The petition of the undersigned citizens of
Chest Township, respectfully represents:

That at May Sessions A.D. 1848
of your Honorable Court, the report of view-
ers was confirmed, authorizing the laying
of a Public road leading from a point
on the New Washington Cherry Tree road,
to a point on public road near the
residence of James Rorabough in said
township, that a portion of said road
viz. that part of said road East of
Chesteret has not been laid out
or used as a public road, excepting, per-
haps a small portion of it, that said
road ^{East of Chesteret} has not and is not now required
for the use or benefit of the neighborhood
or traveller, and ~~therefore~~ are two roads
existing from public road where the said
road laid out starts, running parallel
with the road laid, to Chest Creek, one
above about 25 or 30 rods, and one below
perhaps 50 rods distant, and a
new road has been recently laid
out along said Creek connecting
said roads.

Your petition, being said road
laid out is not necessary, and under no great claim-
age to private property, pray the Court to ap-
point viewers to view the ground and

vacate or annul the part of said
road laid out East of Chest Creek
and running to the said Rorabough
premises.
