

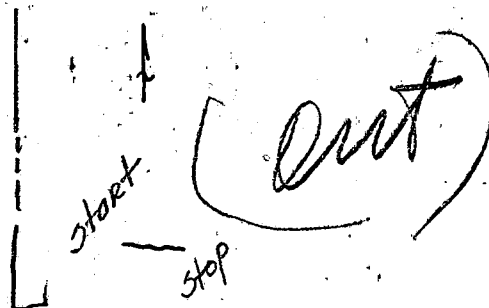

And therefore praying the Court to appoint proper persons to view and lay out the same, according to law. Whereupon, the Court, upon due consideration had of the premises, do order and appoint

S. F. McCloskey, Adam B. Way & J. R. Bloom
who, after being respectively sworn or affirmed to perform the duties of their appointment with impartiality and fidelity, are to view the ground proposed for said road; and if any two of them agree that there is occasion for such road, they shall proceed to lay out the same, as agreeably to the desire of the petitioners as may be, having respect for the best ground for a road, and the shortest distance, in such manner as to do the least injury to private property; and shall make report thereof, stating particularly whether they judge the same necessary for a public or private road, together with a plot or draft thereof, and the courses and distances, with reference to the improvements through which it may pass, to the next Court of Quarter Sessions to be held for said county. In which report they shall state that they have been sworn or affirmed according to law.

ROAD VIEWER'S REPORT.

CLEARFIELD COUNTY SS:

At a Court of Quarter Sessions of the Peace of the County of Clearfield, held at Clearfield, in and for said county, on the 21 day of March, A. D. 1871, before the Judges of the said Court, upon the petition of sundry inhabitants of the township of Pike in the said county setting forth that they labor under great inconvenience

We the undersigned persons, appointed by the within Order of Court, to view, and lay out the road therein mentioned, respectfully report: That having first given notice of the time and place of the view of said Road, and having all been present, at the view of the ground proposed for such road; and having all been first duly sworn or affirmed in pursuance of said Order; we have viewed, and laid out; and do return the following road: Beginning at a fallen Chestnut corner of David Way, and Joseph Milligan, near David Way's House, thence on the line between them: South Eighty seven and a half degrees East Forty perches thence through Land of Milligan South Eighty three degrees East, Nine perches. South Seventy two degrees East Seventeen perches. North seventy five degrees East: Eleven and six tenths perches. South Eighty and one half degrees East: Seventeen perches, to a corner of David and Job Way's Land. Thence between them South Eighty seven and a half degrees East: Eighteen and six tenths perches, to the Public Road, at the North West corner of Thomas Bloom's Land. A Draft whereof is herewith Annexed. Which said Road we are of opinion is necessary for a Public road.

As to Damages, we could not see any - and therefore return no damage.
