ROAD VIEWER'S REPORT.

CLARKE COUNTY SS:

At a Court of Quarter Sessions of the Peace of the County of Clearfield, held at Clearfield, in and for said county, on the 9 day of June, A. D. 1877, before the Judges of the said Court, upon the petition of sundry inhabitants of the township of Pike, in the said county, setting forth that they labor under great inconvenience for the want of a road or highway, leading from Independant School District bounded as follows —

Commencing at corner of A. Holden & S. Bloom Est, thence by line of Blooms Est, to R. Hancock land, thence S. E. to M. Bailey land, thence West along J. Hartshorn land In^o Stage & H. Hockman to Robt. Neepes thence S. by Neepes, Irwin & Bidger land to creek thence S. W. by land of Spencer Est, J. B. Smith, Milton McClure and M. S. Bloom — S. E. along Henry Hile & Metter Price to river thence across the river along lands of James A. Bloom East to the beginning —

And therefore praying the Court to appoint proper persons to view and lay out the same, according to law. Whereupon, the Court, upon due consideration had of the premises, do order and appoint

Daniel Faust, H. B. Thompson & Geo. Ben. Hartshorn — who, after being respectively sworn or affirmed to perform the duties of their appointment with impartiality and fidelity, are to view the ground proposed for said ^{District} road; and if any two of them agree that there is occasion for such ^{District} road, they shall proceed to lay out the same, as agreeably to the desire of the petitioners as may be, having respect ^{for the interest of the tax payer of said Tp. and interest of said petitioners} for the best ground for a road, and the shortest distance, in such manner as to do the least injury to private property; and shall make report thereof, stating particularly whether they judge the same necessary for a ^{Independant School District} public or private road, together with a plot or draft thereof, and the courses and distances, with reference to the improvements through which it may pass, to the next Court of Quarter Sessions to be held for said county. In which report they shall state that they have been sworn or affirmed according to law.

