To the Honorable the judges of the Court of
Quarter Sessions of Clearfield County:-

The petition of Henry I. Mead respectfully represents, That he is a resident and tax payer in the township of Lawrence, in said county, and that the school house to which he must send his children is distant about two miles from his residence and that the public road leading to it from his premises, is located in a very exposed situation, so as to be extremely cold and disagreeable for children to travel during the winter, being also frequently obstructed by drifting snow, and that he is thereby, in the main, denied of the advantages of public schools; he therefore desires his land to be annexed to and included in Goshen township district for educational purposes, and that he shall remain in said township of Lawrence for all other purposes.

Wherefore, he prays the Court to appoint him and to proceed under Act of Assembly approved, 18th day April, 1867, and the acts to which the same is a supplement, and report to the Court with regard to the propriety of granting the prayer of said petition, and he will ever pray &c.
