## ROAD VIEWER'S REPORT.

### CLEARFIELD COUNTY SS:

At a Court of Quarter Sessions of the Peace of the County of Clearfield, held at Clearfield, in and for said county, on the 6 day of June, A. D. 1871, before the Judges of the said Court, upon the petition of sundry inhabitants of the township of Bloom, in the said county, setting forth that they labor under great inconvenience for the want of a road or highway, leading from Bloom's Hotel property to the turnpike at or near Mr. Andersons and that said was laid out in (about) 1862 and not opened — that the present location is swampy &c and would be burthensome to the people

And therefore praying the Court to appoint proper persons to view <sup>vacate and supply</sup> ~~and lay out~~ the same, according to law. Whereupon, the Court, upon due consideration had of the premises, do order and appoint S. F. McCloskey, Ben. Hartshorn & Geo. Bloom who, after being respectively sworn or affirmed to perform the duties of their appointment with impartiality and fidelity, are, to view the ground proposed for said road; and if any two of them agree that there is <sup>vacation supply</sup> ~~occasion~~ for such road, they shall proceed to <sup>vacate supply the</sup> ~~lay out~~ the same, as agreeably to the desire of the petitioners as may be, having respect for the best ground for a road, and the shortest distance, in such manner as to do the least injury to private property; and shall make report thereof, stating particularly whether they judge the same necessary for a public or private road, together with a plot or draft thereof, and the courses and distances, with reference to the improvements through which it may pass, to the next Court of Quarter Sessions to be held for said county. In which report they shall state that they have been sworn or affirmed according to law.

We the undersigned persons appointed by the within Order of Court, to view, and lay out the road therein mentioned, respectfully report; That having given notice of the time and place of the view of said road, according to the Act of Assembly, and being all present at the time of the view, and having all been first severally sworn or affirmed in pursuance of the said Order - We have viewed the ground proposed for the said road, and find that such road would be expensive, and Burthen some to the Township, the ground being low and swampy. And further we are of Opinion that such road is not necessary, either for a public or private road.

The petition of the un-  
designed citizens of Bloom township  
respectfully represents;

That on the  
17<sup>th</sup> day of March A. D. 1862 your Honorable  
Court absolutely confirmed the report of  
of a view of a public road leading  
from a point on Glen Hope and Ches-  
quehanna Turnpike near Henry Lytle's  
farm to the Andersons Creek Road  
in said township, about 2 miles  
and 144 perches in length; said  
view and report being in favor of  
a public road as aforesaid, that  
the part of said road from the ter-  
minus to Mr Andersons Creek to Bloom's  
Hotel was opened in 1863, and has since  
been opened and used as a public  
road, being about one half of the length  
of said road; that no order was ever  
issued for the opening of said road  
and that the part of said road re-  
maining unopened is not necessary  
for the accommodation of the travelling com-  
munity, that it is located upon ground

totally unfit for a road, as it is swampy  
and that it would be unreasonably ex-  
pensive to make and keep in re-  
pair.

Your petitioners therefore pray the  
Court to grant appoint viewers to  
view and examine the part of said  
road remaining unopened, to the  
end that the same may be vaca-  
ted, and if necessary, another road  
located between said points.
