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Road Viewers' Report.

CLEARFIELD COUNTY, SS:

At a Court of Quarter Sessions of the Peace of the County of Clearfield, held at Clearfield, in and for said county, on the 14 day of June, A. D. 1872, before the Judges of the said Court, upon the petition of sundry inhabitants of the township of Bradford, in said county, setting forth that they labor under great inconvenience for the want of a ^{private} road or highway, leading from

James Harris dwelling
House to intersect the road leading from
'Shilo School house' to Gains ford at or
near the nearest point
"Report as to damages &c"

And therefore praying the Court to appoint proper persons to view and lay out the same, according to law. Whereupon, the Court, upon due consideration had of the premises, do order and appoint

John L. Cuttle, Mr Hoover and Elijah McDowell

who, after being respectively sworn or affirmed to perform the duties of their appointment with impartiality and fidelity, are to view the ground proposed for said road; and if any two of them agree that there is occasion for such road, they shall proceed to lay out the same, as agreeably to the desire of the petitioners as may be, having respect for the best ground for a road, and the shortest distance, in such manner as to do the least injury to private property; and shall make

report thereof, stating particularly whether they judge the same necessary for a public or private road, together with a plot or draft thereof, and the courses and distances, with reference to the improvements through which it may pass, to the next Court of Quarter Sessions to be held for said county. In which report they shall state that they have been sworn or affirmed according to law.

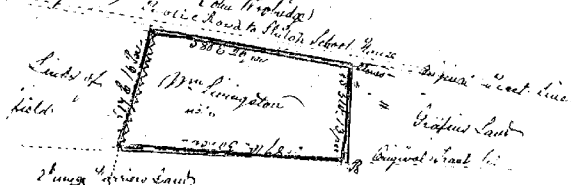

To the Honorable the Judges of the Court of Quarter Sessions of the Peace of the County of Clearfield, now holding a Court of General Sessions at September Term A.D. 1872.

The undersigned viewers appointed by your Honorable Court by the Order hereto annexed. Respectfully Report. That after giving timely and legal notice of the time and place of meeting by advertisements put up in public places, and personal notice to William Livingston through whose land the said road is laid out, for more than five days before the view, and being first duly sworn or affirmed according to law, proceeded to view the ground proposed for said road, and judging the same to be necessary laid out and now return for private use the following Road. Beginning at the west line of lands of James Harris & William Livingston thence on west side of a fence through cleared land North seventeen degrees East. Eighteen perches to the Public Road leading from Shilo School House to Gains' ford, a plot or draft of which is hereto annexed. And we as aforesaid toll no damages to be paid by James Harris to William Livingston.)
