Road Viewers' Report.

CLEARFIELD COUNTY, SS:

At a Court of Quarter Sessions of the Peace of the County of Clearfield, held at Clearfield, in and for said county, on the 23^d day of September, A. D. 1872, before the Judges of the said Court, upon the petition of sundry inhabitants of the township of Brady, in said county, setting forth that ~~they labor under great inconvenience for the want of a road or highway, leading from~~ the public road already opened beginning at Geo. W. Horns Saw-mill and thence to Philip Swoops land is useless and inconvenient by reason of the grade being being too heavy—
"Report as to damages &c"

And therefore praying the Court to appoint proper persons to view ^{vacate & supply} ~~and lay out~~ the same, according to law. Whereupon, the Court, upon due consideration had of the premises, do order and appoint Geo. C. Kirk, R. H. Moore and S. B. Carlisle

who, after being respectively sworn or affirmed to perform the duties of their appointment with impartiality and fidelity, are to view the ground proposed for said road; and if any two of them agree that there is occasion for such road, they shall proceed to lay out the same, as agreeably to the desire of the petitioners as may be, having respect for the best ground for a road, and the shortest distance, in such manner as to do the least injury to private property; and shall make report thereof, stating particularly whether they judge the same necessary for a public or private road, together with a plot or draft thereof, and the courses and distances, with reference to the improvements through which it may pass, to the next Court of Quarter Sessions to be held for said county. In which report they shall state that they have been sworn or affirmed according to law.

To the Honorable, The Judges within named.
We the undersigned, appointed by the annexed order do report: That in pursuance thereof, after having been severally duly sworn according to law, all the viewers appointed by said order being present, viewed the grounds proposed for the within mentioned roads, and we do agree that there is occasion for a road as desired by the petitioners, and that the same is necessary for a public road. And having made respect to the shortest distance and the best grounds for such road, we have laid out in such manner as shall do the least injury to private property, and as far as practicable agreeably to the desire of the petitioners, and do return for public use the following described roads, to wit:

Beginning, at a Hemlock stump, in public road at Geo. W. Harris saw mill, Thence North 8 $\frac{1}{2}$ ° East, Twenty four perches to a Post; Thence North 21° East, Sixteen and Twentieth perches to a Post; Thence North 42° East, Eight and eighteenth perches to a Post; in line of land of Philip Sworpe; Thence North 30° West, by land of said Philip Sworpe, Twenty four perches to a stone in public road.

We further report, that we have made careful inquiry as to any damages that might arise from the opening of said road, and find that there are no damages claimed by any one, through whose lands the road passes.

We also report that we have inquired and do vacate the following described public road, to wit: Beginning at a stone, in public road above mentioned, Thence South 16 $\frac{1}{2}$ ° East, Nineteen and threethird perches to Post; Thence South 10° West, Thirty six perches to a Post; Thence South 9° East, Twelve perches to a Hemlock stump, mentioned as the beginning of the above described roads.

We further report, that before the said view, public notice of the time and place of the meeting of said viewers was given by advertisements put up at three of the most public places in the vicinity - ten days before said meeting, and we annex a plot or draft of said road laid out, stating the courses and distances, and noticing briefly the improvements through which the same passes, and also a description and draft of the road vacated.