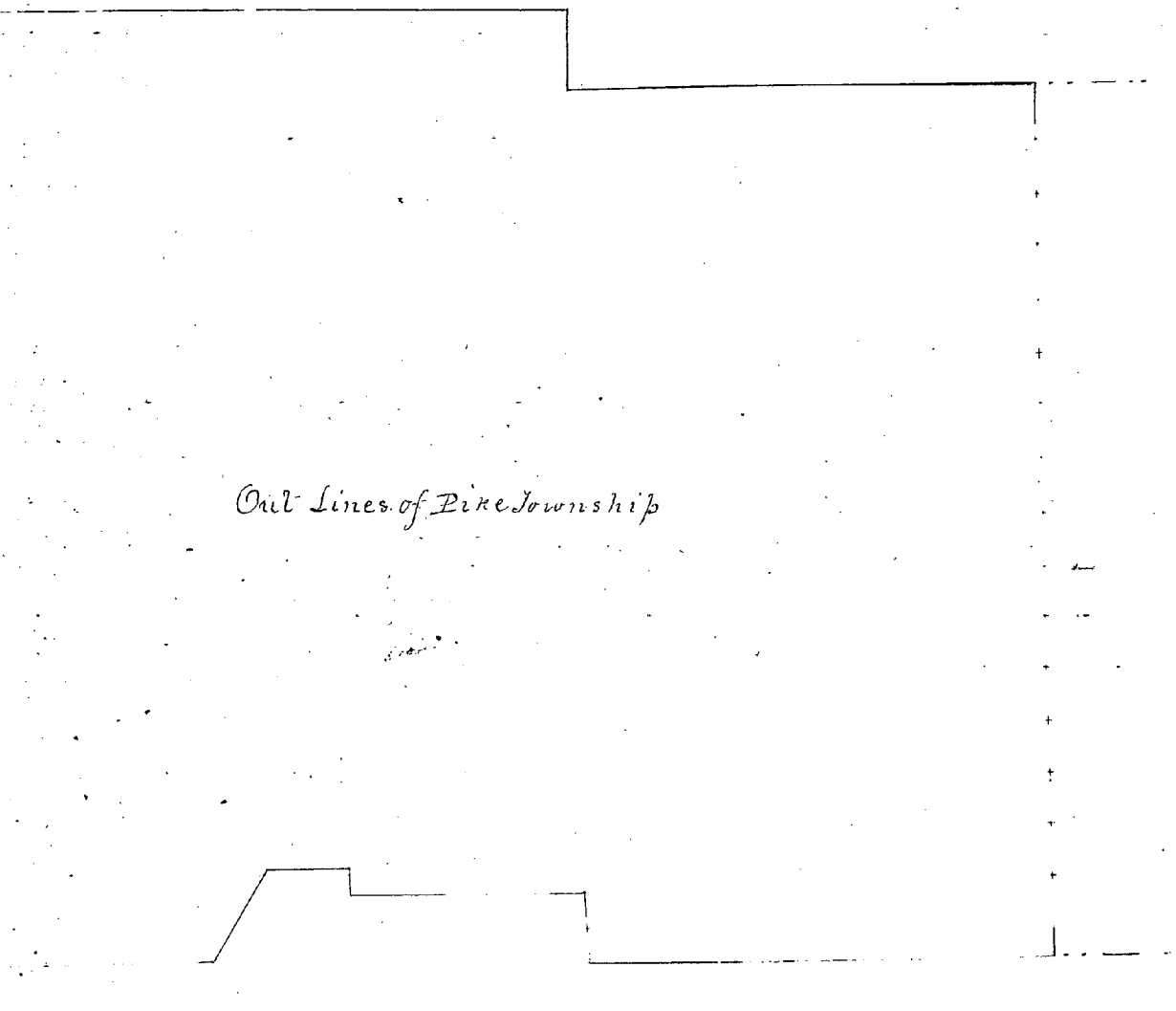

Jno Stage and H. Hockman to R. Meper thence south
by Meper Irwin and Bilger land to Creek thence south

McClure, and Mrs. D. Bloom. South East along Henry
Kilo and Milton Price, to river thence along
river to place of beginning, being the same
bounds set forth in the petition of the
applicants; According to which bounds,

expedient to establish such independent
school districts and the Commissioners return
herewith a plot or draft of said township
of Pike and the lines of the proposed new district.

