Road Viewers' Report.

CLEARFIELD COUNTY, SS:

At a Court of Quarter Sessions of the Peace of the County of Clearfield, held at Clearfield, in and for said county, on the 20th day of March, A. D. 1872, before the Judges of the said Court, upon the petition of sundry inhabitants of the township of Goshen & Bradford, in said county, setting forth that they labor under great inconvenience for the want of a road or highway, leading from a point on the public Road at or near Joseph Winnery's in Bradford Township to the public Road leading from Clearfield to Karthause at or near Mr Wood's in Goshen Township "Report as to damages &c"

And therefore praying the Court to appoint proper persons to view and lay out the same, according to law. Whereupon, the Court, upon due consideration had of the premises, do order and appoint

John D. Cuthbert, James Neitchell, Robt. Stewart and John Livingston who, after being respectively sworn or affirmed to perform the duties of their appointment with impartiality and fidelity, are to view the ground proposed for said road; and if any two of them agree that there is occasion for such road, they shall proceed to lay out the same, as agreeably to the desire of the petitioners as may be, having respect for the best ground for a road, and the shortest distance, in such manner as to do the least injury to private property; and shall make report thereof, stating particularly whether they judge the same necessary for a public or private road, together with a plot or draft thereof, and the courses and distances, with reference to the improvements through which it may pass, to the next Court of Quarter Sessions to be held for said county. In which report they shall state that they have been sworn or affirmed according to law.

Kilars land N 31° E between Woods & Kilars 45 per, then through Kilars land S 65° E 9 per, S 21° W. 12 per
S 13° E 19, S 6° W. 25, S 5° E 12 per, S 35° E 72 per to river bank, S 45° E across river 32 per, S 31° E
8 per, S 40° E 8 per, S 61° E 14 per to old W. H. cor, S 30° E 13 per, S 40° E 11 per, S 62° E 13 per, S 58° E 22
S 31° E 59 S 61° E 102 to Township road near John Smith's Farm and by said road to road near
