ROAD VIEWER'S REPORT.

CLEARFIELD COUNTY, SS:

At a Court of Quarter Sessions of the Peace of the County of Clearfield, held at Clearfield, in and for said county, on the 13 day of January, A. D., 1871, before the Judges of the said Court, upon the petition of sundry inhabitants of the townships of Bell & Furgerson, in the said county, setting forth that they labor under great inconvenience for the want of a road or highway, leading from

at or near John R. Bells
in Bell Township to at or near John Snyder's
place in Furgerson Township

"Report as to damages"

And therefore praying the Court to appoint proper persons to view and lay out the same, according to law. Whereupon, the Court, upon due consideration had of the premises, do order and appoint

Thos. R. Moore, John S. Straw and John Swan Sr.,

who, after being respectively sworn or affirmed to perform the duties of their appointment with impartiality and fidelity, are to view the ground proposed for said road; and if any two of them agree that there is occasion for such road they shall proceed to lay out the same, as agreeably to the desire of the petitioners as may be, having respect for the best ground for a road, and the

shortest distance, in such manner as to do the least injury to private property; and shall make report thereof, stating particularly whether they judge the same necessary for a public or private road, together with a plot or draft thereof, and the courses and distances, with reference to the improvements through which it may pass, to the next Court of Quarter Sessions to be held for said county. In which report they shall state that they have been sworn or affirmed according to law.

mentioned do report that in pursuance thereof
after having given more than five days notice
of the time and place of meeting, we all met
and after being first duly Affirmed according
to Law in pursuance of the above Order we have
viewed laid out and adjudged necessary for
Public use the following Road Viz
