

TO THE HONORABLE JOHN J. PENTZ, PRESIDENT JUDGE OF SAID COURT:

Pearl Dotts, Plaintiff, brings this action in divorce against Henry Dotts, Jr., otherwise Harry Dotts, Jr., Defendant, upon a cause of action whereof the following is the Complaint:

1. The plaintiff is Pearl Dotts and the Defendant is Henry Dotts, Jr., otherwise Harry Dotts, Jr.

2. The plaintiff's residence is Irvona, R.D., Pennsylvania.

3. The defendant's last known residence is Lamar, South Carolina.

4. The plaintiff has been a citizen of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, and has resided therein for a period of one whole year and upwards previous to the filing of this Complaint.

5. The plaintiff, Pearl Dotts, and the defendant, Henry Dotts, Jr., otherwise Harry Dotts, Jr., were married on the 22nd day of June, 1922, in the Borough of Ebensburg, County of Cambria and State of Pennsylvania, by Rev. John R. Thomas of the Congregational Church.

6. The plaintiff avers that in violation of the defendant's marriage vows and the laws of this Commonwealth, the said Henry Dotts, Jr., otherwise Harry Dotts, Jr., did on or about the 7th day of April, 1937, contract a marriage with Catherine Smeal in the Borough of Hollidaysburg, Blair County, Pennsylvania, without the benefit of obtaining a divorce from the bonds of matrimony contracted between the plaintiff and defendant as above stated, and the plaintiff above named was living at the time of the second marriage to Catherine Smeal.

7. A prior action of divorce was brought by the Plaintiff in Cambria County to No. \_\_\_\_ June Term, 1958 against the Defendant, Henry Dotts, Jr., otherwise Harry Dotts, Jr., but the same was discontinued by the Plaintiff due to lack of jurisdiction in the Court of Common Pleas of Cambria County, Pennsylvania.

8. This Complaint is not made out of levity or by collusion between Pearl Dotts, plaintiff and Henry Dotts, Jr., otherwise Harry Dotts, Jr.

WHEREFORE, the Plaintiff prays that she be freed and separated from the bonds of matrimony heretofore contracted between the said Plaintiff and Defendant and be granted a Decree of Divorce, a "vinculo matrimonii" dissolving the bonds of the said marriage.

MASTER'S REPORT

TO THE HONORABLE JOHN J. PENTZ, PRESIDENT JUDGE:

The undersigned Master, appointed by the Court to take the testimony and report the same with form of Decree, respectfully reports as follows:

SCHEDULE

1. The Complaint in Divorce: Presented and filed on October 23, 1961.
2. Service of the Complaint: Service of the Complaint was made upon the Defendant by registered mail, return receipt requested, addressee only, at his last known address, Lamar, South Carolina, on March 24, 1962.
3. Appointment of Master: William U. Smith was appointed Master on April 20, 1962. On May 24, 1962, a Petition and Order were signed extending the time for the Master to hold a hearing until June 7, 1962.
4. Date and Place Fixed for Hearing: The hearing in this case was scheduled for May 19, 1962 at 10 A.M., at the office of the Master, 101 North Second Street, Clearfield, Pennsylvania. The Defendant did not appear at that time in person or by counsel, and upon motion of counsel for the Plaintiff, the hearing was continued until May 28, 1962, at 2 P.M.
5. Notice of Master's Hearing: Notice of Master's Hearing was served upon the Defendant by registered mail, return receipt requested, addressee only, at his last known address, Lamar, South Carolina, on April 28, 1962.

6. Master's Hearing: Held at the time and place aforesaid. Pearl Dotts, the Plaintiff, appeared, together with her attorney, John K. Reilly, Jr. The Defendant did not appear in person or by counsel.

CAUSE OF DIVORCE

Desertion.

FINDINGS OF FACT

1. Marriage: The Plaintiff and Defendant were married on June 22, 1922, by Rev. John R. Thomas of the Congregational Church in Ebensburg, Pennsylvania.