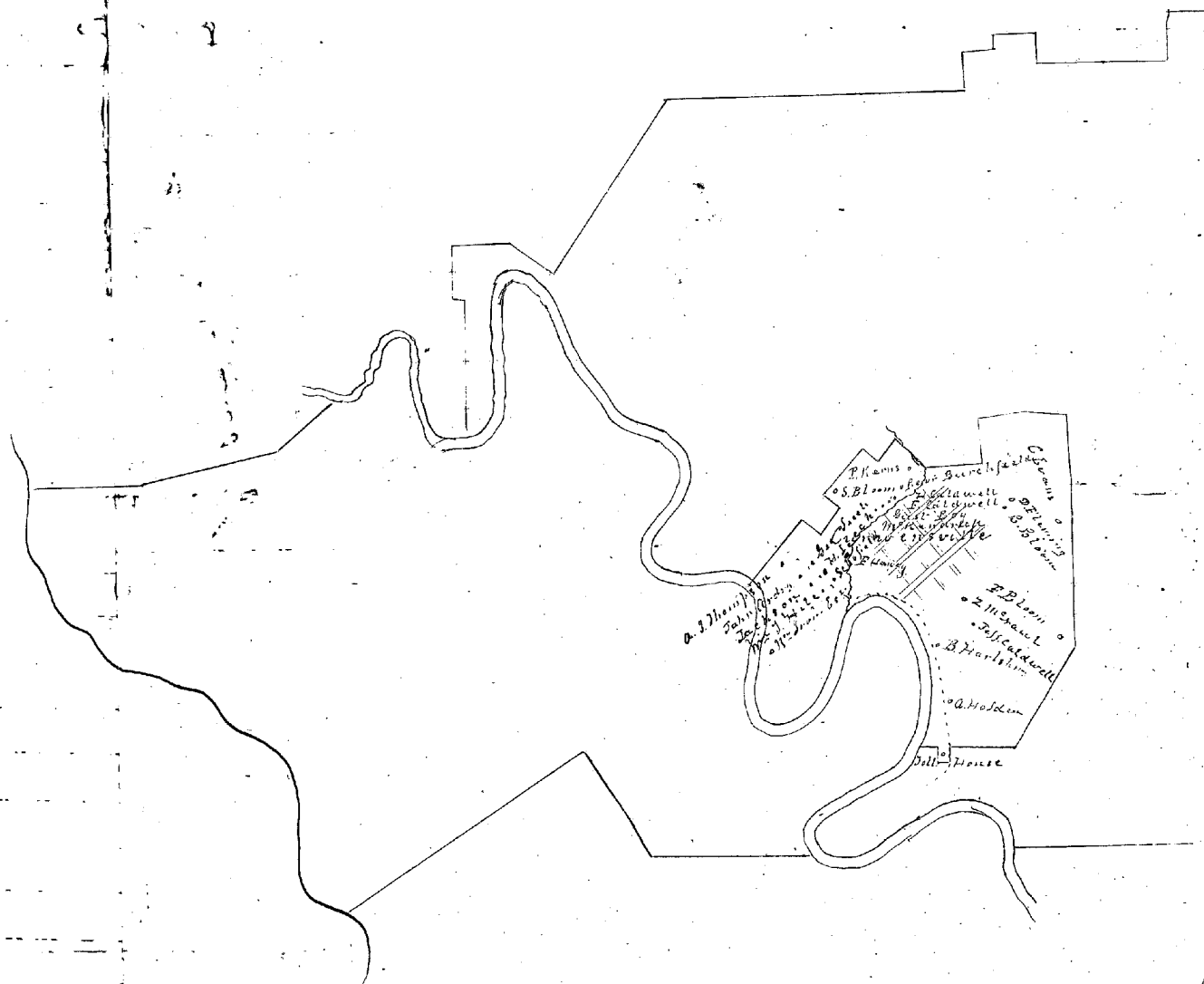

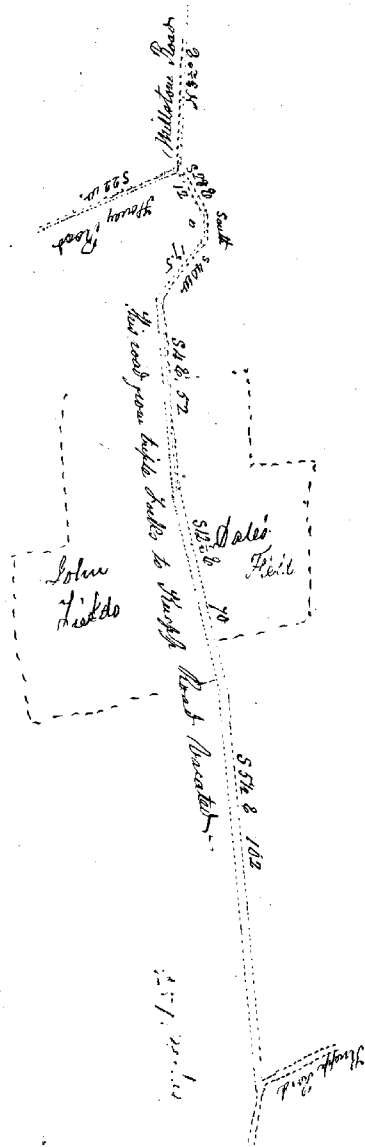

To the Honorable the Judges of the Court of Quarter Sessions of the County of
 Shropshire now holding a General Court of Quarter Sessions of the Peace in and for
 the County aforesaid June Sessions 1845

The undersigned persons appointed to view and vacate the road
 from the old Millstone hollow to the Knapp road Report as by order heretofore
 assigned they are required, that having first given due and timely notice by printed
 and written advertisements, duly posted in public places for more than five days of the
 time and place of meeting, met at the road proposed to be vacated at the site of
 the Mill Stone school house and having been first duly sworn or affirmed, viewed
 the road proposed to be vacated, and beginning at the Philipshugh Brauch, thence
 South twenty eight degrees East, twelve perches, South six perches, South forty
 degrees East seventeen and one half perches, South four degrees East, fifty two perches,
 South twelve and one half degrees East between Dale's fields, twenty perches, South five and one half
 degrees East at one hundred and two perches to Knapp & Knapp's road. Which road
 we recommend to be vacated, as soon as the road from St. George's Lane to the
 Bald Hill road is opened. All which is respectfully submitted
