# Road Viewers' Report.

CLEARFIELD COUNTY, SS:

At a Court of Quarter Sessions of the Peace of the County of Clearfield, held at Clearfield, in and for said county, on the fourteenth day of June, A. D. 1872, before the Judges of the said Court, upon the petition of sundry inhabitants of the township of Chest, in said county, setting forth that they labor under great inconvenience for the want of a road or highway, leading from at or near the Chest Creek Bridge at Westover to intersect the public road leading from Glen Connel to Newburg at or near the old Peoples place


And therefore praying the Court to appoint proper persons to view and lay out the same, according to law. Whereupon, the Court, upon due consideration had of the premises, do order and appoint

Lewis Boice, Wm Owens, & a Daniel Fry

who, after being respectively sworn or affirmed to perform the duties of their appointment with impartiality and fidelity, are to view the ground proposed for said road; and if any two of them agree that there is occasion for such road, they shall proceed to lay out the same, as agreeably to the desire of the petitioners as may be, having respect for the best ground for a road, and the shortest distance, in such manner as to do the least injury to private property; and shall make report thereof, stating particularly whether they judge the same necessary for a public or private road, together with a plot or draft thereof, and the courses and distances, with reference to the improvements through which it may pass, to the next Court of Quarter Sessions to be held for said county. In which report they shall state that they have been sworn or affirmed according to law.

We the persons appointed by annexed

that in pursuance thereof after giving  
due and public notice according to law  
having been duly sworn and affirmed  
all the viewers appointed by said order  
having viewed the ground proposed for  
the within mentioned road and the  
undesignated views do agree there is  
occasion for a road as desired by the  
petitioners and that the same is necessary  
for a public road and having had  
respect to the shortest distance and  
best ground for such road we have  
laid it out in such a manner as should  
do the least injury to private property  
and as far as practicable agreeably to the  
desires of the petitioners and do return for  
public use the following described road  
commencing opposite corner of premises  
shop in public road three through the  
arable lands of Isaac Kim North thirty  
two perches three North twelve Degrees west  
thirty six perches three North six degrees  
west thirteen perches three North four  
Degrees East sixteen perches three  
three North Eleven Degrees west twenty  
eight perches three North twenty Degrees  
west ten perches three North twenty four  
and a half Degrees west Eleven perches  
three North thirty seven and three quarters  
Degrees west sixteen perches three North  
forty one and a half Degrees west ten  
perches three North fifty one and a half  
Degrees west eighteen perches three  
through the arable lands of Samuel  
Byers North North Sixty Degrees west  
seven perches three North Sixty eight  
and a half Degrees west fourteen perches  
three North seventy five Degrees west  
twelve perches three North Twenty Eight