2. Residence and Citizenship: The Plaintiff and Defendant are citizens of the United States, and at the time of the hearing the Plaintiff was residing in Irvona, Clearfield County, Pennsylvania, and the Defendant was residing in Lamar, South Carolina. Plaintiff has resided in Pennsylvania for a period in excess of 10 years prior to the date of the hearing.

3. Ages and Occupation: The Plaintiff is 58 years old and a house-keeper. The Defendant is 71 years old and a laborer.

4. Children: No children were born of this marriage.

5. Armed Forces: The Defendant is not a member of any branch of the Armed Forces of the United States of America.

6. Findings on the Merits: The grounds for divorce alleged in the Complaint are desertion. The Master finds as follows:

(a). Commencing on or about August 1, 1938, the Defendant did wilfully and maliciously absent himself from habitation with the Plaintiff without reasonable cause.

(b). The Defendant has persisted in this willful and malicious absence from the common habitation of the parties for a period of almost 24 years.

(c). The divorce proceeding was not the result of collusion between the Plaintiff and Defendant.



### DISCUSSION

The grounds alleged are desertion. The Defendant did not appear by counsel or in person. The Defendant separated himself without any apparent reason or cause from the Plaintiff on August 1, 1938. Thus, there has been a continuous separation for a period approximating 24 years. As a further indication of Defendant's intentions, there was submitted to the Master a certified copy of a second albeit invalid marriage by the Defendant. There is no evidence whatsoever that the Plaintiff is anything but an injured and innocent spouse. There is no evidence that the Defendant has at any time made any effort to provide a home for his wife or otherwise discharge his marital duties.

No clearer case of a willful, malicious and unjustified desertion for a period approximating 24 years could be shown. This constitutes desertion and is grounds for divorce in the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania - Clark vs. Clark, 172 Pa. Superior 5, (1953); Carr vs. Carr, 160 Pa. Superior 124, (1947).

Therefore, the Master finds that the Defendant did willfully and maliciously, and without cause, desert the Plaintiff on or about August 1, 1938. The Master also finds the Defendant has continued this course of conduct for a period in excess of two years, and that the Plaintiff by the record appears to be an innocent and injured spouse.

### CONCLUSIONS OF LAW


1. The Court has jurisdiction of the subject matter and the parties.
2. The Defendant did willfully and maliciously desert and absent himself from the Plaintiff, an innocent and injured spouse, without reasonable cause from August 1, 1938, and continued to absent himself to date - all of which is contrary to Section 10 (1) (d) of the Act of May 2, 1929, P.L. 1237, 23 Purdon's, Section 10 (1) (d).
3. The proceedings conform to the Rules of Court and requirements of law.

4. This divorce proceeding was not the result of collusion between the Plaintiff and Defendant.

RECOMMENDATION

The Master recommends a Decree granting Pearl Dotts a divorce a vincula matrimonii from Henry Dotts, Jr., a/k/a Harry Dotts, Jr., a form of Decree being hereto attached.

Q. Mrs. Dotts, what is your age and occupation?

A. I'm a house keeper and I'm 58 years old.

Q. Mrs. Dotts, what is the age and occupation of your  
husband, Mr. Henry Dotts?

A. 71, he will be 72 in November and I guess he is just  
a laborer, that's all.

Q. Mrs. Dotts, when did you marry Mr. Dotts?

A. June 22nd., 1922.

Q. Where were you married?

A. Ebensburg, Pa.

Q. Who married you?

A. John R. Thomas in the Congregational Church.

Q. Mrs. Dotts following your marriage where did you live?

A. In a little northern country in Cambria County, Penna.

Q. Did you and your husband set up housekeeping there?

A. Yes we did.

Q. How long did you live together?

A. About six years.

Q. Did he leave you at that time?

A. No, he left on and off and finally he left, and I went to my home and he went to his home.

Q. When did you finally separate?

A. In the 1st. of August in 1938.

Q. Was there any reason for this separation?

A. Well, he wanted me to stay on the farm and do business for him, and give him all the money. He didn't want to stay there he only came for the money and that was it.

