To the Honorable the Judges of the Court of Quarter Sessions of the Peace in and for Chesterfield County.

The Petition of the undersigned citizens of Lawrence Township in said County.

Respectfully Represent.

That a road has lately been laid out leading from near the house of Mr. Moses Fulton, in Lawrence Township, to the Mouth of Lick Run, in said Township, which they are given to understand will be very expensive to make, and a portion of it very dangerous to travel when made, and which increases the distance between said points, about one and one half miles - and as your petitioners believe a new route for a road from the mouth of Wolf Run to Lick Run, is necessary, and can be found and made at one tenth of the expense required for the construction of the road lately laid out, they respectfully ask that a Re-viewer of the Road between the Mouth of Wolf Run Bridge to Lick Run be granted & that the Court appoint proper persons to Re-examine and lay out the same - and that the Re-viewers be required to show the several distances, grade and probable expense of opening and preparing the road from Wolf Run Bridge to Lick Run by the route lately laid out - as well as the road now applied for should a suitable route be found by the Re-viewers so as to guide the Court in a final decision in the matter and they will pray &c -

ROAD VIEWER'S REPORT.

CLEARFIELD COUNTY SS:

At a Court of Quarter Sessions of the Peace of the County of Clearfield, held at Clearfield, in and for said county, on the 21st day of March, A. D. 1871, before the Judges of the said Court, upon the petition of sundry inhabitants of the township of Lawrence, in the said county, setting forth that they labor under great inconvenience

Report as to damages

And therefore praying the Court to appoint proper persons to view and lay out the same, according to law. Whereupon, the Court, upon due consideration had of the premises, do order and appoint

John S. Cuttle, John Dougherty and J. Wrigley who, after being respectively sworn or affirmed to perform the duties of their appointment with impartiality and fidelity, are to view the ground proposed for said road; and if any two of them agree that there is occasion for such road, they shall proceed to lay out the same, as agreeably to the desire of the petitioners as may be, having respect for the best ground for a road, and the shortest distance, in such manner as to do the least injury to private property; and shall make report thereof, stating particularly whether they judge the same necessary for a public or private road, together with a plot or draft thereof, and the courses and distances, with reference to the improvements through which it may pass, to the next Court of Quarter Sessions to be held for said county. In which report they shall state that they have been sworn or affirmed according to law.
