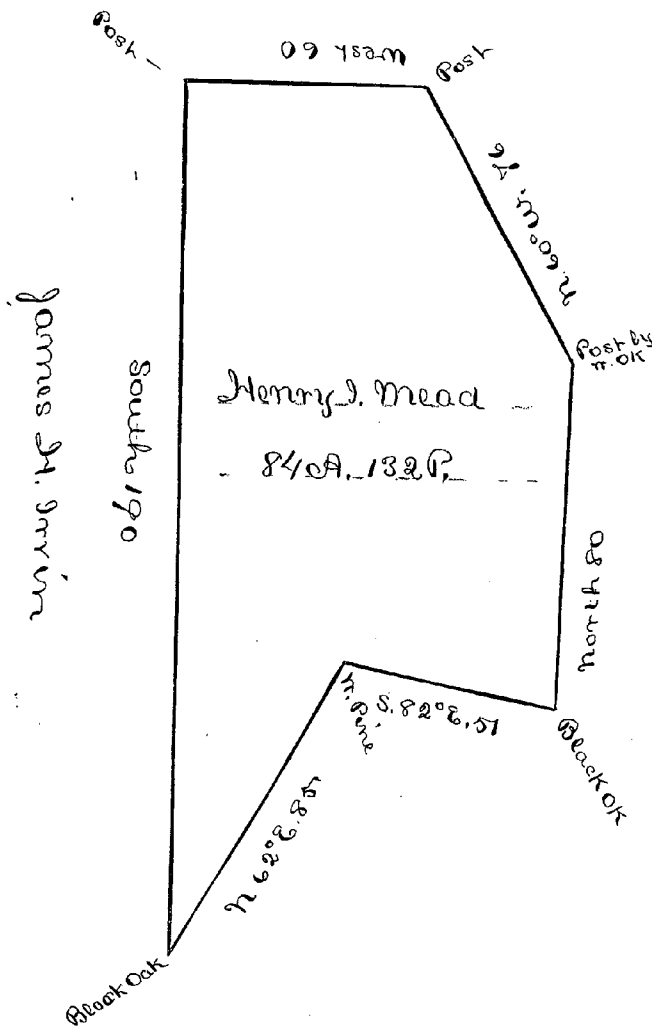
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To the Honorable the Judges of the Court of

ROAD VIEWER'S REPORT.

CLEARFIELD COUNTY, SS:

At a Court of Quarter Sessions of the Peace of the County of Clearfield, held at Clearfield, in and for said county, on the 20 day of March, A. D., 1871, before the Judges of the said Court, upon the petition of ^{Henry I Mead} ~~and sundry~~ inhabitants of the township of Lawrence, in the said county, setting forth that ~~they~~ ^{he} labor under great inconvenience for the want of a ~~road or highway~~, leading from Convenient School House in which to send his children to school and asking to ~~have~~ have his farm annexed to Goshen Township for school purposes and to remain in Lawrence for all other purposes.

And therefore praying the Court to appoint proper persons to view and ~~lay out~~ ^{Report the} the same, according to the act of assembly approved 13 April 1867 and its supplements to law. Whereupon, the Court, upon due consideration had of the premises, do order and appoint

John Sankey, Wm. Mapes and Lewis Irwin

who, after being respectively sworn or affirmed to perform the duties of their appointment with impartiality and fidelity, are to view the ground proposed for said ~~road~~ ^{annexation}; and if any two of them agree that there is occasion for such ~~road~~ ^{annexation} they shall proceed to ~~lay out~~ ^{Report} the same, as agreeably to the desire of the petitioners, as may be, having respect for the best ~~ground~~ ^{interest of the community} for a road, and the ~~shortest distance, in such manner as to do the least injury to~~ ^{together with a plot or draft thereof} private property; and shall make report thereof, stating particularly whether they judge the same necessary for a public or private road, together with a plot or draft thereof, and the courses and distances, with reference to the improvements through which it may pass, to the next Court of Quarter Sessions to be held for said county. In which report they shall state that they have been sworn or affirmed according to law.