Q. Mrs. Dotts, are you aware that your husband is married again?

A. Yes I am.

Q. Do you know when he was married again?

A. He was married April 8, 1937.

Q. Do you know who he married?

A. I do, Catherine Smeal.

Q. Mrs. Dotts, how did you find out about your husband's second marriage?

A. Through a friend of mine.

Q. Is this friend a man or woman?

A. A woman.

Q. Then she told you of the second marriage?

A. She did.

Q. Now at the time your husband married again, were you divorced from him?

A. No.

Q. Was he still legally married to you?

A. He was.

Q. Now, have you heard from your husband since he married Catherine Smeal?

A. I saw him several times, I never had direct contact with him, but I have saw him different times in stores.

Q. Did you and your husband have any children Mrs. Dotts?

A. No we didn't.

Q. Was there ever any previous divorce action filed?

A. Yes there was.

Q. Did you file it?

A. Yes I did.

Q. Where was this filed?

A. In Cambria County.

Q. Do you know whether this has been discontinued or not?

A. It has been.

Q. It has been discontinued?

A. Yes.

Q. Are either of you or your husband in the armed forces, Mrs. Dotts?

A. No.

Q. Is there any agreement between you and your husband as to bringing this divorce action?

A. I had applied for the divorce and I had a hard time getting him to sign the papers.

Q. There has been no collusion?

A. No.

Q. Are you and your husband both citizens of Pennsylvania?

A. Yes we are.

Q. How long have you lived in Clearfield County?

A. Since 1933.

Q. Mrs. Dotts, I show you an application for a marriage license issued in Blair County, and I ask you if the signature shown at the top of this marriage license is that of your husband?

A. To the best of my knowledge it is.

BY MR. REILLY:

Mr. Master I would like to admit this application of Marriage License into evidence, and I shall also like to offer into evidence this certificate of marriage issued in Holidaysburg, Blair County, Pennsylvania, for the marriage between Henry Dotts, Jr., and Catherine Smeal.

BY MASTER:

The foregoing documents were admitted as Plaintiff's Exhibit 1, being the application for marriage license bearing No. 42416 and Plaintiff's Exhibit 2 being a certificate of marriage signed by Henry Nichols, Clerk under date of May 13th., 1958, indicating the marriage between Henry Dotts, Jr., and Catherine Smeal.

BY MR. REILLY:

Q. Mrs. Dotts, you married Mr. Dotts under the name of Harry Dotts, is that correct?

A. Yes.

Q. And the marriage license and application issued in Blair County to Henry Dotts and Catherine Smeal. Do you know whether or not your husband used a different name here?

A. The only thing I knew him by was Harry, then when I found out he was married and Henry was his real name..

Q. Mrs. Dotts, I show you a signed and sworn statement from South Carolina and ask if that is your husband's signature?

A. Yes it is

Mr. Master, I would like to introduce this into evidence as a sworn statement signed by the defendant in this action whereby he admits having married without a divorce.

BY MASTER:

The foregoing affidavits signed by Henry Dotts, Jr., notarized May 21st., 1962, was admitted as Plaintiff's Exhibit 3.

Q. Was the previous divorce action commenced in Cambria County discontinued.

A. Yes.

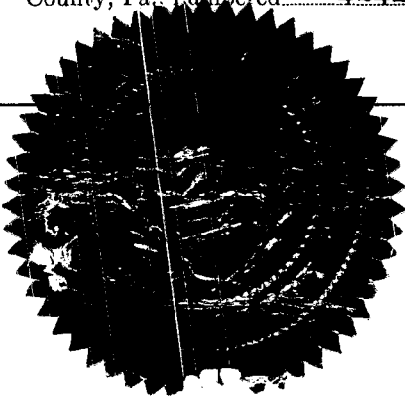
