where is made such road, they shall proceed to lay out the same, as agreeably to the desire of the petitioners as may be, having respect for the best ground for a road, and the shortest distance, in such manner as to do the least injury to private property; and shall make report thereof, stating particularly whether they judge the same necessary for a public or private road, together with a plot or draft thereof, and the courses and distances, with reference to the improvements through which it may pass, to the next Court of Quarter Sessions to be held for said county. In which report they shall state that they have been sworn or affirmed according to law.



to a post, thence South 89 $\frac{1}{2}$ ° East forty four  
perches to a stone, thence South 1° West four-  
teen perches to post, thence South 88° East  
eighty two perches to Utashville road
