and place of the meeting of the viewers, by advertisements, duly posted in public places, for more
than five days previous to making the view. That Samuel Lambert Wilson Hoover & John L. Brittle
^{viewers} met at Widow Crop's house, and after being first duly sworn according to law, proceeded to view
the ground proposed for said road, and have viewed and laid out, and now return for Public
use the following road. Beginning at the Erie Turnpike, thence N 25° E on line of lands of David &
Mrs Crop - 109 per to tract corner. thence South 89° East, on tract line, between lands of Wolstoncroft & Callahan,
13 per to tract corner, thence North 25° E between lands of Wolstoncroft and Pickle, and on old tract line, fifty
six perches to corner of field, thence north 31° west 12 per, N 23° W 6 per, N 13° W 9 per to W. H. opposite
Pickle's lane, N 13° W 64 per to Jesse & Son's fence, thence through Stone's fields N 36° W 20 perches, &
N 38° W 42 perches - thence N 36° W 18 per, N 21° W 14 perches, N 40° W 20 per, N 43° W 14 perches
